



The true meaning of Easter is unconditional love. Jesus's resurrection from the dead reassures us that He will never leave us and He will love us through everything -- through our sins, our triumphs, our failures and our great days. God sacrificed Himself for us and invited us home to be with Him in heaven—even though we constantly sin.

Prior to Easter, Catholics observe 40 days of prayer and fasting. This is a time of repentance that culminates in the Holy Week. Fasting involves reducing one's food intake, while abstinence involves refraining from certain food like meat. One of the teachings of the Catholic Church is to perform an act of penance for our sins; and fasting is a very meaningful way to do this. It encourages self-discipline as well as repentance and following Christ's example for a deeper spiritual focus.

The Sacrament of Holy Communion connects us to Christ and to our fellow Christians and the Church requires us to receive it at least once each year, in the time between Palm Sunday and Trinity Sunday, which is the Sunday after Pentecost. Easter is fundamental to Christian faith and receiving the Holy Eucharist during this season demonstrates that faith. Catholics are also urged to participate in confession before receiving the Holy Eucharist.

The Easter vigil during the night before is the most significant part of the Catholic tradition. The lengthy services include readings, music, a procession, and performing Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion) for new converts and Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults during Mass. This represents the continuing of our faith and the fulfillment of God's promise to humanity.

There are so many different personal traditions that Catholic families follow during Easter. Easter feast includes lamb, cakes, breads, eggs, all symbolizing the resurrection through either shape, form or the act of rising (yeast). Since it marks the end of Lent, many Easter recipes use extra eggs, meat or rich food forbidden during the fasting period. Families offer sweets and candy traditionally to break the long fast.

The season of Easter begins after Easter Sunday and lasts for seven weeks, ending with Pentecost.

Go and Make Disciples!



Here I am, Lord

You probably have heard by now that the theme for this year's State Convention is *Here I am, Lord.* It is a sentence that resonates with me and perhaps with you also. You have heard it read in Mass dozens of times, but I want to give you maybe a different look at the sentence, a different way to reflect on this theme.

Six men in the Bible speak these words. Each time we read about them, we think they are responding by saying "here I am", kind of like indicating their location. Here, right here, over here. But what if they are saying something totally different.

There are over 300 times in the Bible when God refers to himself as "I AM". God, when questioned by Moses, give his full name. "I AM Who I AM". When Moses continues by asking what shall he say if someone asks, God responds by telling Moses: "Say to the people of Israel, I AM has sent me to you. One of the names we call God is "The Great I AM.

So, what if these men in the Bible are not responding by giving their location, but actually responding with the word, **Here**, like one responding to a roll call. Roll call of prophets: Abraham – Here!, Jacob – Here!, Moses – Here! These great men, called, and reporting for duty. We know they responded because of the great works recorded in the Bible after they answered that call. Here, **I AM.**

So how would we respond if we were listening to a *roll call*? Would we answer the call? Would we respond "here", or would our silence echo through the ages? If God were calling on you today, would you answer - Here, I AM. God has called us many times over our lifetimes and when he does he calls us for a specific task. If you think back to the Middle Ages, people did not generally have a last name. You had your first name and then you had your trade name as your last name. In English, that would have been Smith (for Blacksmith) or Baker or Shoemaker. In German, that would have been Schmidt, or Backer, or Schumacher. I think you get my point. When God calls, try to remember—He calls you to a specific task, a specific roll. Fred, the husband and father. As if to say, Here, I AM. As Knights of Columbus, I hope we are answering the call that way also. Fred, the defender of the unborn. Will we answer, "Here, I AM"? Fred, the protector of the widow and of the orphan. Here! Fred, caretaker of our neighbor. Here! Fred, sharer of the Faith. Here!

Now, we are all not going to be called to the same tasks. God has given all of us different strengths and different talents, but we are all going to be called. We need to be ready and able to respond to that roll call—Here, **I AM.**

It's not always going to be easy, in fact it's almost never going to be easy. You will be stretched and you will be tested. Last year, at the convention, your current State Council were each asked to run for state offices they had never held nor sought, to lead Oregon down a new path. It wasn't easy. We were tested, and we were stretched, but we answered the call. Now we are close to a new Fraternal Year. Elections are going to be taking place in Councils and Assemblies held throughout the state. Many of you will be asked to step up to a different challenge. Many of you will think of excuses. Moses had a few also. But in the end, he answered — HERE! Will you?

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

When the hour came, he took his place at table with the apostles. He said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer, for, I tell you, I shall not eat it [again] until there is fulfillment in the kingdom of God." (Gospel for April 10, Lk 22:14-16)

Every Palm Sunday, we hear the account of Christ's Passion. The story is quite familiar to us by now. Has it lost any of its impact for us from repetition? The Passion of Christ is not just a rote story we recall once a year, but a reality that lies at the heart of our Catholic faith. My Brothers, may we never let the thought and recollection of the Passion of Christ fail to move our hearts to greater love for him.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to participate in the Stations of the Cross — alone or with your parish — to enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ's suffering and death. Second, I challenge you to carry out the Faith in Action Good Friday Family Promotion program.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you sometimes "glaze over" or lose focus when listening to the readings at Mass? What can you do to better prepare for Mass so that you reap more fully the spiritual benefits of hearing the word of God? What devotions — such as the Stations of the Cross or the rosary — can you take up to engage more deeply with the stories and events of our faith?





The work that is being done at the Knights of Columbus Mercy Center at the Ukrainian border in Hrebenne, Poland, is exactly what Blessed Michael McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus to do. He asked his brother Knights to serve the widow and the orphan, and at the border, women have to leave their husbands behind. Children enter Poland as refugees with only one parent, if any, accompanying them. Men between the ages of 18 and 60 cannot cross as they may be called to fight by the Ukrainian government, unless they have a large family.

I have been privileged to be on site, ministering to refugees, offering Mass and distributing food and some other necessities, together with Knights and others from partner organizations.

I invite you to watch this video (Welcoming Ukrainian Refugees - YouTube), filmed in Hrebenne, along with the other videos and articles below, to learn more about the work that Knights are doing Orderwide to serve those affected by the war.

During the Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on March 25, Pope Francis prayed: "May your maternal touch sooth those who suffer and flee from the rain of bombs. May your motherly embrace comfort those forced to leave their homes and their native land. May your Sorrowful Heart move us to compassion and inspire us to open our doors and to care for our brothers and sisters who are injured and cast aside."

As Knights of Columbus, we providentially have Councils in both Poland and Ukraine, where Brother Knights are delivering, receiving and distributing life-saving aid to those most in need. The Gospel and the charism of Blessed Michael McGivney are being lived out in the most tangible way today in Ukraine and Poland. Let us continue to support our brothers and sisters in this effort through prayers and humanitarian assistance during these final weeks of Lent and into the Easter season.

However, the State shall pay round trip mileage at \$0.23/mile plus \$25/day of per diem to the delegates, DDs, and other State personnel who are entitled to such. With this in mind, be sure to prepare for this.

I have greatly enjoyed working with everyone so far this year and have enjoyed visiting different Councils. I look forward to doing more and helping out as much as I possibly can. I also look forward to seeing everyone at an exciting Convention!




For the consecration of Russia and Ukraine to your Immaculate Heart

Degree Location: St. James Parish Hall, located at 258 West 12th St., Vancouver, WA. 98660 (Downtown).

Directions: I-5 Southbound: From I-5 southbound, take the Mill Plain Blvd. exit to westbound Mill Plain Blvd., right hand lane. The street will curve to the right, you will then be on 15th St. Use the middle lane, turn left at the 5th light to Columbia St., cross Mill Plain and then proceed to the next light on 13th St. and turn right; the Church parking will be the first driveway to your left. You will see the Parish Hall to your left, located on the SE corner of 13th and Columbia streets. Follow the signs to the candidate check in desk in the lower hall.

<u>I-5 Northbound:</u> From I-5 northbound, take the Mill Plain Blvd. / McLoughlin Blvd. exit; Use the right lane, then turn left at the signal to westbound Mill Plain Blvd. The street will curve to the right and you will be on 15th St. Use the middle lane, turn left at the 5th light to Columbia St., cross Mill Plain and then proceed to the next light on 13th St. and turn right on 13th St. The Church parking will be the first driveway to your left. You will see the Parish Hall to your left located on the SE corner of 13th and Columbia streets. Follow the signs to the Candidate check in desk.

Lunch: Lunch will be served by the St. James Assembly from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm. 

IRS Form 990 Filing Is A Must For All Councils

This notice is to remind Councils, Assemblies, and Chapters in the United States of their legal obligation to file an IRS Form 990 (informational tax return) for the 2021 tax year, and to provide detailed instructions on how to comply with this obligation.

The Knights of Columbus, including all subordinate Councils, Assemblies, and Chapters (collectively referred to as Councils), is a tax-exempt organization, recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a fraternal benefit society under Section 501(c)(8) of the Internal Revenue Code. This tax-exempt status requires each Council to file an annual Form 990 with the IRS.

Councils reporting gross receipts of \$50,000 or less with less than \$200,000 in assets may comply with their obligation by filing the Form 990-N electronic postcard (also known as the e-Postcard). Councils reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000 with total assets of less than \$500,000 must file the Form 990-EZ. Councils with gross receipts of \$200,000 or more and total assets exceeding \$500,000, must file the Form 990.

What's New

The IRS now requires electronic filing for **all** tax-exempt organizations, regardless of which form they use. In order to utilize the online filing system, **all new users** must complete a registration; instructions are available on the IRS website, links to which are in the *Where to File* section, below.

Deadline to file annual return (all forms)

Each Council must file its own tax return; there is no group or consolidated Form 990 filing. The returns must be filed by the fifteenth day of the fifth month following the end of the Council's annual accounting period. For example, if a Council's accounting period ends December 31, it must file a tax return by May 15 of the following year; if a Council's accounting period ends June 30, it must file a tax return by November 15. Please note that the IRS assigns the accounting period to each Council based on its Employer Identification Number (EIN). The IRS will not notify the Council of the accounting period. To determine the accounting period assigned to your Council's EIN, sign into the IRS system with your user ID and password. For most Councils, the assigned accounting period corresponds to the calendar year.

Need more time to file a Form 990?

Although the IRS does not grant extensions for filing the Form 990-N (e-Postcard), the IRS will accept late filings if the tax return is received within three years of the due date. While the IRS will accept late filings of Form 990-N (e-Postcard), please note that filing late, even within a three-year period, is still considered a missed filing by the IRS and may trigger a revocation of its tax-exempt status. The IRS does grant extensions to organizations filing Forms 990-EZ and 990. If a Council needs more time to file the Form 990-EZ or 990, it must request an extension by the due date of the return for which it is requesting an extension. Federal law imposes a penalty for late or incomplete filings. If an organization fails to file a required return by the due date (including any extension of time), it must pay a penalty of \$20 a day for each day the return is late. In general, the maximum penalty for any late return is the lesser of \$10,500 or five percent of the organization's gross receipts for the year. In order to request an extension, Councils must submit Form 8868, which is available on the IRS website: http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8868.pdf. For Councils reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000, we recommend using a qualified tax professional to file Form 8868.

Where to file—Form 990-N (e-Postcard). The Form 990-N (e-Postcard) must be filed online. The User Guide for the IRS Form 990-N Electronic Filing System is available here: USER GUIDE Form 990-N (e-Postcard) The Form 990 e-Postcard Electronic Filing System is available here: CLICK HERE TO FILE Form 990-N (e-Postcard) If you use the above link to file the Form 990N (e-Postcard) there is no filing fee, as it connects directly to IRS.gov.

Forms 990-EZ and 990. Forms 990-EZ and 990 must be filed online. The IRS website provides instructions for electronic filing of Forms 990-EZ and 990: https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/current-form-990-series-forms-and-instructions

Any Council reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 is strongly urged to consider using a qualified tax professional to prepare and file its tax return.

PRACTICE TIP: at the top of the Form 990-EZ and Form 990, enter the Knights of Columbus group number (0188), tax exempt status (Section 501(c)(8)), and form of organization (Association). You may find e-filing instructions here: https://www.irs.gov/e-file-providers/e-file-for-chariti es-and-non-profits

If the IRS website will not allow you to file a Form 990-N

The electronic filing system for the Form 990-N (e-Postcard) may reject a Council's return if: (1) the Council's EIN has been revoked for failing to file for three consecutive years; (2) the Council's EIN has recently been reinstated; (3) it is a new Council; or (4) the Council is not on the Supreme Council's Group Exemption List (updated continually by the Knights of Columbus Legal Department).

All services and supports inspire self-confidence, independence, and hope in the future. Nationally accredited by the Council of Accreditation and operated by Catholic Community Services, St. Brigid Home provides young women, ages 12 to 20, a safe and nurturing environment from which to build their futures. The family-like, peaceful, welcoming environment helps young women rise above life's challenges.

After their time at St. Brigid, the young moms also have the opportunity to move to Father Taaffe Homes St. Monica Apartments when space is available, or they are supported in transitioning to other housing by CCS community health workers. Through both residential and community-based services, expecting and young, single mothers gain knowledge and skills from prenatal care, to parenting, to running a household and creating healthy

Those who come to live in the Father Taaffe Home are provided with basic amenities, including food, laundry facilities, access to local transportation, and computers to help with schoolwork and job searching.

social connections for themselves and their babies.

Who provides care?

Each young, expecting mother is responsible for providing full-time care for her child, including arranging child care while attending school or working. House parents are available 24-hours a day to comfort, guide, and share both special moments and difficult times. They help to build self-worth, confidence, good judgement, and trust, and help young moms learn how to make good choices for themselves and their bables.

To live at a Father Taaffe home, an expecting young mom must attend school or be employed, follow curfews, do her own laundry, and help with household chores. No finances are required, but a portion of a teen's monthly support may be requested to help offset her living expenses.

All young mothers are asked to create a set of goals for a 1-year or 5-year plan.

How can you help?

Volunteers are welcome and appreciated. Most often, volunteers assist with maintenance, repairs, landscaping, driving, or respite care. To discuss volunteer opportunities, call (503) 393-2843.



<u>Memorial Chalice for Leroy Harrison Lansing 1888 – 1966</u> <u>Returned To Oregon</u>





Leroy Harrison Lansing was born on June 24, 1888 in Lincoln, NE to William and Mary Weyant Lansing.

Leroy married Helena Reeder on September 29, 1910 in Council Bluffs, IA. The couple moved to Denver, CO in 1920 with their three children.

The couple divorced that same year only to remarry on August 22, 1920 in Golden, CO. The couple had three more children.

Leroy and his family moved to Los Angeles, CA about 1940. Leroy worked for the railroad his whole life until he and his family

moved to Oregon in 1953 where he became a prominent Foster Road businessman and vice president of Lansing Linoleum Co.

Leroy was a member of the Assembly 899 Archbishop Seghers Knights of Columbus Assembly in Portland, OR.

Leroy H. Lansing died on February 6, 1966 in Portland, OR and is buried in Gethsemani Catholic Cemetery in Happy Valley, OR. Mary died in 1978 and is buried next to Leroy. All six of their children have passed on.

This Chalice that memorialized Sir Knight Lancing somehow ended up at Assembly 1174 in Richland, WA and was returned to Oregon in February 2022.

Supreme Court Dobbs Case - *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* is a challenge to a Mississippi law banning abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy. For almost 50 years the 1973 ruling *Roe v. Wade* has been used to justify unlimited abortion in the United States. Now the Court will rule whether pre-viability limits on abortion are constitutional. We are also hoping this is an opportunity for *Roe v. Wade* to be over-ruled.

Oregon Takes the Lead in Death Once Again

In March the state of Oregon expanded its assisted suicide program by removing state residency requirements. This means that individuals from other states, even states where assisted suicide is not legal, are free to obtain lethal prescriptions from Oregon physicians without setting foot in Oregon.

But that is not all. The Oregon Legislature approved \$15,000,000 to be used to pay women from other states travel, lodging and abortion access. That means we now will be paying people to come to Oregon for abortions.

And in Portland there are now appearing billboards with the message "Stop Having Kids". The organization behind these signs claims to believe that all humans should stop having kids, stating on their website "there is an unconscionable amount of needless suffering and death in the world. Birth serves as the catalyst for it all."

All this highlights the importance of the Knights of Columbus effort to promote the sanctity of life as we vigorously defend the dignity of each human being at every stage of life. With Life Program categories including Marches for Life, Special Olympics, Ultrasound Program, Christian Refugee Relief, Silver Rose, Mass for People with Special Needs, Pregnancy Center Support and Novena for Life, we have tools to protect and enhance life. It is more necessary than ever for us to demonstrate our faith publicly, being a beacon of light in this darkness-covered land.




It's been a wonderful year for our Youth Activities Programs.

Lewis Joseph Kramer 36th State Deputy of Oregon 1977-1979



Lewis Joseph Kramer was born on April 9, 1923 in Maupin, OR to Heinrich and Gertrude Grossman Kramer.

He completed his education in Oregon.

Lewis enlisted in the Army in March 1943. Later he became SGT in the Army during WWII.

Lewis married Bertha Gould and the couple had two children.

Lewis was a member of the bricklayers union. He received the guildsman Award for outstanding masonry.

In 1959 Lewis joined the Gresham Council, 3179. He was Grand Knight of the Council for two years. Later he transferred to the Milwaukie Council 3378.

Lewis was also District Deputy, State Membership Chairman, State General Program Chairman, Ceremonial Chairman and New Council Development Chairman.

He was a member of the Archbishop Seghers Assembly.

Lewis was elected State Deputy in 1977 at the State Convention held in Portland, OR, but never held any other State Office.

He won a trip to Rome in 1979 for membership in his division.

In 1980 Lewis became Grand Knight of the Milwaukie Council.

Lewis J. Kramer died on June 5, 2005 in Portland, OR and is buried at the Willamette National Cemetery in Portland, OR.

Berta died June 26, 2010 and is buried next to Lewis.

Reflections from Abbot Jeremy Driscoll, O.S.B., on the Divine Office

You can understand the Divine Office as a work done for God ... it's also a work that God does in the monks, and it's a work he does in the world through the monks.

Vigils

Getting up in the morning is, for the Christian – and the monks live this in an intense way – a rising from the dead and having on our lips the praise of God.

Lauds

The mood of [lauds] is a praise of God as the sun is rising, and the psalms, the canticle, and especially the Gospel canticle we sing marks that.

Holy Eucharist

When we receive his Body and Blood, we enter into that hour of his dying and rising, and then we share in the power of his dying and rising.

Noon Prayer

Maybe we really need help to get through the day. Maybe we've fallen into temptation or sin or a rough spot with one of the brothers. All that is meant to be quickly remedied by the presence of God. We can still sing his praises and ask for his help for the rest of the day.

Vespers

It is an extended praise for what this day has been, the sense of working with God and his creation, working with other people, and now we want to finish that workday ... doing what we'd really want to do all day long, and that is to praise him.

Compline

We ask that in this night of danger, we be protected, that in the night of this world, we be protected ... trusting that God will raise us in the morning.
