I have some great news with this year's Coats for Kids & Ultrasound Initiative.

This year we <u>doubled the amount of Coats for Kids purchases from last year</u>. There was a larger number of Councils taking advantage of the 2/1 offer from Supreme.

I would like to thank our General Program Director Duane Morris, State Youth Director George Murphy and State Community Director Nick Guenther for spearheading this effort. I told Duane I wanted to reach 200 boxes and these men helped surpass that goal and helped bring in 222 boxes. Great job and thanks for your hard work in promoting and setting up the distribution areas for the coats to be picked up.

Next bit of great new is that we now have four new Ultrasound Machines in the State of Oregon that are "SAVING LIVES AND CHANGING LIVES". I would like to thank Eugene Council 1430 for replacing an ultrasound at the 1st Way Pregnancy Resource Center. We also have Hood River Council 7292 who placed an ultrasound at the Hope Family Center in Hood River. Then there is the Dalles Council 1598 who placed a ultrasound at the Hope Family Center in The Dalles. Our last Council was Sherwood Council 9137 who placed an ultrasound at the Pregnancy Counseling and Information Center in Lafayette.

Right now, the Lake Oswego Council 3818 is raising funds to place an ultrasound at the Holy Family Clinic in West Linn.

The PSD's, as the State's Good of the Order Committee, recently met with the State Deputy to share their findings and offer assistance with increasing the field of candidates willing to serve as a State Officer. The State Deputy asked the Good of the Order Committee to share their findings with the State Membership and encourage qualified members to run for an office at the next State Convention.

- Following that request, we have outlined some of the basic skills needed for each position:
- State Deputy -- should have Leadership, Teambuilding, Motivational and Communication skills;
- <u>State Secretary</u> -- should be familiar with using a Computer (especially Quick Books Program), Record Keeping,
 Teambuilding and Communication skills;
- <u>State Treasurer</u> -- should also be familiar with using a Computer, Quick Books Program, Record Keeping, Bookkeeping, Budgeting and Communication skills;
- <u>State Advocate</u> -- should understand "Robert's Rules of Order", our State By-Laws and have computer and communication skills;
- <u>State Warden</u> -- The SW has the responsibility for meeting setup and the Convention Banquet and assist with keeping order at all meetings.

It is also important that candidates know it is a "myth" that serving in one position means you always have to move to the next position or eventually be State Deputy. In the past there have been officers who remained in the same position for 3-5 years as long as they were performing a quality job and were re-elected. Also a member does "not" have to start as a State Warden to serve in any other position as long as he is qualified for and elected to that position.

Members willing to serve in any one of the State Officer positions should inform the State Deputy or call one the PSD's with any questions about a particular position.

The PSD's are willing to guide and inform any candidate about the full job responsibility for the office they are seeking. Also, any prospective candidates need to know what they are getting into. There is a major commitment of time and some financial commitment is expected. Are they seriously prepared for this? Is the wife and family on board with this commitment? **These are the realities**. It is more than a title and prestige as some might think.

Help From All Over for Southern Oregon Fire Victims

For many of us, we make varying plans in advance as to how our year should progress. However, our State Deputy did not know his plans would soon change!

Only a month ago, Oregon State Deputy Ron Boyce planned to visit with DD 11 Ipo Ross to discuss the 2021 State Convention venue in Klamath Falls and other details.

Ron had also been busy working with Supreme to provide relief supplies and gift cards to the many fire victims around the State of Oregon. Just after the 1st wave of supplies from Supreme had arrived at Council 1594 in Medford, Ron was in our area and spent the day meeting fire victims and handing out the supplies he had helped to acquire. The many sad faces that had pulled into the Medford Knights of Columbus Hall parking lot soon departed with a ray of hope and gratefulness. After those supplies were dispersed, Ron Boyce once again inquired if more relief was needed. The answer was yes!

In between these works, we had seven more pallets arrive with tents, sleeping bags, lanterns and cots to improve the living conditions of folks who had lost their homes. Just after the 2nd shipment from Supreme arrived, State Secretary Sid Thiel who was also in Southern Oregon stopped by to help out. Sid also had the opportunity to not only carry out supplies but to hear stories from victims of the fast-moving fire that took so many people's homes.

We are very thankful to the many volunteers and to Supreme for their rapid response to meet the needs of our community.





This was a bilingual Rosary where decades were said alternating between English and Spanish. The Council also sponsored the 'Fifth Friday' dinner to local families in need on October 30.

St Francis Council 9137 in Sherwood participated in two Rosary Bowls; October 3rd in Keizer and October 10th in Newberg. The Council also sponsored the Catholic Citizen Essay Contest and sent the winners essay work to the Jurisdiction contest. A men's retreat was well attended and went off without a hitch on October 17th. Father Tim Furlow gave an inspiring talk and answered questions in the Q & A that followed. On October 24th a Prayer Walk through Sherwood's Old Town was attended by several dozen Knights and citizens to offer positive prayers for the local businesses, schools and City Hall. The Council also raised \$600 to benefit the fire relief funds for the benefit of those affected by the recent fires in Oregon. Finally, the Knights started the Tuesday night adult Bible study class and continued their tradition of Friday night Holy Hour observance at the end of St Francis' Adoration.









Martin and Miguel Marcial (Father & Son) Covid-19 Victims

Brother/Friends

Had a nice visit with Miguel today at Asante Hospital in Ashland. They even had a person available via video so Miguel and we could have an actual conversation with this guy who spoke Miguel's language and translating it to us in our English language. It was, at times, a little cumbersome, but very effective.

Doctors are using a new 5-day drug on Miguel, who has COVID-19 in both lungs and currently he is on day 2. They expect him to improve after the 5 days, then he can go home to finish recuperating. They will re-evaluate if improvement is not seen. He is in good spirits and asked for prayers.

Martin who is 85 also has COVID-19 is in ICU and not progressing very well. He is slightly sedated 24-7 to reduce anxiety and is on full-time oxygen and must eat quickly and small meals so he can get back on the oxygen. The doctors gave him a choice to either go home on Hospice or to fight. He chose to fight. He is on the same meds as Miguel and also has 3 more days to see results. If that does not work the next procedure is more invasive. They will need to put him under for 14 days, so tubes can be placed into his lungs to help him breathe along with some-type of a 14-day treatment. If that does not work, they will have to install some type of permanent port in his neck so he can breathe. There are a lot of "IFs" in his prognosis. One thing for sure, **PRAYERs** are requested!

Martin and Miguel were living with Granddaughter/niece Johanna who is 8 months pregnant. Their home was burnt during the Almeda Fire. Please pray for the whole family.



REFERENCE: Call for Resolutions

It is time to start thinking and formulating resolutions for discussion and/or enactment at the 2021 State Convention, which is to held in Klamath Falls, on April 30th to May 2nd, 2021 (Note State By-Laws Article 1, Sec. 13 & 14).

Resolutions sent from Councils need to be signed by either the Grand Knight or Trustee and the Financial Secretary. Then, the original copy, with appropriate signatures and the imprinted Knights of Columbus Council Seal, needs to be sent to the State Advocate by **February 28, 2021.** Additionally, copies of the original resolution also need to be sent to both the State Deputy and State Secretary.

A Resolution Committee appointed by the State Deputy in January will review the resolutions in early March. Copies of the resolutions, along with the committee's recommendation, will be sent to all Councils approximately 60 days prior to the State Convention. Delegates who will be attending the State Convention should also be knowledgeable of all the content of the resolutions and be ready to discuss and/or vote the opinion of their Council.

St. Therese Council acted as a host Council with all charter members first joining St. Therese Council to watch and learn about an already active Council. "This really helped their new members get a feel of how the meetings were conducted and how a Council can grow to become productive" said Mike McDougall the new Grand Knight for St. Rose of Lima, also a former Treasurer of St. Therese Council. St. Rose was able to start with 24 members and has added 3 new members already. All three new members came from many of the sons of their new members. New Knight Eric Bennett was able to help get 2 of his 3 sons to join the Knights using the on demand exemplification. Mr. Bennett said "It really brings the family together when they can all begin to participate together in the Knights and helps keep these young men connected to their faith." With fires raging around the State of Oregon, Council 12656 from St Pius X in Portland stepped up to help both the Santiam Canyon Fire East of Salem and the Alameda Fire in the Medford area.

In the South, Grand Knight Joe Pulito from Council 12656 called Grand Knight Michael Pitts from Medford and immediately sent a check for \$1000 to help the fire victims. A week later, Council Member Bob Eldred and his wife transported over 2000 pounds of canned goods to the Medford Knights Hall for their bi-weekly food distribution. Bob also brought along gift cards and another check, this time for \$8,356.

Many of you have heard by now that I tested positive on Friday, October 9th, for COVID. I am symptom-free and doing fine, and am hunkered down at home.

I have had contact with many of you over the past week, and I know some of you may have concerns about your own exposure. So, I'll do my best to clarify a few things.

First and foremost, if you have not been contacted by me and/or the Santiam Hospital, you are NOT in the risk category for transmission. The infectious disease experts look at the 48 hour period prior to testing, and are looking at extended interaction (15 minutes or more). A casual conversation in the parking lot or a passing by are not an issue. Neither is contact with me prior to Wednesday, October 7th.

Second, there were a total of 3 other people in my circle who have tested positive. Based on what we know, I was 4th (and last) in the chain of infection. All these interactions were this past week.

Third, everyone who was in contact with the 4 of us, and meets the exposure criteria by the infectious disease experts for timing and duration, has been contacted and has either tested negative or is at home waiting for their test results.

Fourth, everyone working the Hall this week was either not exposed or has tested negative.

I want to apologize to anyone and everyone that may be worried about their exposure. If you have any questions or concerns please give me a call or email. If you are concerned about exposure, call me and I will help you arrange for testing.

And please continue to use precautions – wear a mask, social distance, and wash hands.

This is the time for which You were born!

This is the time for which you were born! What? No, you didn't read that wrong. This is the time for which you were born. You might recall that when we are baptized, we are anointed *Priest, Prophet and King*. The focus today is on the *Prophet* part. Like John the Baptist, we are meant to be a "voice crying out in the wilderness". Okay, but how do we do that? And why now?

I know you are aware of the restrictions to the gathering for Mass in Oregon during this pandemic. Different areas have slightly different restrictions, but basically, churches can no longer be at full capacity due to these restrictions. Many people have not been able to attend Mass. The tragic part of all this is that many of our fellow parishioners will never return to the pews. For those without a deep faith, Mass was as much a family habit as it was a spiritual obligation. That habit has been dropped, for many, permanently. When the pandemic is over, our parish families will be much smaller than before. In some parishes, up to 50% may never return. Here's the part where you come in.

Remember the voice crying out in the wilderness? That's you. You need to be a beacon to those wandering, to help bring them back to the church pews, for the sake of their souls. How do you do that? First, without being judgmental, offer to meet them or bring them to church. Make it a social occasion in addition to a spiritual one. Mention that you would like to go to breakfast with them afterwards or tell them you've missed them and would like to see them again. Help them to get back into the habit they have gotten away from. Remember to model your life to continue to make it an attractive alternative to society at large. In short, *Walk the walk*. Give them an additional reason to make Mass a priority by inviting the men who are not Knights to join the Knights of Columbus. The fraternity of the other men in the Council can be an incentive, for the man who is straying, to return to church. His involvement with Council activities can help him once again feel a part of the parish. Remember—men who are spiritually on fire, will not stray from the pews. So how do we help to light this fire?

One great new resource is the new Knights of Columbus video series called "Into the Breach". You are or should be already familiar with the "Into the Breach" booklet, but the Knights of Columbus stepped it up by the power of ten with this new video series. This series will ignite the passion in every Catholic man's heart for the Faith. Talk to your parish priest about inviting the men in the parish to a series of evenings to watch and discuss these videos. You can download the video series and order the study guide from Supreme. Make it a great social event with snacks also. You will be glad you did. Beside this video series, you can work on other Faith formation activities, especially if you have a large parish. Find men in your Council to explore new ideas of reaching Catholic men. Every year more material becomes available to help men become what God had intended them to be. DD 14 David Judy Reporting for Council 14802, Beaverton

Council 14802 has been involved with the USDA/Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon "Farm to Family program".

We are also partnered up with the Church next door, which is the Beaverton Foursquare and they have a great parking lot which we use for this food distribution.

The Knights have been in charge of vehicle control and unloading of the trucks which are 45+ feet in length. Since the unloading cannot be accomplished at the actual loading dock the task of unloading is no mean feat! Each of the pallets is 4 feet off the ground. Therefore, each truck has often been loaded by fork lift. The side of the pallet the fort lift uses is much lower to the ground and wider apart. The use of a pallet jack does not help. It is too narrow and also too tall. We have had to pry each pallet up from the floor and then slide a chain in and then pull them to the rear of the truck with the use of a rented fork lift. (24 to 28 pallets per load). This is hard but rewarding work.

Our Council is also helping load vehicles of those seeking food with the help from the Foursquare Church and its people. Our partnership with Foursquare is and has been great.

We are all serving God's people in need.



It's entirely possible long-term to meet in person while setting up a conference call option for those who are unable to attend in person. Marian Icon:

They are intended for Councils to use as they're available, but I will need to be aware of where they are at all times. I will periodically check in with DDs regarding their whereabouts.

It's a great way to help promote visibility of the Knights of Columbus and an excellent recruitment tool. Any Council can use it any time that it's available. Let's take advantage of this resource. Forms:

As we have been encountering the emergency fire situations, I have put a hold on sending out forms/correspondence. I felt that the last thing Councils needed right now was to be bothered about forms. I will start tracking the forms again, but I also realize that the fires have had long-term impacts on people even after the fires were done. Remember that their needs and well-being comes first. I will completely understand if Councils in that position need to focus on that rather than forms.

SP-7 Columbian Award (due June 30th)

As of now, the Form 185, Form 365 and Form 1295 are all past due if you Council has not submitted it to Supreme. Let's continue to get these submitted. Thank you for all your hard work.

Parade of Past State Deputies

Clarence Joseph Brown 19th State Deputy of Oregon 1944-1946



Clarence Joseph Brown was born on October 26, 1906 in Concrete, ND to John and Mary Cleary Brown. Clarence attended Mayville State Teachers College in Mayville, ND and was a member of the North Dakota National Guard.

Clarence married Eileen Horgan in Neche, ND on June 11, 1928. In 1933 the couple moved to Eugene, OR where Clarence worked many years as a real estate broker and developer. They had 10 children: Mary, Dorothy, Joanne, Betty, Kathy, Marilyn, Jerry, James, Daniel and Patrick. Clarence was a member of the Eugene Council and District Deputy.



The 37th annual Convention was held in Eugene on May 27, 1945. Due to governmental and other WWII restrictions, it was a one day Convention with only one delegate from each of the 23 Councils. State Deputy Clarence Brown presided.

Clarence was a charter member of the Marist Foundation and a member and president of the Eugene Realty Board and the Eugene Multiple Listing organization.

Clarence J. Brown died on December 10, 1995 in Eugene, OR and is buried at Mount Calvary Catholic Cemetery in Eugene, OR.

Eileen died on July 8, 2003 and is buried next to Clarence.





Safe Environment

Once you have turned in your Officers Chosen (185 Report) and Program Personnel (365 Report) to Supreme for the new Fraternal Year, the Grand Knight, Program, Family and Community Directors will receive an email to complete the Safe Environment Training. You will have about **30 days** to complete the Safe Environment

Training. **Note:** leaving one or more of the Council Director roles vacant on the 365 report Does Not exempt a

Council from Safe Environment requirements.

If the training is not completed within the 30 days, the Knight will not be recognized by Supreme in their Director's role and a new 365 will need to be submitted with either a new name or the same name.

The purpose of the training is for Brother Knights serving in key leadership roles to safeguard children and other vulnerable persons by recognizing the signs of possible abuse.

This is part of the Columbian Award so if not completed by all four positions of your Council your Columbian Award will not count, hence your Council will not gain Star.

The training is easy and not time consuming and good for three years.

Group Training can be done by Councils or Districts, **BUT** each member needs to have their own computer or laptop with each member.

NOTE: Each Member Must Sign On Under His Own Name To Get Credit.

Date For Councils To Be Compliant: 50% of Councils by Oct. 1st and 75% of Councils by Dec. 1st

As of 8/3/20 the Armatus Report shows 2 Councils with 100% compliance – 5416 Silverton and 9137 Sherwood.

Let all work together to reach 100% compliance of all Councils at the earliest date, so we can concentrate on membership and programs.

Please read the four topics below.

Star Tracker and Safe Environment

The October Star Tracker should have been forwarded to the Councils by the DD.

We as a state had a goal for Councils to be compliant: 50% of Councils by Oct. 1st on Safe Environment. We are about 21% of Councils in compliance. Please look at the star tracker for your Council. If the role is highlighted in **Pink** and

reads **No** the member assigned to the role must complete the safe environment training and background check **ASAP.** If the training is not completed within the 30 days, the Knight will not be recognized by Supreme in their Director's role and a new 365 will need to be submitted with either a new name or the same name.

If all the members completed the requirements highlighted in **Pink** and reads **No** we as a state will be at 50% compliant.

NEW GOAL is 75% of Councils compliant by Dec. 1st. This means your Council.

Branding and Logos

The Knights of Columbus branding and logos have been changed. New logo at the top.

Subordinate Units of the Knights of Columbus (e.g., local Councils and assemblies, chapters, Fourth Degree Districts, State Councils, Fourth Degree Provinces, etc.) are permitted to download and use the emblems and logos below for "Ordinary Fraternal Use" (i.e., activities that fall within the charitable and fraternal mission of the Knights of Columbus).

Please be aware that there are spam emails being sent to Knights of Columbus. Please don't respond to any emails that look suspicious or asking for money or donations. Some Knights emails have been hacked. If there is a concern or issue with an email sent to you, please forward to me.

2020 Election Guidelines (Even though the elections are over, this is a guideline for all future events as well)

I have been asked if it is allowed for members to wear political hats etc. at Council meetings or events. Answer is Yes, **BUT** the member is not allowed to voice his opinion or verbally endorse any candidate or issues. Below is some Dos and Don'ts regarding the election.

DO NOT - engage in any partisan political activity in the name of the Knights of Columbus including activity that seeks to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.

DO NOT - make partisan political statements in the name of the Knights of Columbus including statements that seek to endorse or oppose a candidate or party in a campaign for public office.

DO NOT - congratulate or admonish public officials in the name of the Knights of Columbus.

DO NOT - on behalf of your local Council, take a position on a matter of public policy unless you are joining a position the Supreme Council or your State Council has already articulated.

DO NOT - distribute any Knights of Columbus member lists or contact information to political campaigns or to individuals running for office.

DO NOT - use an official fraternal title in connection with your personal political activity, except to convey biographical information

DO NOT - use Knights of Columbus facilities, including, but not limited to, email accounts, social media, fax machines, letterhead in connection with partisan political activity.

DO - become active in the political life of your local community;

DO - register to vote and encourage others to register to vote;

DO - become informed on public policy issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church at the local, state, federal, and international levels;

DO - share with others the Catholic Church's teachings on moral issues of fundamental importance to society;

DO - write letters to the editor of local newspapers;

DO - know your elected representatives and their positions on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;

DO - correspond with your representatives and let them know that you support the Catholic position on issues of fundamental interest to the Catholic Church;

DO VOTE!

It comes from St. Paul's letter to the Colossians, where he reminds us that we are already living a risen life in Christ, and so we must "seek what is above." This advice is full of many practical consequences. In troubled times, dear friends, let us offer calm and wisdom to those around us.

I wish you peace and joy with your friends, and a longing for heaven that gives you hope in the here and now. As St. Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians (echoing a text from Isaiah), it has not even entered the human mind what God has prepared for those who love him.
