





Worthy Grand Knights, Vocation Directors, and Brothers of our Councils, Greetings;

State Advocate William Geary

The seminarians whom you have so generously supported in the past, and through the Covid debacle, are now returning to their seminary classes and pastoral assignments. Your support now and in the past has made the

positive difference for many of these young men to continue their studies. We must now pick up where we left off at the end of our last fraternal year and begin anew with our support.

However, changes, that are out of the control of our office and your Councils are taking place, as are changes in our Catholic lives. What I am about to tell you may be a little hard for some to accept. Be that as it may, this is the reality of what is facing us and we should and must, as Knights all, rise to meet that challenge.

Our office, in its current format, was created by IPSD, brother Ron Boyce. The idea was for the state organization to relieve some of the pressure placed on the administrative assistants at both Mt. Angel and the diocesan office staff. With diminished staffing and more workload on the remaining staff, the Oregon RSVP effort would be better serviced by having a State Director create a one stop request desk. With all that now in place and working, we began moving forward. However, there is a "detour" in the road to support and I must address this issue now, at the beginning of the fraternal year.

We realize that many of Oregon's Knights wish to support seminarians who only come from or are going to be ordained to serve the diocese of Portland or Baker. Many of you may or may not know that Bishops from other diocese also send their young men to Mt. Angel to study for ordination. Today, I have received from Mt. Angel the first four (4) requests for our RSVP support. One each from the diocese of Seattle, Monterey (CA), Santa Fe and Salt Lake. All these young men are at Mt. Angel. All need our support and prayers and any reasonable assistance we can give. They may someday become a priest in your parish. Brothers, there is more than enough support that has currently come forward and pledged to participate in the RSVP program from our jurisdiction, than we have names of Oregon seminarians.

To be perfectly clear about this endeavor, the RSVP program, is a Supreme sponsored program. So why is the state so involved? We can think of several reasons. To assist the staff at the agencies in Oregon as was mentioned. To support and attempt to make a clearing house effect for the Councils and streamline the process. To allow an easier way for a Council to raise funds and get answers. Foremost, to provide whatever it may take to support each young man at our seminary and assist our Bishops and those of our Catholic brethren from any diocese in these times. We are attempting to fulfill an obligation to all who come to ask us for our support. You do have the right to choose your support options. Please understand that we do not take any negative position on your decision on whom you wish to support. We only ask that our Councils consider all the options under the RSVP umbrella, lads from our state, from other states and abroad and institutions such as the Bishop White Seminary in Spokane at Gonzaga University. I very vividly remember collections at the parish level and at Knights Council general membership meetings asking for and pledging financial support for vocations in foreign lands. It all comes down to us, to fulfill a need, which we can not turn on backs on.

Please, consider with the utmost good intentions, your tremendous support;

As Knights we are called to evangelize that message in whatever creative way we can in our Parish and throughout the community. I know several Councils are doing great activities with use of religious cards, yard Signs, and 4' x 8' signs along their Parish and Catholic School areas. I have contacts for this type of KCIC items. But have we thought of the thousands of citizens commuting to work, errands or other events that daily travel the highways?.

This State Activity is not a budgeted item. It depends on your contribution. It has existed in Oregon for almost fifty years, but only about one-fourth of the Councils have been loyal supporters for this activity. The Nativity scene of Joseph, Mary, and the Christ Child may only be seen a few times by the commuting public, <u>but</u> it may be that quick reminder for a person or maybe the phrase that initiates discussion among a carload of passengers. The message could be the means that creates interest for a person to start inquiring about being a Christian? It maybe the interest to inquire about this group called Knights. According to the billboard company statistics, the billboard locations we have used during November and December provide nearly three million "viewing impressions." **BUT this activity needs your assistance**. The usual range of Council contributions has been \$300 to \$600. Let's express unity and sponsor 2-3 billboards this year. Cost per billboard is \$1300 -1500 per month. Christianity in general is being challenged today! Let's respond!! And evangelize the true message!

At the time of the meeting, SM did not know the timeline for

release or the final costs of the baldrics, although he assumed

the cost would be comparable to the current baldrics. The new baldrics will have the same dimensions as the current baldrics, even available in the tall or long size.

You'll notice on the insert to the right that baldrics will be offered from the English Company. There are currently no changes to standard Service Baldric, so these will be used by our regular members in regalia. Now we just wait until December.

ASAP, Ultrasound and Oregon Right To Life

There have been several Councils requesting guidance on locating PRCs in their region for donating services or money. It has been brought to my attention that at least one PRC was identified to be pro-abortion. Any PRC that supports abortion should not be in the PRC business and Councils clearly cannot support such a center, even if they may provide support to mothers who choose life.

The Knights of Columbus ASAP Handbook has excellent suggestions on locating pregnancy centers as follows: Pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes, and the women and babies they serve, are in dire need of financial contributions, donations of material goods, and other volunteer services.

Pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes can be found by searching through databases available at: heartbeatinternational.org, birthright.org, among others. Local Catholic Charities, the Sisters of Life, diocesan pregnancy resource centers, and other organizations are also in need of support. Contact your local parish pro-life coordinator or diocesan Respect Life Office or search online for these organizations.

<u>Aid and Support After Pregnancy</u>: Through the Aid and Support after Pregnancy (ASAP) initiative, Councils can now contribute even more support. For every \$500 a Council donates to a qualifying pregnancy resource center or maternity home (up to \$2,000), the Supreme Council will donate \$100 more. Visit kofc.org/asap for resources. Every Council should identify a pregnancy resource center or maternity home it can serve through the ASAP initiative. In order to qualify for financial support from Supreme, the organization must be in accordance with Catholic Social Teaching regarding life and the family. Qualifying organizations cannot provide or refer for abortion, abortifacients, or contraception. <u>Ultrasound</u>: The Knights of Columbus work together to purchase ultrasound machines for qualifying pregnancy centers. Councils raise 50% of the cost and Supreme will provide the other 50% to complete the purchase. For additional detailed information on the ultrasound program, please visit: Ultrasound Program - Saving the Unborn | Knights of Columbus (kofc.org) It is important to mention that the above ASAP and Ultrasound programs are special Supreme grant programs that require individual case-by-case PRC approval and an application. As outlined in the detailed information for these programs, the PRC must be in accordance with Catholic Social Teaching regarding life and the family. With this said, we know there are so many more PRCs out there and, although they may not be Catholic, they are pro-life and are clearly helping mothers. In our present -day culture of death, we need to support as many PRCs as possible.

<u>Oregon Right to Life:</u> The Oregon Right to Life (ORTL) is a wonderful organization that has excellent resources. The ORTL has a comprehensive data base of approved PRCs in Oregon that is organized by region and services provided. The listed PRC regions are: Central / Eastern Oregon, Coastal Cities, Portland Metro Area, Southern Oregon, Willamette Valley, National / International. The listed PRC services provided are: (1) Adoption Agencies and Referrals, (2) Clothing, Furniture, Supplies, Pregnancy Testing, and Counseling, (3) Post-Abortion Help, (4) Birth Centers and Housing, (5) Ultrasounds and (6) Grief and Loss Support. Lebanon Council 3184 at Life Chain 2022

Thousands of volunteers spend one hour each year to conduct a public, prayerful, peaceful stand for life through an activity called the *Life Chain*, which takes place annually on the first Sunday of October, and that first Sunday fell on October 2 in 2022. *Life Chains* were held in at least 10 communities throughout Oregon, many with involvement from members of the Knights of Columbus.

At least 4 Knights from Lebanon Council 3184 participated in the Chain held in Lebanon: Roger Maurer, Arnold Kroll, Paul Nowak, and Joseph Hall. Also participating were the Life Couple from Albany Council 1577: Patrick and Teresita Parson.

Attendance this year was disappointing, with only about 15 people taking the time to demonstrate concern for the protection of unborn human life. Reactions from people driving by seemed about equal, with some giving thumbs-up signals and showing their support by honking their horns. Others gave negative responses with thumbs-down and shamefully a greater preponderance of middle fingers that I have not noticed previously. In fact, two vehicles each gave middle-fingers in stereo as individuals in each car (two young men in one, and two young women in the other) expressed themselves so very obscenely).



So was the effort worth it? Of course it was. We prayed for the protection of unborn children, and we demonstrated for the world to see that some people are willing to make an extra effort to stand up on behalf of the defenseless. We might not have changed any minds this day, but we at least have given people something to think about.

Recently, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly rolled out a new pro-life initiative called Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP). For every \$500 the Council donates to a pregnancy resource center or maternity home (up to \$2,000), the Supreme Council will donate \$100. Council 1594 is looking forward to adding another \$800 to the final numbers (\$400 each) in support of these wonderful organizations.

A Mighty Knight Has Fallen

Thom Gilsdorf: May He Rest in God's Eternal Peace

With the passing of Worthy Sir Knight Thom Gilsdorf, the Knights of Columbus lost an exemplary Brother and a gentle and animating force.

A charter member of our Council 1594 Medford, Thom became a Knight, fifty-five years ago on September 1, 1967, when our Council was founded. In April 1994 he volunteered to serve on the Council's degree team. For nearly 30 years he performed during the ceremonial as the role of Grand Knight at Council exemplifications, and over time, conferred membership on most of today's Shepherd of the Valley knights.

Born the sixth of eleven children on November 15, 1946, Thom grew up in San Mateo County, California. With his wife Julie, he raised 9 children (six of whom were adopted). He spent most of his professional years as an industrial chemist and ended his career as a manager.

He enjoyed people and had a smile that never seemed to leave him. He thrived on being with others of all ages. In retirement he spent many hours driving for the manor and bringing Ashland High School athletic teams to events throughout the state. Thom was prodigiously generous with his time and energy, and always a man of the church. He cared for Shepherd of the Valley's physical plant, was perennial delivery driver/furniture mover for St. Vincent DePaul Society, and often did a lot of maintenance work at St. Rita's Retreat House. As the threat of Covid faded, Thom took the lead in arranging for a Twin Creeks bus to transport worshippers to Sunday Mass.

He constantly pondered how to make things better and then took the first steps to make this happen. Whenever I can, Thom once explained "I ...find a solution. It may take a while, but I will find a solution." He was always ready to help others in need, contributing his own money to bring a project to completion.

Thom was diagnosed with terminal cancel barely two months before his death. But, his trajectory of service never faltered. Weak and often in pain, Thom insisted on discharging his duties to the last minute, visiting Councils as District Warden and accompanying the Silver rose to the Idaho border, presiding at installation ceremonies, virtually never missing a St. Augustine Council meeting, and was active with the Fourth Degree.

He had always lived his life to the fullest and in and out of the hospital or by phone from his sick bed he worked to the last moment. He was a remarkable and irreplaceable figure. We loved Thom Gilsdorf in life. Let us remember him in death

Blessed Michael McGivney Fund Grant Guidelines

Applicant must be a Oregon Knight, the widow or orphan unmarried child under age 26 of such Knight.

Applicant must have been in the Order for at least one-year.

Applicant must be in "good standing".

Applicant must be a member of the requesting Oregon Council.

Grants are provided based on financial need, not on the applicant's activities as a Knight.

Funds are for the "Necessities of Life." Example: housing, utilities or food - not to reduce debt Applicant cannot receive two grants for the same situation.

The situation should not pre-date the applicant's entry into the Order.

Applicant cannot receive a grant more often than once every two years.

Funds cannot be used to purchase real property or automobiles for the applicant.

If the applicant is the Grand Knight or Financial Secretary, the District Deputy should make the investigator selection and sign the application as the FS or GK.

Oregon State will not provide application status to anyone except the Grand Knight.

The State Secretary is the only one who may contact the Council for clarification. If possible, screening committee members are asked to respond to the application within 24 hours. E-mail your recommendation to the State Secretary and to all the screeners who are evaluating the same application. The applications and all the personal information, especially names and Councils are confidential!

Frank Thomas "Tom" Erhardt was born July 8, 1937 in Portland, OR to John A. and Anna Lyski Erhardt. He grew up in Portland and later Monument, where he graduated high school in 1955. He attended Eastern Oregon College before going to work at the lumber mill in Kinzua. He then worked at the Terminal Flour Mill before returning to the lumber industry.

Frank married Ardith Swanson on April 30, 1977 in Redmond, OR. They had 3 sons; Tom, Chris, Alan and 4 daughters; Shannon, Theresa, Roberta and Valerie. Frank also had a stepson, Michael.

Frank worked at the lumber mill in Redmond for 27 years before retiring. He then drove a truck until moving to Irrigon in 2005. He was a part of Friends of the Irrigon Library and drove the Irrigon Senior Bus.

Frank was a member of the Redmond Council 3636. Frank served as District Deputy, State Advocate 1991-93, State Treasurer 1993, State Secretary 1993-95. He was elected State Deputy at the 1995 State Convention held in Pendleton, OR Frank died August 7, 2008 at Kadlec Medical Center in Richland, WA and is buried at Deschutes Memorial Gardens in Bend, OR.
