When all State Deputies were being installed with their jewel as a State Deputy last June, our Supreme Archbishop Lori followed with a very thought provoking homily and message: "You are Evangelizers of the Lord's Love and the visions of Fr. Canby Council 3484 GK Dave Bernklau and four additional Knights presented a check for \$3,000 to Gretchen McCallum and Paulette Hefflinger of the St Vincent de Paul Food Bank on behalf of Council 3484. This food bank has operated out of St Patrick's Church in Canby for more than 20 years, with Council 3484 being a strong supporter of the St Patrick St Vincent de Paul Food Bank for most of those years. The Council has supported the food bank both financially and in man power.

This food bank is open every Wednesday from 3:30 pm to 8:00 pm and serves an average of 225 families each week, providing sufficient food for their needs for a week. So It takes a lot of effort and co-ordination by a lot of people to "make this happen".

Knights also help by picking up food from Fred Meyer, Safeway and Thriftway markets several days each week and then volunteers store the food donated by these markets in commercial sized coolers and freezers at the church until it can be distributed each Wednesday. It is estimated that each month those donations bring in an average of 4,000+ pounds of additional food.

Each Wednesday many Knights and their wives and children, plus volunteers from St Patrick Church, Mt Angel Seminary and the local LDS church, assemble and prepare to serve the needy families who rely on this food bank to meet their families nutritional needs for the coming week.

Council 3484 also sponsors the Knights of Columbus "40 Cans for Lent" at St Patrick Church. Each week our Knights and their families and all volunteers work hard and greet those coming to the food bank with a smile and a happy hello.

Dear Brother Knight,

Your immediate action is necessary to protect medical professionals and all people of faith from being forced to participate in or pay for abortions.

Congress is currently considering legislation to fund the government, and it is critical that a provision called the Conscience Protection Act be included in this legislation.

- 3. Utilize help from the Fraternal Mission Department: "We've had all the support we need, from earphones [used to translate a degree ceremony] to Spanish displays."
- 4. Don't worry about the language barrier: "I only speak about 10 percent Spanish, but there's always a way to communicate." (Quote by District Deputy George Sonnen).
- 5. Let them create their own plans: "They are learning leadership. They need to learn they have great ideas and we give them the opportunity to do this."

As the Oregon District Master of the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus and as a Patriot of this country, I can imagine what can be accomplished if we would all work and pray together? I say we can do it! We can make the difference!

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Election of Council Officers is quickly approaching. Section 128 of the Laws of the Order indicates that Officers are to be elected by ballot at a regular business meeting held between the first day of May, up to and including the fifteenth day of June. Section 128 also states that College Councils may elect officers at a regular business meeting held between the first day of March, up to and including the first day of June.

Immediately after the election of Officers, the Financial Secretary should report the Officers-elect to the Supreme Council using the Member Management Application located in Officers Online on the Knights of Columbus web site or by using the Report of Officers Chosen for the Term (#185), which is available at kofc.org/forms.

COUNCIL 3818 DONATES COATS FOR KIDS

Our Lady of the Lake Council 3818 of the Knights of Columbus, located in Lake Oswego, OR., donated 48 coats for teen-agers to the Transitional Youth organization of Portland, OR. In 2009, the Knights of Columbus launched the Coats for Kids initiative. Since the program's inception, the Knights of Columbus have given away nearly 400,000 coats in the United States and Canada.

Since 1991 Transitional Youth has provided homeless and at-risk youth the skills and

opportunities to live independently. The mission of **Transitional Youth** is to provide support and housing to homeless and at-risk youth and to seek to transform both hearts and lives through compassion, guidance and the grace of God.

Transitional Youth achieves their mission through the following:

Outreach in downtown Portland:

They serve more than 10,000 hot and nourishing meals annually to homeless and at-risk youth.

- They provide clothing, personal hygiene items, sleeping bags and other basic care necessities for survival on the streets.
- They expose youth to the community of faith and the Gospel message through practical service and prayer.
- They provide haircuts, make-overs, and professional clothing for interviews and education opportunities, as well as assistance in job searches and placement.
- They offer friendship and membership through consistent service and holding youth in unconditional high regard.

They offer a safe place of respite for young people facing an often hostile adult world.

Housing at Ritz Family Ranch, Yacolt, WA.; Beaverton House, Beaverton, OR.; Junction House, Vancouver WA.; Vida's Ark, Vancouver, WA.

They provide safe and comfortable housing, complete with supervision and support, for up to six homeless men at each of the men's houses, Ritz Family Ranch, Beaverton House, and the Junction House. Vida's Ark is a young women's home that cares for homeless and at-risk youth and their children.

They provide job skills training and opportunities for growth.

They maintain and monitor a drug-free and alcohol-free home environment, where young men and women can shed addictions and gain health and strength.

Beginning April 2, Officers Online will be adding a new portal – called "**Supplies Online**" – for ordering Knights of Columbus print items and supplies online. There will be a brief transition period, after which Councils and Assemblies will no longer be able to order materials via phone or fax. Also, please refrain from ordering using the Order Form #1.

All orders will need to be placed by Officers with access to Officers Online. If a Council Officer in your District does not yet have access to Officers Online, please have them contact the Supreme Council's Customer Service Dept. at 1-800-380-9995 to obtain their invitation code to complete their registration for the site.

The new online self-service ordering tool is a simple and easy to use site that offers a full catalog of supply items. It allows the viewer to see samples of the materials being ordered and eliminates the use of manual order forms. The site also includes a keyword search feature to help in locating needed items. The new ordering process also includes online order tracking and shipping information as well as email confirmation once orders are placed.
