### Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

#### <u>April 2019</u>

And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning [within us] while he spoke to us on the way and opened the scriptures to us?" (Gospel for April 21, Lk. 24:30-32)

A "fire in the belly," passion, a drive: these are some of the ways we talk about others who can summon a deep, inner motivation and who make a difference. My brothers, can we say the same about our inner drive to go deeper in our Church's teaching? Do our hearts "burn within us" and cause us to daily familiarize ourselves with the riches of our faith? Do we have a fire in the belly to be the kind of men who don't stand silent at the water cooler when we hear our Church's teaching denigrated by colleagues? In order to lead with faith we need to know our faith. We can't give what we don't have. By God's grace, may we each become disciples whose "hearts burn within us."

#### Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month I challenge you to deepen your desire to have a heart 'burning within you' for new knowledge of the Church's teaching and doctrine. Invest five to ten minutes a day reading the *Catechism* or other resource, watching a Catholic talk online, or taking advantage of a local formation opportunity. Secondly I challenge you to talk with a brother in Christ about what you're learning.



#### Supreme Director of Chaplain's Report

#### The K of C and Sacramental Accompaniment

In the 19th century, the young men of St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Conn., were not actively engaged in the Catholic faith. So 29-year-old Father Michael J. McGivney gathered the

"old guard" of active men — who were in their 30s and 40s — and invited them to take leadership roles in the K of C. Their primary evangelical goal: Help younger, non-practicing Catholic men engage in the faith.

This goal remains relevant even today. During the Easter season and throughout summer, your local K of C Council can assist in evangelical outreach, especially through the Order's Sacramental Gifts program.

Start by discussing with your Council your parish's sacramental programs. Let the Knights know how they can assist those just entering the Church at the Easter Vigil. Perhaps the Council can become the place a new Catholic man first experiences fraternity and support. Coach the men of your Council on the best way to welcome these new Catholics into the K of C. Remind the Knights that converts may already have a well-developed spirituality and theological understanding from years of seeking the truth.

In addition, the K of C's Sacramental Gifts program can help young men and fathers renew their own practice of the faith. A small gift — with the promise of prayers, support and perhaps the gift of a Mass said for the family's intention — will go a long way in showing dads that the K of C cares for the spiritual growth of all the men of the parish.

With your help, may every Council understand its fundamental role in welcoming those returning to the faith and may the K of C continue to evangelize those on the peripheries.

smartphone. It will take you to the Office of Catechesis and Faith Formation website for the Archdiocese of Portland. Click on *Institute for Catholic Life and Leadership*, which is up near the top of the page, and scroll down to *Looking for a Speaker*. Then, up will pop a list of speakers available for Western Oregon. You will have to contact the individual yourself to determine their fees (if any), and bear in mind, that some of these speakers will only travel to certain parts of Western Oregon, but the contacts are there and they cover a broad range of topics for you to consider. Also, there are speakers for both English and in Spanish.

Also available, and this will be of help to those on the other side of the mountains as well, is another section of the website. Click on the *Discipleship* up towards the top, and it will take you to **Bible Study Programs, Small Group Resources,** information about **Parish Missions,** and a list of **Retreat Centers** in Oregon.

Remember—No excuses now. Lots of available help and still a couple of months to get it done. If you need more information or help in navigating the links provided, feel free to contact me.
