One meeting was with the Archdiocese Hispanic Ministry Coordinator; another involved a dozen officers from Councils on the eastern sides of Portland Metro Area and one involved thirty-six Hispanic Knights of Columbus members from approximately a fifty mile radius of Salem. Another was with the Associate at Woodburn Parish, who went through a brief and easy to understand explanation of Ethnic Interaction.

We will be hearing more about this particular presentation of Ethnic Interaction. The overall theme from the meetings/sessions we experienced this past week emphasized the need for all ethnic groups to "reach-out." We need to be open when someone is reaching out and use that opportunity to strengthen the relationship. The opportunity could be there and show support. You don't have to speak the same language to show an act of "reaching-out."

Make this Advent Season special. Do you have an Advent Wreath on your dining room table? Perhaps a different member of the family could light the candle each night? Reach out and attend the Lady of Guadalupe Celebration in your Parish. Enjoy the Fiesta Meal following the Mass. You don't have to understand all that is said or sung, but laugh and enjoy the time together. As an Anglo, I'm sure you will come home experiencing an atmosphere of spirituality associated with this celebration and will have gained an acquaintance or two. Your attendance is a perfect example of Ethnic Interaction. It will also be your gain if you attend, even if you don't realize it that evening.

As Pope Francis said "We are a Church of Different Families but we all share the same common belief." The Knights of Columbus are no different. This international group is made up a variety of ethnic groups but we all share the same set of virtues. We are also recipients of the same message revealed that night in Bethlehem: "Peace on Earth, good will to all men." As Knights we need to share that message.

Has everyone reached out, made a new friend this Advent Season? Have you strengthened existing friendships?

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Message

We rightly say of ourselves as Knights that we are the strong right arm of the Church. Never has the support of the Knights of Columbus been more important than it is today and I thank you for it.

I thank you for your leadership in the work of creating safe environments, in the work of protecting children, in the work of training, in the work of making our Order a model for what the whole Church ought to be doing to protect children and young people. I thank you for your prayers, your concern, your

support, your friendship that you extend to bishops and priests; for all the ways you support the Church's mission come rain or come shine.

The Knights of Columbus is no fair weather friend when the going gets rough. I thank you. And may we bishops and priests never have the temerity to ask you to defend the indefensible. Rather, may we walk humbly with you on the path of discipleship wherever that may lead and whatever it might mean as the future unfolds. And walking with you, may we, your bishops and priests, absorb from you the wisdom you have attained in living your faith, in living the vocation of marriage and family, and in coping with the troubles of life.

St. John Paul II taught us that the way to defeat evil is with goodness. The way to defeat scandal created by clergy who violated sacred trust is by the witness of unblemished lives marked by love of God and neighbor. If so, we can have good and well-founded hope that the Church will emerge as it has for many other crises in the past: purified, stronger and focused on the essential mission that Jesus entrusted to her, the mission of putting our faith into action.

End of Year Reminders

It's Resolution Time Again!

Well, Brother Knights – it's that time again. Time to formalize any resolutions that your Council would like to have considered at the State Convention coming up towards the end of April. Resolutions for consideration by the Resolution Committee **need to be submitted no later than ninety days** prior to the scheduled date of the State Council meeting (Convention). All resolutions need to be prepared in triplicate, with the original to be mailed to the State Advocate and copies to the State Deputy and State Secretary. Remember to emboss all resolutions with your council seal.

Email Address Privacy

With the ever-increasing hijacking of email addresses on the internet and from personal/business computers, try to remember to use the BCC function when sending email to your Brother Knights. This will keep any email addresses that you are sending the email to from accidentally ending up in the wrong hands.

Safe Environment Training Continues

We've all heard about the Safe Environment training that is required for certain Officers and Directors in our Councils, but did you know the Officers and Directors have only a certain timeframe (30 days from invitation from Amaritus Praesidium) in which to finish their required training? And if even one class for said Officer and/or Director does not get completed in that timeframe, they become noncompliant with Praesidium and are removed from your Council's list of Officers and Directors at Supreme. Please take time to check out the latest Star Tracker report at the state website (<u>http://kofc-or.org</u>); you can find it in the Forms & Report Library. If you have submitted your Forms #185\#365, but don't see an entry for your Grand Knight, Program Director, Community Director, or Faith Director, you will need to resubmit the form(s) to Supreme so that the name can be added/reactivated at Praesidium. And once the name(s) is/are back on the Star Tracker, make sure your Grand Knight/ Directors finish up the classes. The only way a Council can be considered for Star Council is make sure that your Grand Knight, Program Director, Community Director, and Faith Director have completed all of the Safe Environment classes that have been assigned to them. And many of you are well on your way to being eligible for Star Council. Get that training done!

Dear Oregon Brother Knights,

I recently received a message from the California State Deputy, requesting the assistance of Brother Knights to help with the loss occurring with the wildfires in California. Please do what you can either individually or as a joint contribution from your local Council. There were two major wildfires both pushed by the famous Santa Ana Winds (East Winds as we call them here in Eastern Oregon).

The town of Paradise, California, near Chico and home to Knights of Columbus Council 7773 is nearly destroyed. The partially damaged St. Thomas More Catholic Church is still standing but the Parish Hall and Rectory are destroyed. At this time at least 22 of the members have lost their homes; possible fatalities not known at this time.

Evacuations Centers are overwhelmed by clothing/materialistic items and are not accepting any more. The best assistance is financial. Donations need to be sent to our State Secretary has established a dedicated fund for these checks. His address is: Ron Boyce P.O. Box 23093, Tigard, OR 97281.

Hispanic Outreach – December



Jesse Villarreal Hispanic Outreach

By the time this article is published we will have already had the "All Hispanic Leaders Meeting" on December 5th in Salem, with our Supreme representative Jose Jimenez who came from New Haven, Connecticut to be with us.

It is with great joy that I share the results of almost two days of visiting different parishes in the area. The one highlight of the whole journey was the huge gathering of Hispanic leaders and members from six different local Councils from Salem, Albany, Independence, Woodburn, Canby, and Molalla. (I hope that I didn't miss anyone)!

The meeting was to establish an evaluation of the one Spanish Council we have in the state and to gather information regarding the potential we have in recruiting our Hispanic brothers into the existing Councils here in Oregon.

The journey started with a brief visit with Deacon Felix Garcia at the Archdiocese Office in Portland. Deacon Felix is in charge of all the Hispanic Ministries. I'm sure our own Diocese and Knights of Columbus Supreme Office at New Haven, Connecticut share information regarding the number of families at each of our parishes in Oregon.

We all know the Hispanic population in the area has been on the uphill climb for at least a dozen years or more.

The meeting with Deacon Felix was very informative and productive. The Hispanic or Latino population is increasing and so is the number of local parishes offering a service in Spanish.

Hispanics are bringing a wide variety of religious ministries to their churches that helps to attract almost all family members to attend almost every day (evenings) of the week. They have Bible and Scripture Study Groups for both adults and youth. They have Family and Marriage Groups. These extra hours allow them the opportunity to gather at the church besides going for their regular Sunday services. They seem to be eager to do that...... <u>EXCEPT</u>.....joining the Knights of Columbus.

Deacon Felix expressed some reasons why he believes Hispanics are not as eager to join the Knights of Columbus as we might want. Some of those reasons we are familiar with and others we can work with. Deacon Felix gave us a lot of hope with the possibility that he could help us promote the recruitment of Hispanics.

Our group consisted of Supreme Representative Jose Jimenez, State Deputy Francis Mohr, Ricardo Hernandez, Round Table Coordinator for Canby, St. Patrick's Council 3484, and myself.

Our visits were directed mostly with Administrative Personnel who administer church programs at different levels. We visited St. Pius X in Portland, St. Alexander in Cornelius, St. Matthew in Hillsboro, and St. Luke's in Woodburn. We were informed the churches are experiencing a multi culture attendance but the largest is Hispanic.

We were told there are approximately a half million Hispanics in the state with 50% more or less being Catholic. I also learned there are 299 Spanish Councils in the United States and some in Canada. I DON'T BELIEVE THIS IS WHAT WE WANT OR INTEND TO DO HERE IN OREGON!

Instead, with the approval of the State Officers, we are going to reactivate or resurrect the traditional Round Table program we have and turn it into a "Ethnic Round Table". Canby Council 3484 has been working on this for a short time and already have 34 very active Hispanic members participating with the church and their community in various programs. Seven Hispanic members from Canby Council 3484 have reached the Fourth Degree level as of October this year. Albany Council 1577 has their own Spanish speaking First Degree Team. That's real progress!!!!

That's my contribution to end this calendar year as your Fourth Degree Oregon District Master!!!

Council 678 Portland Michael T. Campy, GK

This Council had two events to show that they are working hard in the Portland area.

The first event was about a Council member, Brother Felix Bessler, doing a very unique thing which was that of using his bagpipes He played them to honor all veterans on and for Armistice Day. It's a pretty amazing event ...held worldwide all at the exact time ...with thousands of bagpipers around the world participating.

The second item was: "We are once again sponsoring the annual turkey project that will have us prominently

displayed in press, radio and TV in the Portland metropolitan area. Last year we had over 800+ individual families who enjoyed a warm dinner for Christmas because of the event. The event is over a 5 to 7 days period. Little is missed in that time to ensure that we are taking care of people less fortunate. There are also opportunities for people to donate a little bit of time to help us deliver boxes in the Portland area. With so many families we can only do so much."



The following explains how Council 678 got involved with this project.

A couple of years ago Mike Campy, Grand Knight of Council 678 and Darin Campbell, President of the Radio Cab Foundation, got together and talked about common interests. It didn't take long to realize the Radio Cab Foundation did so much in the community by helping those in need during Christmas and that Council 678 could help. Last year Council 678 stepped up by giving a monetary donation to a much-needed charity, and were feet on the ground putting boxes together and were making deliveries alongside the dedicated drivers of Radio Cab through the foundation that they started 22 years ago.

Darin Campbell

Mr. Campbell said "our foundation was created because Radio Cab drivers saw a need in our community"; he went on to say " the families we help are those who fall through the cracks and don't get noticed during this time of year but are struggling so much that putting food on the table may not happen without our support".

The Radio Cab Foundation has a goal of feeding 500 families a year; that comes out to approximately 3200 people who get fed at Christmas time. Grand Knight Mike Campy from Council 678 says " this charity and our partnership is a no-brainer for us, making sure families have an opportunity to sit around the table from one another during Christmas and enjoying a Christmas meal, this strikes right at what Christmas should be about, remembering all the sacrifices of our faith and bringing the family together. It's not about the gifts—it's about togetherness"! Each family receives 1 food box that contains one 14 to 16 pound turkey and all of the fixin's, stuffing, green beans, corn, mashed potatoes, gravy and cranberries. Campbell said "Last year Council 678 gave a monetary donation that helped to feed 25 families and on top of that the effort and manpower given to us from Council 678 was amazing to see."

For 22 years the Radio Cab Foundation has been getting together every December collecting food and money and creating lasting memories for an average of 500 families every year. 100% of the money they raise goes into those food boxes. It costs about \$20 for the food box. Every single person that works for the Radio Cab Foundation does so on a volunteer basis, there is zero overhead for this 501c3 charity! This year once again Council 678 has dedicated more money to continue this great Community Partnership that strives to spread a message that Christmas is alive and bringing families together on Christmas Eve is the best way to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ!

After speaking with Mr. Campbell, he says, "there are substantial short falls in fundraising this year. This may be the first time we have done fewer than 500 food boxes since I've been President of the Foundation. In fact there's a great possibility we may have to cut all the way back to 300 to 350 families. Last year we did 641 families. Thanks to Mr Campy and the rest of Council 678 we have hope for a late fundraising push and get those numbers back over 500. We just need a few thousand more dollars."

We'll talk more about it with the DD's at the mid-year organizational meeting in Florence, but it's a really simple process. **Supreme will build a** *custom* **Prospect Landing Page for your Council that you can use on a phone, a tablet or a computer**. You can ask potential members if they're interested in learning more about the Knights and you can enter their information into the form in a matter of seconds. They'll immediately get a personalized email signed by you the Grand Knight encouraging them to join the Knights and reference your Council by name and number.

The form will also auto-generate an email to you, which will give you all of the information given for each person who signs up, and it will enroll them in an email marketing campaign that will help tell them more about the Knights and what we do over time (Don't worry, they can unsubscribe at any time).

It's a great system! *This can be a real game changer in the way we prospect. I would encourage every council to get out in front of this and request your own page immediately.* The attached document explains it in more detail. All you need to do is go to info.kofc.org/pagerequest.

This is the 11th year that Knights of the Resurrection Council No. 13851 has organized a collection of sleeping bags, socks, knitted hats and coats for the homeless individuals in the greater Portland, OR area.

Over the past 11 years Council 13851 has provided 3587 new sleeping bags to homeless shelters and program providers for the homeless. During 2018 we delivered 400 sleeping bags, 795 pairs of new socks and 150 new knitted hats.

This year's (2018) beneficiaries were (1) **Rose Haven**, serving battered women and their families; (2) **Nightstrike**, serving the needs of the homeless under the Burnside Bridge; (3) **St. André Bessette Catholic Church** - Downtown Chapel, serving the needs of the homeless on West Burnside; (4) **St. Francis Church**, serving the needs of the homeless on East Burnside; (5) **Human Solutions Family Center**, serving the needs of the homeless families on Portland's east side; (6) **New Avenues for Youth**, serving the needs of homeless youth; (7) **Volunteers of America**, serving the needs of addicted individuals; (8) **Impact North West**, serving the needs of Women in Crisis (YWCA); (9) **St. Anthony Church** in Tigard, OR and (10) **Father Hearts Pantry** in Oregon City.



Eleven years ago, the Knights of Columbus at Resurrection Catholic Parish initiated a new ministry of providing sleeping bags and clothing for the homeless in the greater downtown Portland, OR area. Every year since, our continued support has allowed us to increase our efforts for the homeless in Oregon. We encourage every Council and Assembly to also consider becoming Fellow Missionaries to the Homeless on behalf of the homeless.

Our Ministry to help the Homeless is now funded by various organizations and individuals concerned with the needs of the homeless. These fellow sponsoring groups include the West Linn Lions Club; Resurrection Catholic Parish; Assured Life Rose City Camp No. 77; Odd Fellow Lodges (Mt Scott/Star No. 188 and Samaritan No. 2, Woodlawn Lodge No. 171 and Rose City Rebecca Lodge No. 170; Resurrection Knights of Columbus Council No. 13851; and Omaha Woodmen Lodge No. 1946.

Last year we set our goal to deliver a minimum of 300 sleeping bags to the homeless of Portland, OR and provide knitted hats, clothing and for the purchase of undergarments. Because of everyone's support we exceeded our goal. We delivered 302 sleeping bags in addition to 500 knitted hats and numerous undergarments.

A sleeping bag will allow the homeless person to experience warm and safe sleep throughout this winter. All our efforts to provide sleeping bags for the homeless is greatly appreciated by those in need. It is estimated that for every two sleeping bags donated, one life is saved. This year, 2018, collectively we saved 200 lives. Since this program was started 11 years ago, we have delivered 3,587 sleeping bags to homeless agencies in the greater Portland, OR area and 1,793 lives have been saved.

A federal government report indicates that Oregon has one of the highest percentages of homeless in the nation. There are over 20,700 homeless in Oregon. We are not called to judge the homeless individual but to offer a help to relieve their stress. All each of us needs to do is to answer the challenge expressed in Matthew Chapter 25 is to, as Knights of Columbus, provide the homeless with sleeping bags, clothing, knitted hats and undergarments.

Brother Knights, the below mentioned video about an organ donor is worth watching.

Our late younger brother Andrew elected to be an organ donor prior to being called Home on June 4, 2013. My siblings, parents and I were there at OHSU, Portland, Oregon on June 6, 2013 when he was taken away for surgery (the OSHU medical staff were AMAZING! After Andrew's funeral at St James Catholic Church-McMinnville/Fr Terry, our entire family gifted all of the doctors, nurses and medical staff with gifts from our home state of Hawaii; they were great professionals who showed our entire family love and support as they cared for Andrew)—the last time we would see him until his wake at Macy & Sons on Monday, June 17, then his Memorial Service at St. James on Tuesday, June 18 in McMinnville, Oregon, where he is laid to rest.

When I saw this video, it was similar to what me and my family experienced not knowing this is how organ donors are honored at this particular hospital. We learned later, from the letters Mom and Dad received from all the recipients of Andrew's donated organs, that he saved their lives. We knew Andrew was a hero to many, especially his baby girl Kelis Malia Agcaoili, whom is among our family he is survived by, that he was a big hero.


