Brothers and Families!

Coinciding with the date that we went through "spring ahead" with our clocks and watches, it's that time of the Fraternal Year when we spring into our Spring Recruitment Drive.

Brothers, search your heart and contemplate why you became a Knight of Columbus. I highly suspect it is because you felt your Faith is important and you were interested in helping others or being involved with a group of friendly men actively doing good works for their parish and community. Everyone feels good when they are involved doing

good for others. Doing good acts is truly putting your faith into action. During our recent State Deputy Meeting, our Supreme Chaplain, Archbishop Lori reminded us that "Fr. McGivney started the Knights of Columbus Order based on Charity. Also, by being a Knight of Columbus, you are "Evangelizers of the Lord's love."

Let's all spring ahead by implementing some of the many activities of our "Faith in Action" Programs and indirectly evangelize the Lord's Love through our actions. As St. Francis of Assisi once expressed "The best evangelization is done with Actions—not words." It was also very timely that the Supreme Office recently unveiled a very simple, very easy process, to implement and to assist us with spring recruiting. It is called the Delta Church Drive. It also is a very basic process; here are the steps:

- Select a date soon (some Sunday/weekend after all the Masses)
- Explain the basic steps with your Pastor and have his permission for a brief 2 minute announcement
- Develop your Council Prospect Page (explained at our Mid-Year Meeting or contact our Membership Director Michael Woody for a 2 page explanation flyer
- Place some Prospect Cards and pencil in each pew
- Man the doors with Brothers who will act as "greeters
- Give each person entering the Church either a Fr. McGivney or other KC Holy Card
- Give the two minute announcement at the end of Mass (a canned 2 minutes announcement is part of the Delta Recruitment Kit. The announcement asks the men to list their name and e-mail address on the Prospect cards)
- Collect Prospect Cards as they leave the Church
- Talk with them if they want to talk and also give them a KC Flyer
- If anyone is interested in joining now, have them fill out a Form 100 and inform them when the next
 1st Degree is scheduled,
- Enter the names and e-mails from the Prospect cards to your Council Prospect Page
- "Prospect Candidates" will receive a brief message from your Grand Knight (a possible message is provided in the Delta Kit).

Prospects will soon be receiving KofC information, activities from Supreme in their e-mails.

So let's make a resolution for this Lenten Season to spring into action.

Also, during our recent State Deputy Meeting, Mathew Kelly emphasized in his 2 minute Lenten Video on Day One "Find your sweet spot." "Put your sweet spot into action." Everyone has a "sweet spot" to serve the Lord. Use that sweet spot to influence another person to be a Knight of Columbus.

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge March 2019

So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. (Gospel for Mar. 31, Lk 15:20)

My Brother Knights, here we encounter upon some of the most stunningly beautiful words in the entire Gospel: the reunion of the prodigal son with his father. As Jesus describes the scene, I invite you to put yourself in three different sets of shoes. First, imagine that you are the father, seeing your own flesh and blood, your son, coming home. Second, imagine that you are the prodigal son, expecting the worst, but

finding that your father is moved with compassion. Third, imagine that you are the hard-working older brother, watching this reunion from a critical distance. Becoming the man we are, means that we can learn from all three: embracing others with the mercy of the father; running to our heavenly Father like the Prodigal and with the older brother, hearing the father's words spoken to us—that "all that I have is yours'."

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month I challenge you to be like the Prodigal Father by making the first move: take the first step toward another person in your life to encourage or forgive them. Secondly I challenge you to prayerfully write a list of things in your life for which you are grateful.



Supreme Director of Chaplain's Report

Awaiting the Redemption – Lent 2019 In his Message for Lent 2019, Pope Francis reminds us that our yearly journey of preparation in which we are conformed to Christ (Romans 8:29), is a "priceless gift of God's mercy."

Pope Francis reminds us of the threat sin and death pose to world: "When we fail to live as children of God, we often behave in a destructive way towards our neighbors and

other creatures — and ourselves as well — since we begin to think more or less consciously that we can use them as we will. Intemperance then takes the upper hand. ... The mentality expressed in the slogans 'I want it all and I want it now!' and 'Too much is never enough,' gains the upper hand."

As we help Brother Knights and their families strengthen their faith and pursue holiness, let us reflect with them on how we all can overcome the "rupture of communion with God" that sin effects, can check "the law of the strong over the weak" and the "unbridled pursuit of comfort," and can conquer "insatiable covetousness." Let us encourage our Brother Knights in their pursuit of fasting (which helps us, as Pope Francis says, to turn "from the temptation to 'devour' everything to satisfy our voracity and being ready to suffer for love, which can fill the emptiness of our hearts"), prayer ("which teaches us to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego, and to acknowledge our need of the Lord and his mercy") and almsgiving ("whereby we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves in the illusory belief that we can secure a future that does not belong to us").

Lent remains a time when many seek to return to the sacraments and regular practice of the faith. By taking the time to spiritually prepare and form the men of your Council, you are equipping them to become witnesses of faith and charity. This investment of your time will inspire Knights to reach out to other men during the Fish Frys, Stations of the Cross and Lenten charitable activities to those on the peripheries, ultimately helping others return to the sacramental practice of the faith.

May the promise which Lent holds for each of us deepen and renew our faith as we grow closer in conformity to Christ.

We are getting closer to having the funds to order the wheelchairs.

...a donation to help us reach the goal of \$15,000 so that we can order a container of 100 wheelchairs. Please consider a donation of \$70-100 so that we can reach this goal. If every Council donates this amount, we will have enough.

The State Deputy, Francis Mohr, has asked that we do this wheelchair project, together as a State Council, because it has not been done in Oregon before, and it is a highly visible activity that will be good PR for our order!

If we can raise the needed funds, we can order the chairs and have them delivered before the State Convention in late April. They can be distributed then to the delegates from the councils that have requested them. The rest can be available when a need comes up, statewide, for wheelchairs.

EACH wheelchair donation is a PR opportunity for the OREGON Knights of Columbus!

If 70 to 100 dollars is not in your Council's budget... think outside the box! Pass the hat at the meeting. Seek outside help, from friends, family, neighbors. Have a second collection at one or all Masses at a particular weekend. \$70-100 should be doable by every council. Maybe some can help more. If you can...



Yes, Brothers, I receive some emails that just have a photo and reads something like "the Grand Knight presented a special award last night!" HUH!!

So, I have to backtrack to the submitting Council and ask the 5W's. If you just remember to use this method, then it will cut down on my going back to the person sending material to me and have to discern what on earth are we talking about, what's the Grand Knight's name, was it your Council, where did it take place, maybe at the Council meeting, after a breakfast, in the church....where, where, where? The date of the activity can be important.





Also, please be careful not to scan in objects from local newspapers unless you have a release from the paper and state that in your submission. Be sure that the material you send me is not copyrighted. Check the page and make sure that at the bottom there is not a copyright notice. Sometimes they are in small print.

Through Thine intercession, win for us the grace, ever to exemplify in our public and private lives,


the virtues that should characterize those especially dedicated

As District Master, I would like to outstretch the reach beyond the walls of the church with our Fourth Degree duties and obligations. To show more Patriotism! To be more involved with our own community. I have reached out to the Chamber of Commerce in a couple of local areas and they would love to have members of the Knights of Columbus join them with some different activities.

The Police and Fire Departments can use our help in extending an Emergency Safety Program that is beneficial to the whole community. That old forgotten veteran who has been in a nursing home for years without anyone visiting him or her would appreciate a visit. The Food Bank might need help distributing food once a month. 
