

Supreme Chaplain's Message To All Knights Chaplains: Don't Be Content With the Disconnect BY SUPREME CHAPLAIN ARCHBISHOP WILLIAM LORI

I think I have some firsthand experience with the challenge that faces the Order (or any organization that has a home office that relates to a field that includes many far-flung and diverse jurisdictions). Put simply, there can be a disconnect between the home office and the field. You may have even heard that chancery offices can be disconnected from parishes and that parishes can be disconnected from their diocesan central services. To be sure, those who work in "central" can produce programs and then set expectations that are both unrealistic and unworkable—such is human nature! But sometimes parishes ignore or unenthusiastically implement diocesan programs even after they have been thoroughly vetted by the presbyterial Council, the pastoral Council and even focus groups.

The same thing can happen to K of C programs. Those at the home office can consult, field test and promote programs that are soundly rooted in the Church's mission and in the spirituality of the Order but we sometimes find that they are ignored or half-heartedly implemented by state jurisdictions and certainly in some of our local Councils.

The disconnect between the home office and the field is not unique to the Order. I trace its origins in the Church as far back as the Acts of the Apostles! Yet, we, as spiritual leaders and pastors of the Order, shouldn't be content with that.

Experience shows that while K of C programs need to be adapted to local situations, ignoring them or implementing them half-heartedly never bears good fruit. When Councils decide not to have anything to do, for example, with Faith In Action, or claim that it is beyond their ability to implement, and instead continue to do the same things in the same old way, they are probably sealing their own fate — they are headed toward extinction. Unless we stress faith formation, we won't attract that younger demographic. Younger men are looking for more than a "clubhouse experience." As a Brother Knight in Maryland told me, when our Councils and jurisdictions wholeheartedly embrace Faith In Action, growing membership is not a problem; young men and families want to take part. ... Driven by zeal for souls, they were looking for ways to light the fire of the Gospel in the hearts of those they served and we, as chaplains, should have no less zeal in our hearts for those we serve.

Another area is faith formation. The Order offers a plethora of resources for faith formation. As chaplains, you and I play a big role in helping our Brother Knights and families, many of whom did not receive sound catechesis, to grow in their knowledge and love of the faith so that they can hand it on to their children and bear witness to it in daily life. ... Thank you most sincerely for your service to the Order. Through the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe and Father McGivney, I pray that the Lord will bless you in your service to his people.

KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS





Effective September 1, 2019, Oregon's Jesse Villarreal was promoted to the position of Vice Supreme Master.

"For Personal Use only" or "For me to know and you to find out"

Jesse Villarreal Vice Supreme Master Patti and I returned from the 137th Supreme Convention in Minneapolis, Minnesota, in the early part of August. We were so full of joy and enthusiasm from all the encouragement we saw and positive sounds we heard from over two thousand members of the Knights of Columbus from all over the world. You can't help but to rejoice and give thanks for all the accomplishments that are expressed by everyone.

How blessed would you feel by seeing an endless procession of clergy at one time in one place? A mixture of Reverent Priests, Monsignors, Bishops, Archbishops and Cardinals? I think Father McGivney would be smiling too.

The major highlight of the trip, beside my participating with the Honor Guard of the Supreme Convention, took place on Thursday evening when Supreme Knight Carl Anderson and Supreme Master of the Fourth Degree Dennis Stoddard announced my assignment as the Vice Supreme Master for the Province of Archbishop Francis N. Blanchet here in the Northwest. There are 17 Provinces in the United States. Our province covers Oregon, Washington and Idaho. We now have 368,366 Fourth Degree Sir Knights. Over 4,200 Sir Knights were initiated into the Fourth Degree last year with 44 new Assemblies that were added for a total of 3,497 Assemblies.

You can hear and see the level of CHEERS of JOY that is being shared by everyone. From the individual rooms, in the hallways, on the elevators, lobbies and in the main convention floor and the loudest cheers come from the different "Hospitality Rooms". The number of Fraternal Awards is overwhelming. Over ten different jurisdictions recruited over 10,000 new members each, with one of these recruiting 28,252!!!! They were placing orders for more Form 100's. What an honor it is to be with members with such positive attitudes. Their enthusiasm and encouragement should be contagious.

One of the bigger awards went to 28 Jurisdictions who met or exceeded their goals in New Council Development. New Council development and Council reactivation are the foundation of the Order's growth.

How many times have we heard at District and Assembly Training Meetings, at State Conventions, and other sorts of gatherings that we would like to have "one Council at every parish"?

O.K.—we are back home in Oregon now and learn we have over 150 parishes just in the Portland Diocese, not including the Baker Diocese? But we only have 90 Councils? How many of those are Active and how many need reactivation? Brothers we have our work cut out for all of us. All of us promised, during our first initiation into the Order of Knights of Columbus, as we promised UNITY, we promised CHARITY, we promised FRATERNATY, and we promised PATROTISM!

Our new State Deputy Ron Boyce chose the design of the state pin for Oregon to shown the emblem of the Knights of Columbus guarded by Our Lady of Guadalupe with the words, "BE NOT AFRAID". So why are we afraid and what are we afraid of? Why are we still sitting on our hands asking, what can I do?

Here is what we can and should do! We should all stand up, join our STRENGTH and our ENTHUSIASM and practice what we had promised. Yes, it begins with each and every one of us. District Deputy 14 Report

In addition to being DD for 14, I am also a trustee for Council 2325, in Oregon City and Faithful Pilot for Assembly 2251. I am a member of the Bible Study Presentation team and serve as a group Facilitator weekly on Wednesday nights. In our 23 years of doing Bible Study, St John the Apostle Parish has had over 100 parishioners attending three days a week. We are doing the 66 Chapters of Isaiah from September 2019 to May 2020. I am also an RCIA instructor, having served in teaching RCIA, RCIC, Religious ED (formerly CCD) over 40 years in three different parishes. I also serve as a Hospitality Minister before Mass (greeter) and work with other ministries besides the Knights in hosting Coffee and Donuts on Sunday mornings



four - six times a parish year. As a member of Parishioners Without Partners (PWOPs), which is a ministry for widowed, widower, divorced or single Catholic men and women, I organized three excursions for our members in August going to the Clackamas County Fair and Rodeo, the Huckleberry Festival in Rhododendron, Oregon and visiting the Swan Island Dahlia Festival in Canby. In September I participated in the "LOVE SAVES LIVES 2019" Walk for Life, which supports the Hope 360 Pregnancy Clinic. This is an event I have participated in the last four years. It was held September 7th.

I also keep busy as a member of an Exodus 90 fraternity at St. John's which began in Feb 2019. It is an ascetic program for Catholic men which meets once a week and has prayer, exercises and varied ascetic practices for each of our nine members. I also attend Holy League at St John's, a parish men's group which meets the First Saturday of every month from 7:30 to 9:30 PM. Also, as a member of the parish Adoration Society, I have the 8:30 to 10:00 am shift every First Friday, following morning Mass.

Supporting Magdalene Home - Medford Oregon

"There is no room for me ... "

These were the words spoken by a pregnant teenager, who found herself alone with no place to live. Moved by this teenager's plight, early in 2001, a group of local citizens (including then Fr Liam Cary now Bishop Cary) began discussing the possible need for a facility in Medford to help pregnant and parenting teens who had no safe place to live. It had been reported that in Jackson County there were more than 150 underage girls in this situation.

Our home, Magdalene Home in Medford, is staffed on a 24/7 basis by housemothers who provide guidance, supervision and encouragement to the young mothers as they learn how to succeed in their daily lives.

The support for Magdalen Home is on-going, so Knights of Columbus Councils 1594 (Medford) and 11258 (Central Point) teamed up with their 2019 Baby Bottle Boomerang Program. Parishioners from Shepherd of the Valley in Central Point have provided \$5,000 and those from Sacred Heart in Medford provided over \$11,000. These funds will provide immediate help with payroll and mainly with remodeling projects of the home.


Oregon Knights of Columbus History Past State Deputies

Dr. Benjamin Louis Norden 1st State Deputy of Oregon 1908-1910

Benjamin Louis Norden was the only son of Benjamin and Mary and born in 1879 in Portland, OR. He was qualified both in Law and in Medicine. Dr. Norden was intern and house surgeon at St. Vincent's hospital in 1907 and 1908, and took post-graduate work at the New York Post-Graduate hospital and Polyclinic hospital. He won a law degree in 1915. He was elected coroner in 1908 and again in 1910. During World War I he was a surgeon in the navy aboard the U. S. S. South Dakota. After the armistice, he served on the U. S. S. Aeolus, in the transport service between Virginia and France. In 1921 he returned to Portland, and private practice. He was the local coroner. Unlike his father who was an active Democrat, Ben Junior was a Republican. Dr. Norden never married and made his home with his sister, Frances Norden, at 2134 N.W. Flanders Street.

He was a member of the Multnomah medical society, Knights of Columbus, Elks, Royal Arcanum, Multnomah post, American Legion, and Alpha Kappa Kappa medical fraternity. Dr. Norden was the third Grand Knight of the Portland Council #678 from 1906-1907. He became Territorial Deputy with the advent of the Order into Oregon, June 15, 1902 and served in until the establishment of the State Council, May 11, 1909 when he was elected 1st State Deputy at the First State Convention at the K of C Club room at the Portland Council #678. He gave a brief but enthusiastic speech thanking the four attending Councils of Portland, Baker City, Astoria and Coos Bay. Under Dr. Norden's administration, the order made rapid progress and advanced to a strong position, having secured the membership of a long list of the most prominent Catholic men in Oregon.

Dr. Norden continued to work within two weeks of his death when he died at the home of his sister Frances of acute coronary thrombosis. Dr. Ben L. Norden died October 19, 1951 at the age of 72. He is buried at the River View Cemetery in Portland, OR. Apparently the name Norden, in Oregon, died with him.

Additional Oregon Knights of Columbus History

"I am well aware of the fact that I have sometimes been criticized for refusing to go into some of the smaller towns in the state and organize Councils, dependent for their membership, for the greater part, upon men living in the surrounding country districts, but I believe that our experience has proved that my policy in this regard was far better than to pursue the promiscuous formation of isolated Councils only to see them fail and dissolve in a few short years. Let me express the hope that under the guidance of Divine Providence the Knights of Columbus in Oregon will continue to grow and prosper and that the coming year will see the organization of Councils."

Quote by Ben L Norden - May 10, 1910, at the 2nd State Convention, Portland, OR.



In January 1905, four masked bandits, heavily armed, boarded the Oregon RR, Spokane Flyer train in Portland, OR and waited until the train was under way. They then entered the smoking compartment at the rear of the train and held up and robbed six passengers at gun point. They then forced the Pullman conductor at gun point to stop the train and made their escape. One of the passengers robbed was Roger B. Sinnott (2nd Oregon State Deputy) with his back against the wall. "I'll help you find all I've got without your tearing the buttons off my vest", Sinnott cried.

After the robbers took what Sinnott had they turned to the next passenger who happened to be Ben L Norden (1st Oregon State Deputy). Norden had a diamond pin in his tie which the robbers tried to take. "Don't take that, old man," pleaded Norden, "my mother gave me that, and she is gone now." The robbers let Norden keep the pin but took his gold pocket watch instead.

It is not clear if the two were headed to a Knights' event, or if it was just a coincidence they were on the same train. There was a reward posted for the capture of the bandits, but they were never caught.

Parade of Past State Deputies

Roger Brass Sinnott 2st State Deputy of Oregon 1910-1912



BOGER B. SINNOTT

Roger B Sinnott was the son of Colonel Nicholas B Sinnott and Mary Brass, born July 15, 1872 in The Dalles, OR. Colonel Nicholas B Sinnott was born in Ireland and was the owner of the Umatilla House in The Dalles, OR, a luxury hotel, overlooking the Columbia River. It was called "the best hotel west of Minneapolis and north of San Francisco". Colonel Sinnott eventually became Chief U.S. Deputy Marshal, in Portland, OR.

Roger attended University of Notre Dame from 1890-1894. Roger shared the starting fullback position on the 1893 Notre Dame football team, with John Studebaker (son of the President of Studebaker Motors). Roger's older brother, Nicholas, 1892 ND valedictorian, became a prominent 8-term Republican U.S. Congressman and Federal Judge.

On October 12, 1899, Roger married **Gertrude L. "Gussie" Lownsdale (pictured at right)** in Salem, OR. There are no records to show that they had any children.



In 1908, Roger sought the Republican nomination for District Attorney of Portland, OR, and was a well known Portland attorney for the final 20 years of his life.

Roger was the fourth Grand Knight of the Portland Council #678 from 1907-1908. Roger Sinnott was elected 2nd State Deputy of Oregon on May 10, 1910 and served until July 1, 1912, during which period he traveled the state spreading the knowledge of our Order. During his term the State gained five new Councils, which brought the total in 1912 to ten and gained 400 new members. Also, with the Knights at the forefront, Columbus Day became a State Holiday.

"The crowning glory of our work for the year just past and for which I feel justly proud, and the co-operation and assistance of you delegates and members of your different Councils, I wish to thank you, was the establishment of Columbus Day by the last Legislature of our State and its approval by our Government." Roger B Sinnott - 1911 State Convention, Astoria, OR.

On March 16, 1920, at the age of 48, Roger Brass Sinnott, died suddenly. Death was so unexpected that his wife, Gertrude, demanded an autopsy believing that he was poisoned. The coroner concluded he could find any evidence of poison and believed he died of a heart attack. The Knights of Columbus arranged for his funeral at St. Mary's Cathedral.

Roger is buried at Saint Peters Parish Center Cemetery in The Dalles, OR.

Gertrude never remarried and died in 1966 at the age of 89.
