Nicole, as well as their eight children — Isabel (18), Caledon (17), Maximilian (13), Lucianna (12), Gabrielle (9), Theodore (5), Benedict (3) and Emilia (1) — are parishioners of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, commonly known as St. Mary's.

"The Knights have really shown me an excellent path, for not only self-improvement, but for different ways I can show the family on how to be better Christians for myself and how to be a better man," said Joe Krebs.

Since moving to the Albany area, the family has become a staple in the parish community. They are leaders and workers at several parish events such as the Shrove Tuesday Festival, Easter Egg Hunt, Summer Festival and Stations of the Cross. 

Stewardship Into Action

This summer the Knights of Columbus have been putting **Stewardship at St Pius into Action** in several visible ways. It is one way of saying we believe in the Parish and want to support it as best as we can.

Our first major project was remodeling the apartment below the Parish Office in less than 5 weeks. The Knights spent over 500 hours of labor working on making this apartment a pleasurable place for Father Rick and any future Parochial Vicars to stay. This will save the Parish over \$24,000 a year in rent and utilities.

The second project is rebuilding the stairs and ramp into the Youth Center. These rugged stairs are now safer to climb for everyone with the installation of new stair treads, railings and a repaired ramp. The Knights again placed over 90 hours in this project and picked up the \$850 cost for the rebuild.

The third project so far this year is getting the ice maker in the Community Center repaired. Again the Knights arranged for the repair and picked up the tab for over \$400.

These are just examples of how the Knights are putting **Stewardship Into Action** just this summer.



How can you as an individual put Stewardship Into Action? There are many ways you can but here are a few easy ones. The first one is to support events sponsored by the Knights because a majority of the money goes back into the Parish.

Another easy way is to be the eyes around the campus to let the Parish Office know if you see anything broken or in need of upkeep. <u>Better yet if you have a skill set that can be used in the Parish please let someone know; it saves all of us time and potentially money.</u>

Supreme Chaplain's Message To All Knights

We have to change the culture of the Order such that in every Council, every District, every state, every program, every activity and every decision the spirituality of men is uppermost in all that is said and done in the name of the Order. We are aiming at a profound change that will make us true to who we are and at the same time responsive to the world's pastoral needs.

There are lots of rules of thumb for culture change, many of you know them, and they are easily found on the internet, but for our purposes, I would suggest six things: 1. It's critical to work on your own spiritual life, your own life of prayer, your own conversion from sin, a renewal in virtue, a searching examination of one's own humanity as the basis for one's encounter with Christ, one's service and leadership. 2. Culture change is never effected by just one person no matter how great a leader he may be. It requires a team effort. ... If we are to change the culture you

will have to build a team that is committed for the long haul, over the administration of successive state deputies, to making the Knights, in the spirit of Father McGivney, responsive to the spiritual searching and aspirations of those men who rightfully should be members of the Order.

This means getting your team together for prayer, for retreat, for adoration. It means talking about these matters in a totally fraternal manner. Of course you have to talk about the practicalities, but in fact nothing is more practical than praying about and discussing what is most basic to our lives, to our Church and to the Order. 3. Tap into the spiritual heritage Father McGivney left us, namely, the spirituality of our three principles: charity, fraternity and unity, coupled with love of country. Sometimes, I fear, the principles are regarded as three great ideas that find their way into our degree ceremonies and our rhetoric. But in fact, if you study them closely, you will find that they are an ingenious summary of the Gospel we hope to spread. We can't take it for granted that everyone see this or that everyone understands the principles or even knows what they are. It's not that they haven't been proclaimed, explained and exemplified. They surely have! But have we done so in a way that prompts men to say, "That's for me! That's what I've been looking for! That's how I want to live!"? Fidelity to who we are as Knights is the way forward. 4. Someone once said that integrity is choosing courage over comfort and surely that the choice of comfort over courage is at the heart of the crisis that is currently besetting the Church. Integrity is an essential element in healthy culture change. A leader who does not have integrity can change the culture all right, but he will change it for the worse or maybe even deform it. Integrity means conducting your office and that of your team according to the highest ethical standards and having the courage to make changes where those standards are breached. It also means having the courage to say what needs to be said when complacency and even laziness are the order of the day. Integrity takes us and our brother Knights beyond our comfort zone. Changing the way our meetings are conducted, getting a club-like Council to open up, speaking with prospective members, putting faith and holiness at the forefront as we engage in charity — all this is critical to culture change done with integrity. 5. Father McGivney created the Knights as a lay organization. The laity are in fact the primary agents in the new evangelization. That said, you need good chaplains. ... Priests who will challenge us to become missionary disciples, who will open doors for us, the doors of Scripture and the sacraments, the doors of our parishes and dioceses, the doors of hospitality for those men who need to come in and join us in our journey of faith. 6. When your state team and your district team and your Council leadership see the Knights as a way for themselves and their fellow men to grow in their faith, to grow in holiness, to spread the Gospel, then the programs and services offered by the Knights will be well-received, especially Faith In Action. These programs won't seem to come out of the blue, but they will be seen rather as ways of helping the Order, from top to bottom, to be an agent of evangelization and a means for men to grow in holiness. This doesn't mean there won't be glitches or a need for adjustments, only that a oneness in purpose and mission will help make these programs and initiatives bear the good fruit of the Gospel.

Reasons for Hope

We are at a crossroads, brothers, and a lot is riding on what happens — not in some misty future, but now and in the immediate future. In a word, the pressure is on. What I have identified today is more ambitious than any goal or program. But I do not hesitate to lay out the case for culture change based on the Church's mission of evangelization and the identity of the Order. I do not hesitate because I stand with you as men who are filled not only with faith but also hope, who keep our eyes fixed on the *Risen Lord and are open to the Holy* Spirit, men in whom the Lord Jesus himself can speak, act, change and transform. To him be the glory, power and dominion, now and forever!

Here is what we have in the Wheelchair Fund (in Oregon KofC Charities): \$9168. We also have (according to my records) 7 Councils who have pledged for 14 chairs but have not sent in their \$\$\$. If you add that amount to the fund (14 X \$150 per chair) = \$2100. That would give us a total of..... \$11268 We need a minimum of \$15,000 to order the container of 100 wheelchairs.

So, we need \$3732 to get these chairs ordered. The encouraging thing is that while only 31 Councils have contributed, we are getting closer. Does that mean that over 60 Councils have not? If that is the case, if each of those Councils contributed \$60, we would have enough. SIXTY BUCKS PER COUNCIL!

Please, if you have yet to contribute to this fund, please do it soon so we can get these wheelchairs ordered and distributed to those who want and need them!

Note: Leaving one or more of the Council Director roles vacant Does Not exempt a Council from safe environment requirements.

If the training is not completed within the 30 days, the Knight will not be recognized by Supreme in their Director's role. The purpose of the training is for Brother Knights serving in key leadership roles to safeguard children and other vulnerable persons by recognizing the signs of possible abuse.

This is part of the Columbian Award so if not completed by all four positions of your Council your Columbian Award will not count, hence your Council will not gain Star. The training is easy and not time consuming and good for three years.

CONGRATULATIONS to Our Lady of the Dunes and Molalla Councils to be the first two Councils to be in full compliance: Hurray!!

A few Councils have one or two more trainings to complete to be in full compliance. A few Councils are missing one role.

Let us all work together to reach **100%** compliance of all Councils soon so we can concentrate on membership and programs.

My term as Oregon District Master for the Fourth Degree that <u>began</u> on September 1st, 2018 will end on August 31st, 2019. My new assignment as Vice Supreme Master of the Archbishop

Blanchet Province covering Washington, Idaho and Oregon will <u>begin</u> in September 1st, 2019. I'm excited and nervous with this giant step forward with the Knights of Columbus. It's not going to be easy to fill the shoes of the previous Vice Supreme Master Chuck Davlin from Idaho, so I'm asking for your prayers and support from the very <u>beginning</u> to the <u>end</u> of the two year term. May the Holy Spirit be with us to guide and protect us all along the way.

The joy and excitement and happiness that most <u>"beginnings"</u> have is probably compared with the same level of "sadness" that comes when something we like and love <u>ends</u>? That's the ALPHA and the OMEGA. That's life! We all have a beginning and we all have an end! It's a pretty sure bet to say that each one of us with a beginning will have an end. So enjoy the "between time" while you have it, don't waste your time and energy looking for the end. Don't hurry, it will come.

Some Sir Knight Brothers are sadly troubled with the end of the Fourth Degree Regalia that had the colored cape and chapeau. I enjoyed it too when participating with my Brother Sir Knights of the Honor Guard in special events that required Regalia.

I was not at New Haven, Connecticut when the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus was first considered back in 1899. I supposed the first members who purchased their "uniforms" were happy to wear the black Prince Albert coat, black trousers, black soft felt top hat, with an ostrich feather encircling the crown, similar to that worn by Columbus. Can you imagine what that would look like today? At that time a complete uniform, as proposed, could not be purchased for much less than \$100 dollars.

That beginning ended forty (40) years later when it was replaced by the recent Regalia consisting of a black tuxedo with a reverse satin colored cape and chapeau with an ostrich feather.

Now, almost eighty (80) years later we have a new beginning for the Fourth Degree Honor/Color Corp members to wear. We are being introduced to a new Official Uniform. I ask myself, why all these changes and so often? Maybe the next change will come in one hundred and sixty (160) years? Got it, 40.....80.....160...?

The Official Dress Uniform began almost two years ago consisting of a Navy Blue Blazer with the Fourth Degree Emblem Blazer Crest. Official Fourth Degree gray trousers (no cuff). Knights of Columbus Emblem of the Order Black Beret with Fourth Degree metal badge over appropriate colored patch of the office, plain white dress shirt button cuff, (no button down collar) black socks and plain black shoes, official Fourth Degree Lapel Pin (PG-113, incumbent Medal of Office, Past and Former miniature Medals above the left pocket.

Some of the Fourth Degree members with the new uniform have said they are happy they don't have to carry the extra carrying case and garment bag for the cape and chapeau and that the uniform is more versatile because it's not as formal as the tuxedo. The new uniform fabric is of very good quality. It is very sturdy and wrinkle resistant. I love to hear people say how nice it looks; I act like I didn't hear them and have them repeat it!

One thing that continues to sadden me is when I hear some elderly members who were in the Honor Guard and some that I have never seen participating with the Honor Guard, say they would never wear the new uniform, that they didn't like it and would rather quit the Fourth Degree? I had hoped to convince more brother Sir Knights that being part of the

Fourth Degree was like making things WHOLE from beginning to end. A complete Patriotic, a true Catholic, and a proud American gentleman.

To be a Fourth Degree member is an HONOR, being in the Honor/Color Guard is a PRIVILEGE, not an OBLIGATION.

I wish we would give more value to the phrase, "IT'S NOT WHAT WE WEAR, IT'S WHAT WE DO ".

So Faithful and Worthy Sir Knights let's be the LIGHT of our church. Let's be grateful to all those who gave their lives for All our new Beginnings, the ALPHAS, we enjoy today. Do not waste yourself looking for the end, the OMEGA. Do not allow yourselves to be discouraged or misled by false witness.






Knights In Action


Past Supreme Convention and Oregon

There have been 59 State Deputies, including our current State Deputy, Ron Boyce, since 1908 when Oregon was first established as a State Council. Two have served two nonconsecutive terms (Patrick J. Hanley 1922-1925 and 1927) (Patrick L. Rice 2011-2013 and 2014). Two were father and son (Frank Lonergan 1917-1920; son C. P. A. "Pat" Lonergan (1929-1932). Editor's note: Historical information about the tilma

Here are four literally awesome facts about the tilma of Our Lady of Guadalupe

1. It has qualities that are humanly impossible to replicate.

Made primarily of cactus fibers, a *tilma* was typically of very poor quality and had a rough surface, making it difficult enough to wear, much less to paint a lasting image on it. Nevertheless, the image remains, and scientists who have studied the image insist there was no technique used beforehand to treat the surface. The surface bearing the image is reportedly like silk to the touch, while the unused portion of the *tilma* remains coarse. What's more, experts in infrared photography, studying the *tilma* in the late 1970s, determined that there were no brush strokes, as if the image was slapped onto the surface all at once. Phillip Callahan, a biophysicist at the University of Florida, discovered that the differences in texture and coloration that cause cause Our Lady's skin to look different up close and far away is impossible to recreate: This, along with an iridescent quality of slightly changing colors depending on the angle at which a person looks, and the fact that the coloration in the image was determined to have no animal or mineral elements, and synthetic colorings didn't exist in 1531, provide a lot of seemingly unanswerable questions.

2. People say it's just a painting, yet the tilma has outlived them all, in time and in quality.

One of the first things skeptics say about the image is that it somehow has to be a forgery or a fraud. Yet in every attempt to replicate the image, while the original never seems to fade, the duplicates have deteriorated over a short time. Miguel Cabrera, an artist in the mid-18th century who produced three of the best known copies - one for the archbishop, one for the pope, one for himself for later copies - once wrote about the difficulty of recreating the image even on the best surfaces: Adolfo Orozco, a physicist at the National University of Mexico, spoke in 2009 about the remarkable preservation of the *tilma* compared to its numerous copies. One copy that was created in 1789 was painted on a similar surface with the best techniques available at the time, then encased in glass and stored next to the actual *tilma*. It looked beautiful when painted, but not eight years passed before the hot and humid climate of Mexico caused the duplicate to fade and fray. It was discarded. However, Orozco said, no scientific explanation is possible for the fact that, "the original *tilma* was exposed for approximately 116 years without any kind of protection, receiving all the infrared and ultraviolet radiation from the tens of thousands of candles near it and exposed to the humid and salty air around the temple."

3. The tilma has shown characteristics startlingly like a living human body.

In 1979, when Callahan, the Florida biophysicist, was analyzing the *tilma* using infrared technology, he apparently also discovered that the *tilma* maintains a constant temperature of 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit, the same as that of a living person. When Carlos Fernandez del Castillo, a Mexican gynecologist, examined the *tilma*, he first noticed a four-petaled flower over what was Mary's womb. The flower, called the *Nahui Ollin* by the Aztecs, was a symbol of the sun and a symbol of plenitude. Upon further examination, Castillo concluded that the dimensions of Our Lady's body in the image were that of an expectant mother due quite soon. Dec. 9, the day of the unveiling, is barely two weeks from Christmas. One of the most common attributions and reported discoveries lie with the Virgin's eyes in the image. When Jose Aste Tonsmann, a Peruvian ophthalmologist, conducted a study, one of his tests involved examining the eyes on the *tilma* at 2,500 times magnification. With the images of the magnified eyes, the scientist was reportedly able to identify as many as 13 individuals in both eyes at different proportions, just as the human eye would reflect an image. It appeared to be a snapshot of the very moment Juan Diego unfurled the *tilma* before the archbishop.

4. It appears to be virtually indestructible.

Over the centuries, two separate events had the potential to harm the *tilma*, one in 1785 and one in 1921. In 1785, a worker was cleaning the glass encasement of the image when he accidentally spilled strong nitric acid solvent onto a large portion of the image itself. The image and the rest of the *tilma*, which should have been eaten away almost instantly by the spill, reportedly became self-restored over the next 30 days, and it remains unscathed to this day, aside from small stains on the parts not bearing the image.

In 1921, an anti-clerical activist hid a bomb containing 29 sticks of dynamite in a pot of roses and placed it before the image inside the Basilica at Guadalupe. When the bomb exploded, the marble altar rail and windows 150 feet shattered. A brass crucifix was twisted and bent out of shape. But the *tilma* and its glass case remained fully intact.

DD06 in Action


DD06 Richard Bielenberg provided a recap and photos of his current trip to the Netherlands/Holland.

We have toured many other towns and Churches including St. Nicholas.










We saw an old abbey which had been ruined in the French Revolution.
