

Think about the other Grand Knights who will come after you. That plaque will give them some incentive, something to strive for, the mark of greatness. Future teams of Council Officers can look at that **STAR Council** award and say—if they could do it, so could we!

Don't forget that your Council needs **2 Fraternal Benefit** Nights. These are easier now than they have ever been. And please, don't forget the paperwork. It would be a tragedy to do all the work, and miss out because you did not complete one small, required form. **Submit the SP-7 in May!**


Keep going! Keep working! STAR Council is everybody's legacy!

Do you really think of Mary as your mother? How can you better seek out her help — as a mother — in all your needs and problems? Do you understand the power of the rosary and seek to honor your mother's request to pray it regularly?

In his apostolic letter on St. Joseph, <u>Patris Corde</u>, Pope Francis highlights a key facet of fatherly virtue exhibited by the adoptive father of our Lord Jesus Christ: his trust that God the Father will always find a way. Our Holy Father reminds all men to look to the example of St. Joseph amid the challenges and difficulties of life, and to engage reality with creative courage "by trusting in divine providence."

Pope Francis states that God himself trusted St. Joseph to act as guardian. "If at times God seems not to help us, surely this does not mean that we have been abandoned, but instead are being trusted to plan, to be creative, and to find solutions ourselves" (5). He then goes on reiterate the example of St. Joseph we must follow: "Every poor, needy, suffering or dying person, every stranger, every prisoner, every infirm person is 'the child' whom Joseph continues to protect... The Church cannot fail to show a special love for the least of our brothers and sisters, for Jesus showed a particular concern for them and personally identified with them. From St. Joseph, we must learn that same care and responsibility. We must learn to love the child and his mother, to love the sacraments and charity, to love the Church and the poor. Each of these realities is always the child and his mother" (ibid).

The month of May, which is dedicated to the Blessed Mother as well as the traditional time of first Holy Communion celebrations, is an opportune time for our Councils to be especially attentive to Our Lady and the Lord Jesus present in the Most Holy Eucharist. Knights continue to carry the rosary in their pockets daily and are exhorted to pray the rosary often. The Feast of Our Lady of Fatima (May 13) reminds us of the need to particularly pray for an end to the war in Ukraine. The feast of Mexican Martyrs (May 21) includes six Knights of Columbus priests who were killed because of their defense of the faith and the Blessed Sacrament — this is another moment for our Brother Knights to rededicate themselves as Knights of the Eucharist. May St. Joseph, Guardian of the Church, be a model for all of us to imitate.

Safe Environment

In the thirty days since the last newsletter, two more Councils have become S/E compliant. On behalf of the State Deputy and myself, thank you for standing up and achieving this very important goal. However, the job is not done. Our jurisdiction needs many more Councils to cross the finish line before June 10th. The ball is in

your court. The success of our jurisdiction is in your hands. It is your willingness to comply. No-one else, no District Deputy or State Officer can be held accountable, if they have attempted to have you comply, with your brother Councils and your Council has put the S/E program off. Please contact the Office of Youth Protection (OYP) at Supreme. Call Supreme before 1:30 PM Pacific time. Their number is 203-752-4000. Ask for OYP. They can assist your Council to "make it across the finish line". Have the names and the member numbers of three Knights who have a computer and OYP will assign you passwords. Then call us, the state team, at my number at the end of this letter, and we can and will come to you and help you get this done.

Vocations

At our Annual Convention, just completed two weeks ago, an announcement was made to the convention floor, asking for immediate seminarian assistance. Three Councils within minutes came forward and pledged to sponsor two seminarians each. I would like to recognize, in order, the following Knights and Councils for their magnificent generosity and deep commitment of generosity to our seminarians. Chris Erno, Central Point, Ipo Ross, Klamath Falls and Francis Gilligan, The Dalles. Two days ago on May 1st, we were contacted again and asked to provide, if possible, additional support of a late to ask group of seminarians at Mt. Angel. Our State Executive Secretary, Pat Rice put out a statewide letter for us on the evening of May 2nd. This morning, May 3rd, Brother Keith Blau of Sherwood and Sean Fornelli of Salem and Bob Kampmann of Dallas, which is my home Council, responded, and each of their Councils pledged support for one of those additional seminarians. Two requests remain to be filled and we hope that support will be with us shortly for them. We would like to send a reminder to all our Councils who could not attend this year's proceedings, that you still have time to send in your donation before the program ends for this Fraternal Year. Please discuss this at your next Council general business meeting and see if you might be able to fulfill a donation.

You have until the end of June to mail a check to our State Treasurer, Bob Adams*. His mailing address is below to assist you.

Again, it was wonderful to see all of you who were able to attend this year's Convention and we look forward to seeing all of you again in Newport next May 3-5,2024.

Let us finish this year with a final push and to begin anew in July.

I sent an additional email earlier which is worth repeating: At our recent convention, an announcement was made about getting financial aid for our seminarians at Mt. Angel, as soon as possible. In alphabetical order, Councils from Central Point, Klamath Falls and The Dalles, immediately came forward and pledged their support for two seminarians each. Magnificent work by those Councils, they picked up six of the eleven requesting seminarians.

Therefore, we still have a need to support if we can five additional seminarians. These young men will be leaving soon for their summer assignments or studies. If you can make a gift, it will reach the seminarian through the office of Monsignor Betschart.

Sometimes, during our Fraternal Year, we find that time is not on our side. A few days ago, our State Executive Secretary sent out a letter explaining the urgency of the need for our Councils to provide, if possible immediate aid through the RSVP program for our seminarians. The need was greater than expected. Thirteen (13) requests have come to us in just a few days. We have managed to process and send off to our Councils ten (10) of those requests. We still need three (3) more Councils to help fulfil the requests that are left.

Please, ask your Brothers and see what you can manage. Even if you can't provide the full RSVP funding of \$500, see if a lesser amount might be manageable.

We are ready to send you the fact sheet with the seminarians information immediately.

Please contact me as soon as possible if your Council or Assembly can aid these men through our RSVP program. I will immediately send you the fact sheet. Call me or text me at my number below or go to my email.

Council In Action

SWEET HOME — A spaghetti feed fundraiser Sunday evening sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council 8624, the St. Helen's Catholic Church Women's Club and the American Heritage Girls generated more than \$3,100 which will be donated to the Fir Lawn Lutheran Church rebuilding fund.

Between 175 and 200 dinners were served and donations were greatly appreciated. The church was the victim of arson a few months ago and parishioners have been holding services at the Methodist Church. The fundraiser was held on Divine Mercy Sunday, a day of forgiveness and mercy for Catholics. Kathy Ives and Gilbert Bures cooked 20 pounds of spaghetti — filling a five-gallon bucket. Council 8624 Grand Knight Alex Paul pre-cooked and seasoned 23 pounds of hamburger and Italian sausage and that was simmered into six gallons of spaghetti sauce.

Dinner included fresh garden salad served by Leo Fernandez, Damian Aranda and Leo Singler, buttery garlic Texas toast grilled by Kyle Sullens and tables filled with desserts prepared by the Women's Club. The American Heritage Girls served sodas and cleared tables.

"We could not have been happier," Paul said. "Since we didn't sell tickets, we really didn't know whether we would have 25 people or 250 people show up. The church hall was full and there was terrific fellowship among members of St. Helen's, the Methodist Church and Fir Lawn Lutheran. People were extremely generous and we had several donations from people who could not attend, but wanted to help. We are sure the donation will be put to good use."

And, Paul added, "We didn't run out of food, which was a blessing."









Fourth Degree In Action

Here are photos from my visit to the Maronite Monastery in Castle Rock Washington on April 29th with Ed Andolino, Faithful Navigator of Assembly 2251 (also past GK 9257) and with Mike Dec, current DD 14 (and past GK 2325).

We presented chalices on behalf of two deceased members of our Assembly to two new priests of the Maronite Cloistered Monastery. Both priests are members of the Knights of Columbus, one from Council 2325 in Oregon City and the other from a Council in Rapid City, South Dakota. We were informed of their ordination in December but it took us all this time to procure the two chalices (and patens) and then make arrangements to go up to Castle Rock. Their Abbot, Abbeti Jonathan Decker, was the former pastor of St Sharbel's Maronite Church in Portland Oregon. We attended a Maronite Mass at 8 a.m. and presented the chalices after the Mass. The Easter Bunny made an appearance, which delighted the little ones, like Hannah Silbernagel in bottom picture.







Life Program Report

Greetings Brother Knights!

First, I want to take this opportunity to thank Worthy State Deputy Ray Prom for his excellent service and leadership and congratulations to our newly elected Worthy State Deputy, Kenneth Anderson for Fraternal Year 2023-2024. Our State Convention 2023 was a great success and I hope many of you were able to attend. This Convention was inspiring, we had a good time, and it was a wonderful opportunity to meet many of you.

As all of you already know, we have our challenges here in Oregon as we witness our state unleashing its fury in response to the over-turning of Roe-v-Wade. The Columbian Newsletter - April Life Report, focused on the Oregon House Bill 2002 which is one of the most disgraceful bills ever proposed in our state or country. I am also sorry to report that the Oregon House of Representatives just passed House Bill 2002, which radically expands and memorializes abortion in Oregon. Many Pro-life Representatives raised numerous unanswered questions that remain unanswered due to the rushed nature of the legislative process. Supporters of HB 2002 repeatedly rejected motions to return the bill to policy committees to resolve the concerns that were identified. This is a very sad chapter for our state of Oregon. Brothers, regardless of this outcome, we can never allow these evil forces to deter us. As men of Christ, we will never stop defending our Lord's Church and His Children, our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our Lord will never abandon us.

As a follow-up to the Convention report, I would like to provide a quick review of life program activities for Fraternal Year 2022-2023. There are 96 Knights of Columbus Councils in Oregon; however, only 17 Councils submitted life reports. We know many Councils are doing life activities. Councils, please remember to submit your monthly life reports! Below is a summary of life program areas that were reported this past Fraternal Year:

- 43 Reports indicated pro-life rally or vigil at abortion site
- **31** Reports indicated PRC support
- 31 Reports indicated pro-life rosary prayer group
- 23 Reports indicated installation of a pro-life bulletin board
- 15 Reports indicated publishing of a pro-life article in a newspaper
- 14 Reports indicated the baptism pin program
- 5 Reports indicated installation of ultrasound
- **5** Reports indicated participation in a 9-day novena for life
- 2 Reports each for Refugee Relief, Special Olympics, Silver Rose, and installation of Memorial
- **0** Reports each for March for Life >100 or Mass for people with special needs.

The Knights of Columbus Life Program actually has 14 separate program areas. The pie chart shown on the next page breaks out those reporting areas by percentages. It gives us an idea which program areas Oregon Councils focused on. The greatest number of reports indicated participating in a pro-life rally or a vigil at abortion sites at 25%. Both pregnancy center support and participating in a pro-life rosary were right around 18%. Pro-life bulletin board or road sign is 13%. Publishing a pro-life article in newspaper is 9%, and participating in the baptism pin program is 8%. All other life programs were less than 5% as shown in upper part of the pie chart.

Kudos to the following Councils that successfully installed an ultrasound in their community: Coos Council 1261, Madras Council 7223, Milwaukee Council 9257 (Milwaukee amazingly installed 3 ultrasound units), and Ontario Council 1656. Ontario Council 1656 is included on this list even though an ultrasound was never actually installed at the Hope Pregnancy Center in Ontario. Many of you were present at last year's Convention and donated funds for this Hope PRC ultrasound installation. The Knights of Columbus did our part but sadly the PRC made a decision to withdrawal their application at the final hour.

Ontario Council went through the entire process. With Idaho's ban on abortion, Ontario, Oregon, being on the state border, has become a strategic location for planned parenthood so they can provide abortions to the entire state of Idaho. Planned parenthood just opened up a new death clinic in Ontario and recently had their "not so grand" opening. Ontario Council coordinated with Boise Idaho KC Council and they managed to send a mobile ultrasound unit from the Stanton Healthcare for that opening as shown in the photo below. It is too bad they can't park there permanently. I do want to thank Ontario Council for their efforts.



Family Director's Report

Hello, Brothers.

It was good to meet some of you at the recent State Convention.

During the Convention I was able to participate in presenting the program awards to those Councils who were recognized for their activities. There are 96 Councils in our state. According to the recent Star Tracker, 82 of

those Councils submitted the last Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity. In any month, somewhere between 11 and 15 Councils submit activity reports to the State Directors. That means between 15% and 20% of the Councils active enough to complete the survey bothered to report some of their program activities to the state.

Perhaps some of those Councils that did the survey had no programs. Looking at the Star Tracker again, 46 Councils (50% of our total Councils) reported a Program Director to Supreme who is Safe Environment compliant, and another 5 Councils have a Program Director who is not yet compliant. So at least 51 Councils have a Program Director, and presumably are doing some programs in their Council. Yet less than 30% of those active Councils reported any activities in any month to the state. Why is that?

I have heard, "Why should we report? We don't need recognition for what we are doing. We don't need to compete for a plaque." Perhaps that is what the majority of Councils are thinking. There are some Councils with strong membership growth who are not sending me any reports. I firmly believe a Council requires good programs to attract new members. So perhaps they have strong programs. But they are not sharing them. Last year only 15 Councils turned in their Columbian Award SP-7 report to Supreme by the deadline of June 30th.

I can think of a couple reasons to report programs. One is to share your good ideas with other Councils. By telling the State Directors about your good programs, we can share those ideas with other Councils that are looking for things to do. But I think a better reason to report programs is to challenge your own Council. Every month when you fill out an activity report, you can look at it and think, "What else could we have done?" That might encourage you to review the Faith in Action materials and look at all the programs and resources available, and add some new activities to your Council calendar. It is easy to get in a rut and say we always do X, Y and Z, and that's enough. A new program might invigorate your members, and increase your service to your church and your community.

The State Directors are thinking about the reporting program, and ways improve it. If you already report programs and have thoughts about it, I encourage you to send them to Program Director, Duane Morris or to me. If you do not report programs, let us know why, and give us your thoughts on how we can help you be a stronger Council.

Welcome home Brothers, this past April I received a call from Ray Prom asking me to take St. Anne's Council 7729 into District 2. St. Anne's was an original and the second oldest Council in District 2 covering east Multnomah County. When St. Anne's was made a Spanish mission fourteen years ago to serve the ever growing Hispanic community in the Rockwood neighborhood, many of the Anglo parishioners and Knights migrated to

other parishes. Prior to this exodus many Spanish men joined the Council.

At about the same time, the State created a Spanish District. Being a Statewide District I'm sure it has been a real challenge for any District Deputy to properly serve his appointed Councils. SD Ray felt the present situation was not properly serving these Caballero de Colon Knights.

He was so right. It was not until he gave me this gift that my eyes were opened to see how many of the parishes and Councils that I serve have substantial Hispanic communities.

The fields are fertile, the wheat is ripe and the vines are bursting. I was a little apprehensive taking on this task as I am not close to being a Spanish speaker. However, when I started to get involved I quickly learned that 80% of these men are also English speakers so I had nothing to dread. I already had an association with Grand Knight Esteban Garcia for the last four years beginning when I was a Grand Knight. I have got to hand it to this man. He has been the GK for the past fourteen years and has been holding this Council together with duct tape and prayers.

In the last month seven young men have joined St. Anne's Council and there will be many more to follow. It's all in the asking. We will be scheduling a Spanish Exemplification in June as soon as I secure a date from Father Jose. I have spoken to the Grand Knights in my District of my intentions of encouraging men who are not comfortable speaking English, I will steer to St. Anne's. If they are bi-lingual I want them to remain in their parish Council to build them up and diversify them. So, if you have a Spanish community in your parish or one near you, you may think about plowing that field. You're sure to be rewarded.

In Convention news, District 2 was recognized for the Councils' hard work in recruiting, as accumulatively they averaged over 200% of membership Goal. I am convinced that we will match that number again in this 2023/2024 Fraternal Year.

An Exemplification of the three degrees will be held at St. Therese parish on May 20th, with the Knights and their families attending the five o'clock Vigil Mass. The ceremony will follow and there will be a light reception also. All are welcome but please notify me by email at burnsit@aol.com if you are planning on joining us, so I can let the host Council 7828 know how many to count on.

State Historian Report

Rev. Edwin Vincent O'Hara 3rd State Chaplain of Oregon 1914-16



Edwin Vincent O'Hara was born September 6, 1881 in Lanesboro, MN to Owen and Margaret Nugent O'Hara.

He attended a one-room school on land his father donated and later graduated from Lanesboro High School. In 1897, O'Hara began studies at the college of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, MN. In 1900 he entered St. Paul's Seminary before moving to Oregon City, OR.

O'Hara was ordained to the priesthood on June 9, 1905, for the Diocese of Oregon City by Archbishop John Ireland. O'Hara began teaching Scripture and Apologetics at St. Mary's Academy in Portland, Oregon. In 1907, he founded the Catholic Education Association of Oregon, and served as the superintendent of schools for the diocese. He formed the Dante Club at the Portland Public Library, where he gave lectures on history and the classics. In the face of considerable anti-Catholic bias, O'Hara sought to make Catholicism more visible in order to dispel inaccurate notions of what Catholics believe.

In 1910 O'Hara came down with bronchitis. Ordered by Archbishop Alexander Christie to take a rest, he traveled to Europe for six weeks with his sister Anna. Upon his return, he spent a semester taking classes at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. He returned to Portland in 1911.

Influenced by the views of Archbishop Ireland and Pope Leo XIII's encyclical *Rerum novarum*, O'Hara began to look into living conditions of factory workers in Portland. Based on his research, O'Hara published a book which he then sent to public officials and newspapers. In 1913 Oregon passed a minimum wage law. O'Hara was named chairman of the newly established Industrial Welfare Commission, which then included both labor and management.

O'Hara served as a chaplain during World War I. After the war, O'Hara did pastoral work in the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, and was a leading force in enacting the aforementioned minimum wage law through the state legislature in 1913. He earned a doctorate from the University of Notre Dame.

Rev. O'Hara was the Oregon Knights of Columbus State Chaplain from 1914-16. In 1920 he became pastor in Eugene, OR. On August 6, 1930, O'Hara was appointed the second bishop of the Diocese of Great Falls by Pope Pius XI. In 1931, he was the only American bishop present when Pius XI delivered his encyclical *Quadragesimo anno*.

O'Hara was later named Bishop of Kansas City, Missouri, on April 15, 1939. Within his first ten years as bishop, the diocese built or bought 42 churches, 31 rectories, 24 colleges, high schools, and grade schools, 14 convents, 8 social centers, and 6 hospitals. Of the 30 churches he constructed in rural counties, 25 of them had never had a Catholic church before.

On September 11, 1956 while on a trip to Milan, Italy to speak to Archbishop Giovanni Battista Montini on the work of the confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Archbishop Edwin Vincent O'Hara succumbed to a sudden heart attack.

He is buried at the Mount Olivet Cemetery in Kansas City, MO


