

The Great Oregon State University Student Move Out

Two weeks of June was the Great Move Out of all the Oregon State University Students out of the dorms and Corvallis, OR for the end of the school year. A little over 4,300 students moved out. All the donations and items left behind were processed by OSU Surplus headed by State Historian and Webmaster from the Albany Council, Tom Radel. Knights from the Albany Council 1577 volunteered in moving and processing all the items left behind by the students. It is such a big process it was held at the Benton County Fairgrounds to accommodate the material. About 10 tons of material was moved from the dorms and sorted by items. Among the 10 tons included furniture, food, computers, electronics, cleaning supplies, toiletries, clothes, shoes, and school supplies. Almost all the 10 tons were donated to local nonprofits in the Willamette Valley. This kept about 99% of material out of the landfills and back to the community and the needy. Each box pictured in the background is 4' x 4' x 4' and we filled 50 boxes of donations.
