The Feast of the Assumption is celebrated on August 15th and the Eastern Orthodox and Eastern Catholics celebrate the Dormition of the Mother of God (or Dormition of the Theotokos, the falling asleep of the Mother of God) on the same date, and is preceded by a 14 day fast period.

Eastern Christians believe that Mary died a natural death, that her soul was received by Christ upon death, that her body was resurrected after her death and that she was taken up into heaven bodily in anticipation of the general resurrection.

Orthodox tradition is clear and unwavering in regard to the central point [of the Dormition]: the Holy Virgin underwent, as did her Son, a physical death, but her body — like His — was afterwards raised from the dead and she was taken up into heaven, in her body as well as in her soul.

She has passed beyond death and judgement and lives wholly in the Age to Come. The Resurrection of the Body ... has in her case been anticipated and is already an accomplished fact.

That does not mean, however, that she is dissociated from the rest of humanity and placed in a wholly different category: for we all hope to share one day in that same glory of the Resurrection of the Body that she enjoys even now.<sup>1</sup>

As we prepare to celebrate the third feast of our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, on Aug. 13, this issue of *Chaplain's Report* highlights his message and mission. It features interviews with two priests who are inspired by his life and witness; a homily by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori given at one of the churches where Blessed Michael served; and further resources you may use to preach and teach about the life of our Founder.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church refers to the "exchange of spiritual goods" (955) that occurs between all of us still on our pilgrimage to eternity and those — like Blessed Michael — who have already entered the presence of God: "Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness. ... [They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and men, Christ Jesus. ... So by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped" (956).

I have been privileged to witness how Father McGivney continues his priestly intercession from eternity to so many who ask his intercession. In recent months, as I accompanied a relic of Blessed Michael on different pilgrimages, I have seen how mothers, young people, children, those with terminal illnesses, couples and priests are particularly drawn to seek his intercession. I was recently reminded that he shared a common plight with today's priests, in that while he was pastor in Thomaston, Connecticut, he served at two different churches, ministering to both communities. How close Blessed Michael remains to us!

May Blessed Michael inspire your service to our Brother Knights!

# Silver Rose Pilgrimage in Oregon '23

The Silver Rose arrived in Oregon July 7<sup>th</sup>, near the entry point of the original Oregon Trail, but not in a covered wagon!

It was delivered from Weiser, Idaho by the Idaho Knights on Bikes Chapter!

The Silver Rose in Ontario was extra special this year, as on that Friday evening the Knights of Columbus Council and Blessed Sacrament Parish led by Pastor Fr. Joseph carried the Rose through the nearby City Park and prayed a Rosary at the newly opened Planned Parenthood Clinic on the other side of the park.

Following the Silver Rose display and adoration at their 1:00 p.m. Spanish Mass, the Silver Rose was taken to Holy Family Parish in Burns for Adoration that evening. The next day, the Silver Rose Pilgrimage continued through Baker Diocese to the Cathedral in Baker City and onward daily to LaGrande, Pendleton, Hermiston, Boardman, Madras, Prineville, Redmond, LaPine, Bend and then transferred to the Archdiocese at a point on Santiam Pass on July 21<sup>st</sup>.

The Silver Rose Pilgrimage began in 1960 when a group of Knights of Columbus Squires carried a rose, blessed by the Bishop in Ontario, Canada, through the United States and transferred at the International Bridge in Laredo, Texas. It was then carried to The Lady of Guadalupe Basilica in Mexico City. This Pilgrimage recognizes the Lady of Guadalupe as the Patroness of all the Americas and also a symbol of the sanity of life, from conception to natural death.

# **Let's Discuss Wearing The Fourth Degree Uniform**

When to wear the Fourth Degree Uniform per Laws and Rules Governing the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus with Amendments to and Including the Year 2017.

Supreme Master Michael McCusker has encouraged members with the official regalia to wear it more frequently than at funerals and official Color Corp events. You could wear your regalia as an Usher during Mass, as a Lector while reading the WORD, as a Cantor, etcetera.



# What Is The Official Uniform And When May It Be Worn?

The Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Official Regalia (uniform) as set forth in the Laws of the Fourth Degree (Article XI, "Official Dress and Regalia," Sections 38 and 40):

- The Knights of Columbus Color Corps official regalia dress is the same as the official regalia dress of a member, with the addition of the Service Baldric (with or without sword), White Gloves, Beret.
- Per the Drill Manual: It is important to remember that when individual members of the Color Corps appear at public
  functions, they are not only representing themselves, but also their Assembly and the entire Order of the Knights of
  Columbus. Their conduct and appearance should reflect this at all times.
- When a Fourth Degree member attends an official function of the Order where Fourth Degree dress is required (whether member regalia or Color Corps regalia), he may wear the current medal of his office around his neck, Assembly, Council, State Council, Supreme Council or Supreme Assembly.

<u>Honor Guard / Color Corp Requests</u>: Your District Master must be notified of all requests. He can then help promote the event in the likelihood that someone outside your area may be able to attend.







# **Life Program Report**

Greetings Brother Knights!

For the month of August, it is important to touch on a sensitive and difficult topic, but an extremely important issue in our current culture today, particularly here in Oregon. The need for reconciliation and healing after abortion. This topic is often avoided and rarely discussed in public because of the deep hurt and grave nature. Brothers, because of the overwhelming number of abortions that have been happening around us for so many years, we likely either have had a tragic personal experience with a past abortion, or we know of a family member or someone close to us who has had an abortion.

Recently, on a cold and rainy day, I was praying in front of Planned Parenthood on the street sidewalk. The adjacent gutter was completely full of water. Suddenly, a large pick-up truck swerved toward me, into the gutter, where I was left completely drenched. He hit that water with his tire just right. Apparently, this man has practiced his art in the past. How often do we hear the angry screams, foul language and finger gestures as the vehicles pass. We often watch them assemble in large groups that typically outnumber pro-life people, thereby empowering them even further as they chant their anti-life slogans.

We have heard the expression "Mean People are Suffering". I think we can all agree this is a true statement. The numbers in our society and world are just overwhelming. The truth is, more often than not, the suffering and lashing out that we are witnessing is due to a past abortion. The devil and his lies hide in the darkness. Planned Parenthood hides the truth regarding their founder Margaret Sanger, and the abortion industry changes the word "murder" to "choice". If a past abortion can be buried deep enough in our soul, never discussed with others, and avoid the word "abortion" everywhere we go, the abortion just never happened.

Many post-abortive mothers and fathers are attempting to move on with their lives while hiding the truth regarding their past, and often make excuses why they had an abortion. Many talked themselves into believing it was only a mass of tissue or fetus and not a human person yet. Others claim they had to do it because it was the only merciful option they had at that time in their life, often due to financial limitations. Many push the idea they were only a victim. A victim from "I was coerced to have an abortion by my boyfriend or parent" to "I was raped". Unless that abortion occurred by physical force by a murderer, there is never justification for a mother or father for killing their innocent child in the womb.

When a post-abortive mother and/or father hold on to the belief that they were only a victim, it will keep them from ever finding true peace and healing. Burying the truth is only a prison sentence, as they try to live their life running and hiding. They will avoid the abortion topic, hang out with other abortion minded people who help them justify their lie, and many will lash out at pro-life people who are trying to change hearts to the Truth. If a person continues to believe they were a victim, there is no true accountability and that person will never fully repent for what they did. They will need to face the true gravity of what they did. They murdered their precious child that is loved by God and should be loved by every parent. There can never be true healing until a person reaches into the deep recesses of their soul and faces the Truth with our Lord and their child. Our Lord knows the Truth.

Luke 15:7 "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in Heaven over one sinner who repents than over 99 righteous persons who need no repentance". Our Lord loves every one of us including every sinner. For those who have had a direct or indirect abortion in their life, or know of a person who may be suffering from a past abortion, Rachel's Vineyard and other abortion healing ministries are available to help with the process of reconciling with our Lord and their precious child. By the grace of God, may they find forgiveness and true healing.



Subject: RSM Weekly - Freshmen Boys Small Discipleship Group Mentors Needed

If you know of any men who might be interested in helping with our Freshmen small groups, please put them in contact with me.

Following the model of the apostles with Jesus, we have successfully started 8 small discipleship groups at Regis. Participation in these groups has been voluntary. Each discipleship group is composed of five students of the same sex who meet twice a month with adult spiritual mentors. The idea is to help the students go deeper in their faith and really begin to claim some ownership of their relationship with Christ.

For the 2023-24 school year, we are looking for two more men to serve as small-group discipleship mentors for the incoming Freshmen class at Regis. Mentors meet with a group of 5 students for one hour twice each month to help them grow in their faith and fellowships with one another.

To prepare to serve as mentors adult volunteers complete a brief small group training program through NET Ministries (<a href="https://ydisciple.com/">https://ydisciple.com/</a>), receive a background check, and finish the required SAFE environments training that is mandated by the Archdiocese of Portland.

Pat hopes some Knights will be able to offer assistance. A check can be made payable to OR KofC Charities, with a memo note for St. Anthony of Padua, and mailed to Ray Prom, PO Box 369, Warrenton, OR 97146. Brother Ray will ensure all funds donated will be bundled and presented to the parish.

# In Solidarity With Our Priests—A Plea For Help

Submitted to current Oregon State Deputy

My name is Fr. Patrick Donoghue. I am the Pastor of Saint Anthony Catholic Church in SE Portland, not to be confused with St. Anthony in Tigard. Saint Anthony in Portland is located near SE 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and Powell Blvd. We are a small, poor parish. Our congregation is mostly made up of seniors, aged challenged people, many of whom are on fixed incomes. I am writing to you to ask you if the Knights of Columbus would consider helping us, perhaps under the umbrella of your K of C Charities.

Two of the four AC units for the Church are not working. And the two units that are working are performing at less than 50%. The same is true for the Parish Hall – two of the four AC units in the Parish Hall are not working at all and the two units that do work are performing at less than 50%. With the extremely hot summer weather we had in 2021 and 2022, we are anticipating more extremely hot weather this summer and in the summers to come. Having some for of adequate cooling is a necessary accommodation especially for my "aged challenged" congregation. We can't merely replace the nonfunctional AC units. The broken AC units use a coolant that is no longer permitted. As long as the AC units were working, it was "grandfathered" in, but since our repairs are so extensive, we have to replace the whole system with new piping and a different, environmentally friendly coolant, etc. This is a major and expensive undertaking. It will cost over \$200,000 to replace the AC in the Church, the Parish Hall and the Rectory. We had a preliminary estimate that placed the cost closer to \$300,000, but we are hoping with a more competitive bid that the actual cost could be closer to \$200,000. (On the other hand, the preliminary estimate of \$300,000 was calculated about 3 years ago. Since then prices have gone up.).

We just replaced two instant hot water heaters in our Parish Hall which are the basis for heat in the Parish Hall. The cost was \$11,200. The Child Care building has ten window units that provide both heating and cooling. These units are over 20 years old and need to be replaced. We found a sale online for replacement units at \$1,000 each. We can provide some of the labor ourselves. We have received a couple of units and have replaced two of the worse window units. We will need to purchase the other 8 units soon and install them.

The rectory garage roof has a major leak and needs extensive repairs, which includes a re-design of the roof where the leak is occurring so it doesn't leak again. We budgeted \$8,000.00 for the project. The chair of the Maintenance Committee is hoping we will receive a bid under \$16,000.00. The cost could be much higher than the \$8,000 we budgeted.

With the increase in crime in this part of Portland, we have more reason to improve the lighting and maybe install security cameras and other ways to enhance security. And there are the regular maintenance needs to take care of: replace filters, maintenance of furnace, A/C and boilers, toilets, roofs and gutters, etc. Shipping, trucking and labor issues have led to an increase in the cost of many items. Our many maintenance needs, our decline in Sunday Collection (income) and the rise in expenses have heightened our need for assistance this year.

Our most pressing need is to take care of the Air Conditioning in the Church and Parish Hall. The Air Conditioning is needed for the health of people so that they do not overheat when they are present for Mass.

Below is a list of some of the maintenance needs of St. Anthony and anticipated costs.

Air Conditioning in Church and Parish Hall - \$200,000-\$300,000 Recent Heat Repair in Parish Hall - \$11,200 Rectory Garage Roof - \$8,000 to \$16,000 Child care heating/cooling units - \$8,000

Security measures – lighting, cameras - ???? Other expenses

# State Historian Report

# <u>Bishop Joseph Francis McGrath</u> <u>6<sup>th</sup> State Chaplain of Oregon 1920-21</u>

Joseph Francis McGrath was born on March 3, 1871, in Kilkenny, Ireland to James and Margaret Farrell McGrath.

After completing his classical education, he studied philosophy at St Kieran's College, Kilkenny, Ireland. Then, as Mr. McGrath he immigrated to the United State in 1890. Mr. McGrath was soon sponsored to study for the priesthood for the Diocese of Springfield in Massachusetts, by Bishop Patrick Thomas O'Reilly, who sent McGrath to complete his theological studies at the Grand Séminaire in Montreal.

While in Montreal, McGrath was ordained a priest on December 21, 1895, by Archbishop Édouard-Charles Fabre. Following his ordination, he served as assistant pastor at St. Thomas Church in Adams, Maine. In 1900 McGrath was loaned to the Diocese of Portland, Maine, where he was made an assistant at St. Joseph Church in Old Town and did missionary work among Native Americans on the Penobscot Indian Island Reservation.

Facing poor health, McGrath sought a warmer climate and spent a few months in San Antonio, Texas. A visit to the Pacific Northwest brought him into contact with Bishop Edward John O'Dea, who needed more English-speaking priests in the Diocese of Seattle and appointed McGrath as an assistant at St. James Cathedral in 1904.

After two years at the cathedral, McGrath became pastor of St. Patrick Church, Tacoma, Washington in January 1906. A fire had destroyed the church the year before McGrath's appointment, and he immediately began construction on a new church.

The cornerstone was laid in March 1906 and the building was dedicated in June 1907. In addition to his pastoral duties, McGrath was named a diocesan consultor in 1910 and dean of the counties of Pierce, Thurston, and Grays Harbor in 1915.

In July 1918, Rev. Terrence G. Brady, the vicar general of the Archdiocese of Dubuque and rector of St. Raphael Cathedral, was named the next Bishop of Baker City, Oregon, to succeed Bishop Charles Joseph O'Reilly. However, Brady declined the appointment and Pope Benedict XV instead named McGrath as Bishop on December 21, 1918, on the twenty-third anniversary of his priestly ordination. He took formal charge of the Diocese of Baker City on April 1, 1919, when he was installed at St. Francis de Sales Cathedral.

During McGrath's 31-year tenure in Baker City, the Catholic population increased from 6,755 to 14,729 and the number of priests increased from 26 to 39; however, the total number of churches (including parishes and missions) fell from 54 to 50. With only one parochial school in the entire

diocese at the beginning of his tenure, McGrath mandated that the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine be established in every parish and mission.

In 1948, the 77-year-old McGrath received Leo Fabian Fahey as a coadjutor bishop to assist and eventually succeed him. However, before he could replace McGrath, Fahey fell ill and died on March 31, 1950. Less than two weeks later, McGrath himself died on April 12, 1950.

Bishop Joseph Francis McGrath is buried at Mount Hope Cemetery in Baker City, OR.


