



State Deputy's Letter

Worthy Brother Knights,

I hope you are doing well. I hope Lent has been fruitful so far. I hope you have been able to take this time to pray, fast, and give alms. I hope this has also been an opportunity to do charitable works and good deeds for others.

I would like to suggest and propose a wonderful charitable work and good deed that we as Knights of Columbus can do: Invite other men to become a Knight of Columbus! This is in fact a very noble thing to do and a great service we do to the men we ask to join our Order. The opportunity to take upon oneself knighthood is really a wonderful thing. Given that this is a time of Lent, let us re-double our efforts and put more effort and work into inviting other men to join.

Brothers, I must be frank with you. We are not doing well for membership this year. We are now currently ranked 67 out of 75 in the whole Order on Membership. For a State that has achieved Pinnacle last year, we have proven ourselves to be capable of much better than this. We are now currently at about 47% towards our Circle of Honor goal and need about 200 more members to be at goal. We can do this! This is achievable! With approximately 100 Councils, we just need each Council to bring in 2 more members!

I'm calling on each Council in this State of Oregon to recommit yourselves to renewing your effort in bringing in new members. At least 2 more members per Council! Hold a membership drive in the next few weeks. How many Councils currently have a membership drive scheduled in the next month? If not, time to schedule one. Talk with the pastor to set a date, get some prayer cards and online membership cards (the business card size cards that say "you are invited to put your Faith into Action" with (kofc.org/join), have a passionate pulpit announcement ready, KofC ambassadors to greet people, and have the Council ready to invite men to join after Mass. Invite men to join during a Parish event that the Council is putting on. Invite men to join individually after Mass. We have 4 more months worth of Masses for each of us to individually invite someone after Mass. Do not let these opportunities get passed up.

I am still very deeply concerned about the Councils that have not invited any new members to this date. I invite you to strongly consider the future of these Councils. If a Council never recruits, then the current members will eventually no longer be willing to run the Council and the Council will die. This is not something we want for the Parish, for the men, or for the world. Therefore, if your Council has recruited 0 new members so far, please put some

effort into recruiting at least just 2 members. Just 2.

As always, the State is here to help you. Please let us know what we can do to help. Feel free to invite us to various Council events and we'd be happy to work with the Council and do everything we can to provide what your Council needs. Remember that the work we do as Knights of Columbus is crucial to the world. If we do not fulfill this work, then the evil one has much more of a foothold on the world. So I'm asking you to please help bring in more men to help us in this quest.

For FS's and GK's IRS Form 990



This notice is to remind Councils, Assemblies and Chapters in the United States of their legal obligation to file an IRS Form 990 (informational tax return) for the 2023 tax year, and to provide detailed instructions on how to comply with this obligation.

The Knights of Columbus, including all subordinate Councils, Assemblies, and Chapters (collectively referred to as Councils), is a tax-exempt organization, recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a fraternal benefit society under <u>Section 501(c)(8)</u> of the Internal Revenue Code. This tax-exempt status requires each Council to file an annual Form 990 with the IRS.

Councils reporting gross receipts of \$50,000 or less with less than \$200,000 in assets may comply with their obligation by filing the Form 990-N electronic postcard (also known as the <u>e-Postcard</u>). Councils reporting gross receipts of more than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000 with total assets of less than \$500,000 must file the Form 990-EZ. Councils with gross receipts of \$200,000 or more and total assets of \$500,000 or more must file the Form 990.

REMINDER

The IRS requires electronic filing for **all** tax-exempt organizations, regardless of which form they use. The online filing system, also known as "E-Services", requires **all new users** to register or sign in with LOGIN.GOV or ID.me, the current IRS credential service providers.

There are two ways to access the Form 990-N Electronic Filing system: (1) Sign in with your active IRS username; or (2) Sign in/create an account with LOGIN.GOV or ID.me. Form 990-N filers who have an existing IRS username and register for a new Login.gov or ID.me account must use the email address associated with their IRS account. Refer to User Guide for the IRS Form 990-N Electronic Filing System. Instructions are available on the IRS website, links to which are in the *Where to File* section.

State-wide Holy Hour



On Sunday March 3rd, the Oregon Knights of Columbus held a State-wide Holy Hour. Archbishop Sample led the Holy Hour for the West side at the Cathedral in Portland at 2pm. While this Holy Hour was just finishing, Bishop Cary started the Holy Hour for the East side at 3pm at St. Francis in Bend.

Many Knights, family members and other parishioners attended these events. There were several other Knights of Columbus Councils throughout the State that sponsored and also held a Holy Hour at their respective Parish. Springfield Council 4087 was a notable Council that also held a Holy Hour. This was an excellent opportunity for the State of Oregon to be united in prayer to our Eucharistic Lord. There will be more opportunities to follow.

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge

"Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me." (Gospel for March 17, Jn 12:26)

Next to Our Lady, what greater model of faithful service to Jesus do we have than St. Joseph, the Lord's own adoptive father? In humble obedience to God, Joseph protected Mary and Jesus under the most difficult of circumstances. Although he says not a word in Scripture, the "silent" Joseph speaks volumes through his faithful actions. He is a model of manhood and discipleship for all Knights today.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month — in which we celebrate the feast of St. Joseph — I challenge you to pray a novena or another prayerful devotion to this great saint.

Questions for Reflection:

What virtues do you see in St. Joseph as you read the Gospel narratives about the nativity and early life of Jesus? How well do you practice these virtues in your own life, not only as a husband or father, but as a faithful disciple of Jesus? What specific, concrete things can you do to grow in these virtues in your day-to-day life?

Director of Chaplain's Report

Pope Francis' Message for Lent 2024 sets out the goal facing each believer in its very title: "Through the Desert God Leads Us to Freedom." The Holy Father speaks of the identity that is at the heart of our relationship with the Father: "God has not grown weary of us. ... Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom. ... Unlike Pharaoh, God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters." Opposed to our identity as beloved sons of God is Satan, the Father of Lies, who, Pope Francis reminds us, tempts us: "To be all-powerful, to be looked up to by all, to domineer over others ... We can become attached to money, to certain projects, ideas or goals, to our position, to a tradition, even to certain individuals. Instead of making us move forward, they paralyze us. Instead of encounter, they create conflict." An antidote is to pause and encounter God amid the wounded members of the Body of Christ. "In the presence of God, we become brothers and sisters, more sensitive to one another: in place of threats and enemies, we discover

companions and fellow travelers," the pope writes.

The story of Rudolf Höss, the Nazi commandant of Auschwitz who is featured in the recent movie *Zone of Interest*, presents a further area for preaching. Höss was raised in a devout Catholic family before rejecting his faith during World War I. However, he was an early adherent of National Socialism, joining the Nazi SS and steadily rising through the ranks of viciousness. He worked at Dachau and Sachsenhausen concentration camps before being put in charge of Auschwitz, where he oversaw the murder of more than 1 million Jews. After the war, he was captured, tried and convicted of crimes against humanity.

While awaiting execution by hanging at Auschwitz, he was held in a Polish jail in Wadowice, the hometown of Karol Wojtyla. During this time, he was stunned that the Polish guards did not commit heinous actions against him like those he had inflicted on prisoners at Auschwitz. In fact, he was moved to ask for a priest, recalling the name of the Polish Jesuit superior Father, Władysław Lohn, whose life he had inexplicably spared once at the camp. Höss confessed his sins to Father Lohn on the Thursday after Easter 1947 and received holy Communion the next day. Polish guards were stunned to see "the Animal," as they called him, on his knees, weeping after receiving the Eucharistic Lord five days before his execution.

While the mystery of evil can never be fully understood, we know that Divine mercy is God's answer to that mystery. In God's mercy, the reign of evil always has an expiration date. Let us lead our brother Knights and their families into the spiritual freedom of the sons of God.

Example: Sweet Home Knights of Columbus fill Christmas food boxes

SWEET HOME — The St. Helen Catholic Church Knights of Columbus Council 8624 recently collected enough food to fill more than 40 Christmas boxes for needy families.

Members of the parish donated canned goods, noodles, boxes of oat meal, peanut butter and many other items and the Knights purchased spiral hams to go into every box. Boxes also contained a bag of potatoes and a pumpkin pie. There was enough food for several meals.

There also were games, toys and clothing items such as gloves and stocking caps for children.

"We enjoy helping our neighbors and partnering with Sweet Home Emergency Ministries on this annual project," Grand Knight Alex Paul said. "The children of the parish help wrap all of the boxes and parishioners are extremely generous with food items and cash donations."

The Sweet Home Council meets at 6:30 p.m. on the second Monday of the month at the church hall.







New Council Development

We're approaching the end of our Fraternal year and each of us should be reflecting on what we have done over the past year. We all should be looking at achieving Star Council. Your Council deserves the honor and it is one of the easiest goals to reach—the Star is our recruitment goal. It costs us nothing and the rewards are plentiful.

If you can, look to your neighbor. Does a parish near you not have a Knight's Council? First contact the parish priest and ask him if he would be interested in having you form a Council in his parish. If he is not interested, I personally would not go further, as it is imperative to have the pastor's blessing for your future

endeavor. Eventually the parish will have a priest who desires our presence. If the priest is interested, I make it a practice to invite him out to dinner. Have a few of your Council members attend also. Bring your District Deputy along as it is even very probable your District lies in the same Vicariate and the priests meet regularly and he will also be dealing with those priests, so a good relationship is the hallmark building stone.

What's in it for you? First off, you will have a new vineyard to reap the fruits that are waiting to be harvested. It has been my experience that the process of forming a new Council takes approximately twelve-to-eighteen-months from beginning to end. During this period, you will be recruiting new Knights and this will easily double your recruitment goal. It will also take your efforts into the next Fraternal Year. So, you will meet your Councils goals two years in a row.

Even if your Drive does not culminate in the formation of a new Council, you still would have benefited at having those men that you did recruit in your Council. You will set up a Round Table for them so they can serve the needs of their parish and you keep your presence in the parish doing things you do best. Pancake Breakfasts and coffee and donuts—which is one of the prime opportunities for recruiting. Does the neighboring parish engage in activities that your parish may not? What about Feast Days and Adoration or Processions of the Holy Eucharist? Encourage these new men in the Council to become the ushers at Mass and to wear their badges or Knights swag, when appropriate. Visual aids increase interest.

Lastly, it is imperative that as the Grand Knight you show your leadership in becoming the "Recruiter Personified". It's truly an opportunity to Evangelize—which we are all commanded to do as disciples. When recruiting do not forget to ask the Holy Spirit to put HIS WORDS in your mouth and ask Christ to reflect His countenance in you, so when you invite the men to join, then they see Him.

Council Supports Pregnancy and Maternity Care Centers



Our Council provided a total of \$1,500 to support pregnancy care centers in Beaverton, Canby, and McMinnville. These centers provide information, ultrasounds, clothing, food, housing, and hope to pregnant mothers and families in need. We also gave \$1,500 to Road2Hope, an organization that provides transitional housing to mothers and their babies. The Supreme Council of the Knights of the Columbus contributed additional matching funds through its Aid and Support After Pregnancy program.

Knights Help Move Fr. Joachim Gracias

Father Joaquim Gracias, our parochial vicar, needed help moving from his residence in the basement of the parish business office building, which needed significant repairs. The Knights worked with the parish's staff to find a clean, bright apartment within walking distance of our parish campus. 

Worthy Faithful Navigators and Sir Knights All,

Thank you for the time and effort you put into being a Knight and your involvement in the Honor Guard as a Member of the Knights of Columbus in the Fourth Degree.

As Members of the Fourth Degree Honor Guard, we represent the four principles of our order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. We Stand for the love of our faith, the love of our country, and the love that we have for our fellow Brother Knights. Let us always put our best foot forward.

Official Dress Uniform: The Laws and Rules of the Fourth Degree define the official Regalia of the Honor Guard as stated in 3 separate Sections within Article XI: The Official Dress Uniform (Section 38), Dress for Exemplification (Section 39), and Color Corps Regalia (Section 40). Brother Knights, please review and bring yourselves to the highest standards that our order expects.

Areas of special attention should be brought to:

The Beret: please take the time to form correctly. There are many YouTube videos on how to wear and wear correctly. See the Drill manual for more information.

The Official Blazer: There is only one. There are no substitutes. Please keep it clean and pressed. The only medals to be worn on it are the approved mini medals of the order based on past office held and the mini emblem of the Order.

The Slacks: These are available from the authorized vendor. Please do not use any other. The slacks are to be hemmed and without cuffs. **Plain Toe Black Shoes:** Clean and polished leather or leather-like, no wing tips, tennis shoes, or shoes that lace out to the toe, like sports shoes or lace-up boots. Cowboy boots are also discouraged. Simple round toe not pointed, keep heels low.

Socks: These are plain black, with no stitching emblems or club patterns.

Plain White Shirt: Not a button-down collar or French cuffed sleeve. Suggested is a narrow V collar instead of a wide V collar.

Official Tie for the District (USA). From the approved vendor. It strongly suggested that the knot used to tie the tie be one that forms a triangle, i.e., single Windsor. The fore-in-hand knot does not look good.

Gloves White. Cotton or Nylon plain. Clean (think what your grandmother would say if she saw those palms).

No name badges are to be worn while in regalia.

When securing the beret after removing it from your head, it should be folded and put in your waistband, just forward of the right hip. Gloves are to be put in a pocket. It is bad form for them to be dropped in the pew or chair.

Manual of Arms: You should be able to draw and return your sword to its scabbard without looking for it. See the Drill manual and practice. Left hand on the tip of the sword to the entry of scabbard.

Try practicing in a hallway or doorway to keep your movements close to you.

Please review the Drill Manual. (808 Fourth Degree Color Corps Drill Manual 0920)

I. Return Sword


- 1. This order is used to return the sword to the scabbard. It can only be ordered from the "Carry Sword" position.
- 2. This command is only executed at the "Halt."
- 3. At the preparatory command "Return," grasp the sword's point with the left fingers.
- 4. At the command of execution, "Sword," drop the point of the sword by turning the right hand in the most convenient manner as the sword's design permits. At the same time, grasp the scabbard near the mouth with the left hand, thumb on the mouth of the scabbard, and tilt it forward. Turn the head slightly to the left, fixing the eyes on the opening of the scabbard, raise the right hand sufficiently to insert the sword blade, and return it to the scabbard.
- 5. Once the sword is in the scabbard, turn the head to the front and drop the hands as in the position of "Attention."

Please review the Drill Manual. Most situations require the use of silent commands, so practice is imperative.

KofC Fern Ridge Council 17884

KofC **Fern Ridge Council 17884** responded to an URGENT CALL for help to clean up the parish area around the front of the church.





The call went out on Thursday morning February 8, 2024 at 9 am for help from anyone who could come to the church to help get downed trees and branches cleaned up and moved to the brush pile on parish grounds. The plea was for everyone to bring their chain saws, blowers and tools.

Here's what happened. The January ice storm resulted in a large number of limbs breaking off the oak trees in front of the Church, with some hitting the ground and others remaining caught high in the other limbs. Caution tape was used to cordon off the area to avoid personal injury from falling limbs.

The Deputy Grand Knight, Chris Demers, contacted Lane Electric, because the leaning trees were a threat to the overhead power lines powering the Parish. Surprisingly, Lane Electric was able to respond immediately. Lane Electric on a moment's notice came out to remove the most dangerous tree damage in the courtyard as well as the one across the driveway. The reason for the urgency was that the parish had a funeral on Friday, February 9th and the parish needed it cleaned up ASAP.

On Tuesday, February 6th a commercial tree service was requested to take down the trees. This created an immediate need to clean up the grounds before the funeral scheduled for Friday, February 9. Not everything could be cleaned up in time.

On Wednesday February 7, 2024 the Deputy Grand Knight sent an urgent email to all Council Knights to help with debris clean up starting at 9:00 a.m. the following morning.

At 8:30 a.m., Chris Demers and his father, Robert, showed up with their excavators, chainsaw and dump truck. Two other Knights were able to respond to the call, Shawn Church with his chain saw and Derrold Burnett.

The fallen trees were cut into manageable pieces for the excavators, loaded onto the dump truck and hauled to a temporary wood pile staging area or to a burn pile. All the debris from the oak trees were burned. In addition, all the trimmed tree limbs on the ground from earlier in the year (when the fir trees were limbed to remove the threat of a forest fire) were moved to the burn pile. Eight hours later the grounds were cleaned and swept ready for the funeral the next morning. This how the Fern Ridge Knights get 'er done!

The **Canby Knights of Columbus Council 3484** hosted their <u>Charity Auction and Crab Dinner</u> on February 24, 2024, at the Canby Fairgrounds, serving a fabulous crab and chicken cordon bleu dinner to 392 guests and workers.

Unlike 2022, we didn't have any local tragedies to use as our Special Appeal for 2024. Brother Knight Greg Perez learned of a non-profit organization in Canby, called Neurotherapeutic Pediatric Therapies that would be a great organization to support. After a couple of visits by our auction team, we made the decision to go with them.

"Neuro's" specialty is supporting children with developmental and behavioral disorders and delays, serving families by providing them with occupational, physical, mental health and speech therapy for children from birth to young adulthood. More than 50% of Neuro families are on Medicaid and/or are underinsured. Neuro is always working to remove the financial barriers to their care so all their clients can get the therapies they need, for as long as they are needed. Our guests opened their hearts to raise \$26,662 for this cause.

For Council 3484, this is our major fundraiser to support funding for our many local charities, scholarships for high school graduates and support for the religious education programs at St. Patrick's church, our parish picnic and the many other activities we support for our church and the community.

This event took many hours of preparation to make it happen, especially with the setup of 300 silent and oral auction items that could be viewed on the website prior to the event. We had more than 50 Brother Knights, Spouses, Parishioners and youth involved in the set up on Friday evening and the day of the event. State Historian Report

Rev. Edmund John Murnane 14th and 23rd State Chaplain of Oregon 1937-39, 54-56



Edmund John Murnane was born June 21, 1896 in Portland, OR to Michael and Katherine Stack Murnane. He attended Jefferson High School.

Edmund attended Columbia University and St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, CA. and was ordained as a priest in 1921 at St. Mary's Cathedral in Portland, OR. He was the last priest to be ordained by Archbishop Christie.

He served at parishes in Portland, Junction City, Harrisburg, North Bend, Reedsport, Corvallis and Astoria. Rev. Murnane was Pastor of St. Mary's in Eugene for 20 years 1950 to 1969. He established five Catholic churches, a Carmelite convent, and the Catholic Charities and St. Vincent de Paul social service agencies. He was also one of the organizers of an alcoholism and drug treatment center, Serenity Lane.

When he left St. Mary's, he moved to St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Veneta, OR. He served there until his retirement on Easter Sunday 1980.

In the early 1950's, Monsignor Murnane saw the need for the continued growth of Catholic secondary education in Lane County. He called on the Marist Brothers to oversee the construction of the new Marist High School.

On May 23, 1967, ground breaking ceremonies launched the construction of Marist High School. By September of 1968, on what just a few years previously had been 30 acres of lush Oregon farmland along the banks of the Willamette River, stood a spacious modern facility dedicated to the continuing Christian education of youth. Monsignor Murnane served as State Chaplin of Catholic Daughters and State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus 1937–39 and again 1954-56.

He was gifted with a booming voice, he was in great demand as an occasional speaker in the days when electronic amplification was not common.

Monsignor Murnane was an avid book collector and had a 6,000 volume book library. He donated over 1,000 books to the "Monsignor Murnane Library" at Marist High School. He also loved to dance.

Monsignor Edmund John Murnane died May 29, 1987 in Maryville Catholic nursing home in Beaverton, OR. He is buried at the Mount Calvary Cemetery in Portland, OR.

Abbot Jeremy traveled to Rome in early February to participate in a plenary Assembly of the Dicastery for Divine Worship.

Those in attendance included cardinals, archbishops, and bishops from around the world. One of 3 main speakers at the plenaria, Abbot Jeremy spoke about the curriculum at Mount Angel Seminary, which is centered on Communion Ecclesiology and emphasizes the liturgical formation of seminarians. During their meeting, Pope Francis addressed the Dicastery for Divine Worship and greeted each participant individually.

Left to right: Abbot Olivier-Marie Sarr, OSB, abbot of Keur Moussa (Senegal) and a former student of Abbot Jeremy's at Sant'Anselmo; Archbishop Aurelio Garcia Macias, under-secretary of the Dicastery for Divine Worship and professor at Sant'Anselmo; Abbot Jeremy; Cardinal Arthur Roche, prefect of the Dicastery for Divine Worship; Archbishop Vittorio Viola, OFM, secretary of the Dicastery for Divine Worship and professor at Sant'Anselmo; Fr. Bernhard Eckerstorfer, OSB, rector of Sant'Anselmo; and Fr. Pierangelo Muroni, professor at Sant'Anselmo.

While in Rome, Abbot Jeremy stayed at Sant'Anselmo, where he taught a semester each year for nearly two decades and spent time with Fr. Israel Sanchez, OSB, and Fr. Ephrem Martinez, OSB, two monks of Mount Angel who currently live at Sant'Anselmo while pursuing advanced degrees in theology. Fr. Israel is studying patristics at the Pontifical Institute Augustinianum, while Fr. Ephrem is studying spiritual theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University.



Abbot Jeremy also received honors from his alma mater, the Benedictine College of Sant'Anselmo, where Fr. Bernard A. Eckerstorfer, OSB (rector), granted him the honor and title of "Professor Emeritus" of the Faculty of Theology at Sant'Anselmo. On behalf of the Athenaeum's academic community, Fr. Bernard also bestowed on Abbot Jeremy the "Diploma of Merit," an honor given to those who have left a profound mark on the culture, research, and life of Sant'Anselmo and the life of the Church and the Benedictine Confederation. Abbot Jeremy responded, "I carry Sant'Anselmo in my heart. Upon returning here, I still find that peace that we breathe and that every student can breathe. It was a grace to study and then teach in a place like Sant'Anselmo."
