In southern France, Marie-Bernadette Soubirous, a 14-year-old French peasant girl, first saw the Virgin Mary, mother of Jesus Christ and a central figure in the Roman Catholic religion. The apparitions, which totaled 18 before the end of the year, had occurred in the grotto of a rock promontory very near Lourdes, France. At these subsequent visits the Lady (who had not yet identified herself as the Blessed Virgin Mary) asked for a chapel to be built on the grounds, for Bernadette to pray for the conversion of sinners, and for her to drink the spring water that was revealed to her at the grotto.

Word of these apparitions spread rapidly and caused quite a stir in town. In response, Bernadette was detained, interrogated, and harassed by the civil authorities as if she were a common criminal. The villagers, however, came to her rescue and also demanded that the child be released.

'Through all these difficulties that came to her because of the apparitions, Bernadette was given an interior strength: "There was something in me that enabled me to rise above everything. I was tackled from all sides, but nothing mattered and I was not afraid."

St. Bernadette Soubirous's feast day is April 16th.



As these new Catholics have now had their life changed profoundly for the rest of their life, let us offer the men who became Catholic the opportunity to become a Knight of Columbus and remain on fire for their Catholic Faith. Invite these men to join the Knights of Columbus.

Speaking of membership, we currently have about 150 men left to go to reach our Circle of Honor Goal state-wide. We can do this! We have 3 more months to push to the finish line! 150 members and about 100 Councils—this is doable. How can we achieve this?

- Councils that have met their membership goal: Strive for Double-Star Council! Especially those that are at 140% or above, it just takes 2 or 3 more members to hit Double-Star. Go for it! You have State support.
- Councils on the "Make it Happen" list: you can do it! Go for the Star! Just a few more and you'll be there!
- Councils that are membership active: Star Council is still in the cards! You can do it! Just work hard, hold some more membership drives, and you'll be there!
- Councils that are not membership active this year: Recruit some members this year. Remember that it is in the best interest of the Council to recruit. If a Council doesn't recruit, it will eventually die off. Do you want this to happen to your Council? Does your Parish want this to happen to your Council? Keep these things in mind as well as the vital importance of our mission as Knights of Columbus and get out there and invite some men to join!

Reminder that membership growth is vital to the long-term success of our Order. With the attacks that the devil is making on our world today, our work is too important for us to lose ground. Remember that if we don't grow, we die. That is exactly what the devil wants. Keep strong in striving for excellence in all that you do serving God!

### A love which unites

"A love which unites," Pope Francis said in the opening ceremony of the 34th World Youth Day in Panama, "is the quiet love of a hand outstretched to serve, a commitment that draws no attention to itself. It is a love that does not put on airs, a humble love that gives itself to others with an outstretched hand. This is the love that unites us today."

I wish to share with you the beautiful charitable efforts exhibited by our brother Knights and their families on behalf of pilgrims to World Youth Day in Panama. While the K of C has existed in Panama for more than 100 years, it was noted that their membership was not growing. Then a priest in Panama, Father Vincente Amable, had dreamed that Father McGivney asked him not to let the Knights disappear in Panama.

Father Amable then revived the Council of men in Panama Balboa Council 1371 in Panama City. Later, three new Councils would eventually spin off from that Council. Knights from these Councils served as the volunteers at the FIAT Festival (co-sponsored by the Knights and FOCUS) held during the year's World Youth Day. Local K of C members and their families staffed the FIAT Festival, serving as the primary logistical partners for the event which drew over 8,000 international pilgrims.

These same men provided logistical support for a three-day catechesis offered for Spanish-speaking pilgrims. Many of the local Knights also supported their local pastors in receiving pilgrims and hosted international pilgrims in their homes. These Brother Knights exhibited the "quiet love" highlighted by Pope Francis and this charity in action had a deep impact.

Many of the 50 or so men from various backgrounds and parishes had not known each other before working together during WYD. Their individual 'yeses' to join a Council — and become more involved in their parish through the K of C — led them not only to help lead an international gathering of thousands of young adults, but also to a deeper encounter with other men who sought to build up the Church in Panama.

<u>This is the impact our evangelizing charity can have</u>: the renewal of men and their family to deeper faith. May we as K of C chaplains follow the pattern of Father Amable and reanimate Councils, re-engaging our brother Knights in the "quiet love" of faith-filled charitable service. The impact may be greater than you realize.

### Interview with a Chaplain

Knights of Columbus chaplain Father Oleksandr Bohomaz was living in Melitopol, Ukraine, when the city was captured by Russia in 2022. Even though he was interrogated by Russian authorities and threatened numerous times, he did not leave his parishioners until he was deported from Russian-controlled territory.

In times of war, when fear and suffering can make it very difficult to show love or compassion, Father Bohomaz's story reminds us of the importance of loyalty to one's mission — and how many fruits it can bear. "Don't be afraid to be present. Even if it's dangerous. Don't run away," said Father Bohomaz. "If someone is in trouble or if they turned away from you — in all circumstances just be present: cry, laugh, rejoice. Now I understand that the presence of the priest is the



presence of an *alter Christus*. ... I understood that the chaplain, the priest, makes God present. He is an instrument of God. So be present!" Read the full interview <u>here</u>

### Build-A-Bed Program

St. Joseph was a craftsman and he worked with his hands. Would you like the opportunity to be similar to St. Joseph and take on a project that involves building and craftsmanship like he did? Supreme is promoting a new program called "Build-a-Bed" and has asked Oregon if it would like to be a pilot. We would just need one Council in our jurisdiction to take this on. See memo in the next paragraph for more details. I think it would be great to see Oregon take this on. I'd like to encourage all of our Councils if they would like to consider this, go for it! Be like St. Joseph. Let me know if your Council is interested.

### From Supreme

Build-A-Bed Program Pilot—The Knights of Columbus Department of Fraternal Operations is seeking out Councils to pilot the Build-A-Bed program. The pilot's results will help determine whether the Order will adopt this program on a larger scale. The following is information regarding the program and what participating Councils can expect.

#### What is Build-A-Bed?

- The goal is to end child bed-lessness throughout US & Canada 3% of children in US & Canada sleep on the floor.
- <u>Build-A-Bed provides an opportunity</u> for Councils to build beds for children in low-income communities.
- <u>How are the beds built</u>? Councils will work with volunteers from <u>Sleep in Heavenly Peace</u>, which is a nationwide 501c3 organization, to build the beds. Sleep in Heavenly Peace will provide all the supplies necessary.
- <u>What does the Council need to provide</u>? The Council must provide the funding, space and manpower to build the beds.
- <u>Funding</u>: A minimum of 20 beds must be funded and built for the pilot. The beds cost \$250 each. Supreme will cover the entire cost of the first 20 beds.
- <u>Space</u>: The Council must provide a large enough space to build the beds, such as a parking lot or indoor facility with access to electrical outlets.
- <u>Manpower</u>: The Council must provide at least 20 Brother Knights as volunteer to build the beds.
  - Ages 9-93 have participated.
  - This is a family event wives, children and parishioners should be encouraged to participate.
- <u>Who are the beds donated to</u>? Sleep in Heavenly Peace chooses and coordinates the delivery of the beds to children in need. The Council can help deliver the beds.
- <u>What are the next steps</u>? Councils chosen to participate in the pilot by their jurisdiction will be contacted by Angelo Cona, Manager of Program Development at Supreme. The Council will be paired with a local Sleep in Heavenly Peace chapter to plan and facilitate the build.
- Supreme will ask that all participants complete a review of the pilot upon completion, before the end of the 2023-24
  Fraternal Year.



It is now our turn to do what we can in protecting lives of the defenseless from abortion and euthanasia. Life is fragile; let's work together to build it up. Remember, Albany: THAT'S LIFE!

<u>Baltimore Catechism Lesson for the Day</u> We continue excerpts from the Baltimore Catechism to remind ourselves of some of the truths of our faith. <u>Q</u>: Why did Christ institute the Holy Eucharist? <u>A</u>: Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist: 1. # State Historian Report

### Rev. Michael Edward Fleming 15<sup>th</sup> State Chaplain of Oregon 1939-41

Michael Edward Fleming was born October 19, 1891 in Kilalee, Ontario, Canada to Jeremiah and Mary Ann Cull Fleming. Michael enlisted in the Canadian army in 1914, the year Canada joined the Allied forces fighting World War I. His job was as a telegrapher.

During the winter of 1915 his unit was dug in near Ypres, Belgium for a prolonged period of trench warfare. The shooting was interrupted by heavy fog, and some of Canadian troops who spoke German and some of the Germans who spoke English shouted across the trenches. A group from both sides agreed to meet together in the middle. They met, exchanged cigarettes, German beer and Jamaican rum and agreed that the war would stop now if they had anything to do with it. Then they said 'goodbye,' 'good luck' and returned to their respected trenches. When the weather cleared, they were shooting at each other again.

After Michael was discharged at the end of the war he attended and graduated from the University of Toronto. In 1922 he attended Mt. Angel, OR to study for the priesthood.

Rev. Fleming served as an assistant for three years then was appointed pastor of St. Patrick parish in Canby. He lived in the unfinished church attic. In 1935 he established the Archdiocese of Portland's Catholic Youth Organization. While pastor of Canby he began the construction of the first Catholic Church in Molalla, OR.

He was state Chaplain of the Columbian Squires and the Oregon Knights of Columbus State Chaplain 1939–41 and Chaplain at Sacred Heart hospital in Medford, OR after he left Canby parish.

Rev Fleming retired in 1961 and lived at Mt. St. Joseph in Portland.

Rev. Michael E. Fleming died August 3, 1966 in Portland, OR. He is buried at the Mount Calvary Cemetery in Portland, OR.
