#### State Chaplain Report

Dear Brother Knights,

December is busy. You feel it everywhere: deadlines at work, school events, shopping, parish activities, Council commitments, family expectations. It's very easy, even for men of faith, to come to the end of December exhausted, having done many good things, but realizing we barely made room in our hearts for what Christmas is actually about.

Yet the Church, in her wisdom, gives us three great feasts this month that can steady us and re-center us:

- the Immaculate Conception (December 8),
- Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12),
- the Nativity of the Lord (December 25). Together, they form a path through Mary to Jesus.

As Knights, we have a special relationship with Our Blessed Mother. These feast days are not just dates on a calendar, they are invitations, especially to us as men, husbands, fathers, and spiritual brothers, to remember who we are and whom we serve.

#### Immaculate Conception: A Call to Purity and Courage

On December 8, we honor Mary, conceived without sin. From the first instant of her existence, God preserved her from the stain of original sin so that she could be a worthy dwelling place for His Son. That's a profound mystery, but it's also deeply practical for us.

We live in a world that bombards us with impurity, distraction, and compromise. Many of you carry many hidden burdens: temptations of the internet and media, stress, anger, resentment and discouragement. The Immaculate Conception reminds us that God's grace is not weak. It is stronger than sin. Mary is the proof.

As Knights, we are called to be men of clean hearts. Not perfect men, but men who let God fight for us, heal us, and purify us. I invite you to make a good confession before Christmas. If you're a husband and father, invite your family: "Let's all go to confession before Christmas." Lead not just by words, but by example. Renew a quiet commitment to guarding what you look at, what you listen to and what you allow into your home. Ask Our Lady, "Mary, conceived without sin, help me to be the man God is calling me to be pure, courageous and whole-hearted."

#### Our Lady of Guadalupe: A Mother Who Draws Us Close

On December 12, we celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas and Mother of the unborn. She appears not as a distant queen, but as a tender mother, standing with the poor, the vulnerable, the indigenous, the forgotten. She says to St. Juan Diego, and to each of us: "Am I not here, I who am your mother?"

For many of you, this December is not just busy, it's heavy. Some of you are worried about money. Some are carrying grief or illness. Some are anxious about children, grandchildren, or a struggling marriage. Some feel spiritually dry or far from God. Our Lady of Guadalupe reminds us that we are not alone. Mary is close to the "Juan Diegos" of our life, the ones who feel small, inadequate or unseen. As Knights, we are called to be her instruments of comfort and protection, for defending life, strengthening families, standing by those who are afraid or alone.

This December, take one evening, even just 15–20 minutes, to pray the Rosary (or even one decade) as a family. If your family is not used to praying together, keep it simple. Let your children or grandchildren see you with a rosary in your hand. Yes, that silent witness plants deep seeds.

Ask Our Lady of Guadalupe: "Mother, show me who in my Council, parish, family or community who may need a small word of encouragement, a visit, a phone call, or an act of mercy, and give me the courage to do it."

#### **Christmas:** The Incarnation in the Middle of Real Life

On December 25, we kneel before the manger and contemplate the unimaginable: **God becomes man.** Not in ideal conditions. Not in comfort and ease. He comes into poverty, inconvenience and uncertainty. Mary and Joseph are tired, displaced, pushed to the margins, yet that is where Christ chooses to enter.

That means something important for you as a Knight and as a man. You don't have to "get your life perfectly together" for Christ to come. He wants to enter the real circumstances of your life, your messy schedule, your imperfect family, your job stress, your fears and even your faults.

Christmas is not a sentimental story. It is a resolution of love in the concrete details of your daily life.

Many of you work hard to provide for your families. That is noble. But your wife and children also need to have your spiritual leadership. Lead grace before meals. Suggest Mass attendance. Offer to pray for them and with them.

Remember who you are. In the midst of December's busyness, I want you to remember that you are sons of the Father, and also brothers in Christ, sons of Mary, Knights of Columbus, who are shaped by Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.

Through the intercession of Our Lady, may you become ever more the men God created you to be.

#### Notice For GK's/FS's

#### Supreme Notice Annual Audit

Based on the changes noted below, Councils are now required to submit only one annual audit due August 15:

Resolution 402 was passed by the delegates of the 2025 Supreme Council Meeting in Washington, DC which changed Section 145 of the Charter Constitution and Laws, to require the Board of Trustees to "audit the accounts of the Financial Secretary and Treasurer and report thereon annually to their Council, according to rules set by the Board of Directors."

Subsequently, the Board of Directors voted that these audits are to be based on the period from July 1 to June 30, with the Annual Audit Report due to the Supreme Council on August 15. This change <u>takes effect for the 2025-2026</u> Fraternal Year, meaning that **no Council audit** is required for February 2026 and the next council audit is due August 15, 2026.

Additional information and resources related to the revised online Annual Audit Report will be released via all fraternal channels in January. We are pleased that this change will save our fraternal leaders countless man-hours.



Today (Tuesday) is "Giving Tuesday", the annual day dedicated to giving back to the community by donations to some charity. As Knights, we have every day of the year as "Giving Tuesday" since one of our foundation principles is **Charity**. Today I would like to send out a reminder as sometimes with busy schedules we lose track of things. As you may know, this Fraternal Year, Oregon State K of C Charities is designating specific charities each month to focus our attention and our contributions.

This December, I would like everyone to remember the great need our communities have with food security and make food banks the emphasis. One special program is the Christmas Food Baskets that Coos Council 1261 does each year. They raise tens of thousands of dollars and feed huge numbers of people each December. That is already a designated line item for our charities accounts and you are invited to aid in this endeavor. Or perhaps you would prefer your local St. Vincent de Paul or parish food bank to contribute money to. You can do that directly or if you like, send your check to our State Charities with instructions to pass it along to your preferred food pantry.

You may ask why you would send the funds to the state first. A couple of great reasons. First, your local food bank may or may not be a 501(c)3. Our State Charities is a 501(c)3, and your donation can be tax deductible. Secondly, all donations received are reported to Supreme to help maintain the tax exempt status of the Order.

Any money received this month not designated specifically will be given to Oregon Food Bank, to help the hungry in our communities. With Thanksgiving still fresh in our minds, let's remember the less fortunate this month and be generous as God is generous with us.

#### **Advent Novena Prayer**

Now that the season of Advent is upon us, we're preparing our homes and our hearts for Christmas and the birth of Jesus. A lot of us are looking for a little something extra for Advent. If you think about it, it should be thought of as a Lent-like preparation. The short days and dark nights help us to slow down and reflect about all the important things in life, God, our family, our friends and parishes. Perhaps you're looking for a prayer life boost, something to inspire you this season.

Our State Deputy, Bob Adams thought that we could use a little praying and reflection that focuses on the importance of being Knights of Columbus. I know being an active Knight changed my life for the better, and the Brother Knights that I have met over the many years have impacted my life by their faith and their generosity. I know deep in my heart that our parishes would not be what they are in Oregon without Knights of Columbus, and I wish every Catholic man could share many of the experiences and the blessings that I and so many others have received through this organization.

To that end, Oregon has put together a St. Nicholas Novena. #### **Life Director Report**



Brother Knights,



For this month, I'd like to continue describing in detail some more of the LIFE activities that Supreme recommends, to help your Councils meet the requirements for the Columbian Award.

LIFE

Kent Purdy Life Director First of all, we have a new activity, called the 'Gospel of Life". This is a "featured activity", which means that this activity will earn TWO of the four required LIFE activities.

#### **Featured Program Requirements:**

Organize a study group using the **Gospel of Life Study Guide (#614) OR** organize an event featuring a pro-life speaker. While the program can take place at any time of the year, consider the weeks preceding national, state or local marches for life, during 40 Days for Life and Life Chain campaigns, and during Respect Life Month (October, United States), National Family and Life Week (varies in May, Canada) and the International Day for the Unborn Child (March 25).

#### **Action Steps:**

- 1. Coordinate this with your pastor
- 2. Either organize a study group or if you already have a COR group, incorporate this study into your COR meetings
- 3. Order the materials, such as the booklet **Knights of Columbus Evangelium Vitae Study Guide (#614)** and/or **The Fifth Commandment: Moral Issues of Life and Death (#127).** These are available from the "supplies" website online. Use the order number to find them quickly. These booklets can be the basis for your group study.
- 4. Coordinate with local Prolife groups to **invite a speaker** to talk to your Council or parish. If you choose this option, advertise the event ahead of time, encourage the Council to attend and wear KC apparel, and use it as a recruiting opportunity with informational materials available and at least one member ready to sign up new members online. Order the booklets above to hand out to the attendees. Also, you might order the following to have on hand... **#4237 Gospel of Life Prayer Card and . #11915 Gospel of Life Brochure**
- 5. Lastly/and don't forget... Immediately after your event is finished, complete the Fraternal Programs Report Form (#10784) to get credit for the event.

Another activity that Councils can do to meet the LIFE activity requirements is the "Sacramental Gifts" activity. This involves giving a gift to families that have a new baby or are having their infant (or adult for that matter) baptized. You can give a rose and/or give the baptismal pins and the accompanying cards.

You can get these cards from me. Just let me know how many cards and pins you would like and I'll send them to you. Text, call or email me and I'd be happy to mail them to you. I have a large supply available.

I'll mention one more LIFE activity for this month, and that is the <u>HOLY HOUR WITH OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE</u>. This may be of special interest to Councils that have parishes with a significant Hispanic community.

This too is a "featured activity", so Councils that perform this activity can earn 2 of the 4 required LIFE activities for the Columbian Award.

This program may be offered at any time of year. However, days in October (Respect Life Month) or Marian Feast Days such as the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec. 12) are recommended.

#### **Action Steps**:

- 1. Contact your pastor to get permission and coordinate the time, etc. for the Holy Hour.
- 2. Order supplies, which include the Holy Hour for Life Booklet (#11887), and posters (#11889 Vertical or #11888 Horizontal)
- 3. Consider showing, in advance of the Holy Hour, the short video "Our Lady of Guadalupe: The Woman of the Eucharist" with your Council and parish. This film is available on YouTube or the kofc.org website.
- 4. Advertise in parish bulletins, social media and Council newsletters for several weeks before the event.
- 5. As always, use this event as an opportunity for new members. A Knight should open or close the event and also willingly share information about the Order. Encourage men to join and sign them up online right then and there.
- 6. Don't forget to **submit form #10784** to get credit for the event.

#### What does the Bible say about the three wise men (Magi)?



It is a common misconception that the wise men visited Jesus at the stable on the night of His birth. In fact, the wise men came days, months, or possibly even years later. That is why <a href="Matthew">Matthew</a></a>
<a href="Matthew">2:11</a> says the wise men visited and worshiped Jesus in a house, not at the stable.

We know that the magi were wise men from "the East," most likely Persia, or modern-day Iran. This means the wise men traveled 800 to 900 miles to see the Christ child. Most likely, the magi knew of the writings of the prophet Daniel, who in time past had been the chief of the court seers in Persia. <a href="Daniel 9:24-27">Daniel 9:24-27</a> includes a prophecy which gives a timeline for the birth of the Messiah. Also, the magi may have been aware of the prophecy of Balaam (who was from the town of Pethor on the Euphrates River near Persia) in <a href="Numbers 24:17">Numbers 24:17</a>. Balaam's prophecy specifically mentions a "star coming out of Jacob."

The wise men were guided to look for the King of the Jews by a miraculous stellar event, the "Star of Bethlehem," which they called "His star" (Matthew 2:2). They came to Jerusalem and asked concerning the birth of Christ, and they were directed to Bethlehem (Matthew 2:4–8). They followed God's guidance joyfully (Matthew 2:10). When they arrived in Bethlehem, they gave costly gifts to Jesus and worshiped Him. God warned them in a dream against returning to Herod, so, in defiance of the king, they left Judea by another route (Matthew 2:12).

So, the magi were men who 1) read and believed God's Word, 2) sought Jesus, 3) recognized the worth of Christ, 4) humbled themselves to worship Jesus, and 5) obeyed God rather than man. They were truly wise men!

Continuing the theme from last year—with a Knight before Christmas—this year the Oregon District is promoting A Sir Knight before Christmas.






#### Canby Knights of Columbus 2025 Christmas Social - Council 3484

#### **State Family Director Report**

The news of the suspension of SNAP benefits for needy families that occurred during the recent federal government shutdown reminds us of the many people in our communities who rely on help to provide sufficient food for their families. A Knight's program that strives to help address this need is:

- The Food for Families program
- (10511 Food for Families Trifold)
- (10610 Food for Families GS),

These are designed to ensure that as few people as possible go to bed hungry each night. Since the launch of the program in 2012, Councils have donated

millions of dollars and millions of pounds of food to soup kitchens, food pantries and food banks throughout the United States and Canada.

Councils are encouraged to participate by raising funds and collecting food donations. Three members of my local Council typically pick up between 5,000 and 10,000 lbs. of donated food each month from Costco, Fred Meyer, Safeway and also a donation bin at our Church and deliver the food to our local St. Vincent de Paul food bank.

For every \$500 donated or 1,000 pounds of food contributed, the Supreme Council provides a \$100 rebate to the Council, up to a maximum of \$500 per  $\, {f extstyle L} \,$ Council per Fraternal Year (10057-food-for-families-report-form.pdf).

This incentivizes Councils to engage actively in their communities and support those in need. Additionally, participation in the Food for Families program by Councils collecting a minimum of 1,000 pounds of food and contributing at least 100 man-hours counts towards the Columbian Award




#### **Council In Action**

## State Historian Report

Rev. Monsignor Charles Patrick Taaffe 40<sup>th</sup> State Chaplain of Oregon 1985-1987

Charles Patrick Taaffe was born December 13, 1926 in Portland, OR to Arthur and Anna Willis Taaffe and raised in Portland, Salem and Corvallis.

He recognized a call to the priesthood early in life and attended college at Mount Angel Seminary. He finished his theological studies at St. Edward Seminary near Seattle and was ordained in 1955 in Portland to the priesthood by Archbishop Edward Howard.

In the 1960s, Rev. Taaffe completed post-graduate coursework in art at Oregon State University and Linfield College. Then Rev. Taaffe pastored at St. Thomas More in Portland, Queen of Peace in Salem, St. Rose and Our Lady of Victory in Monroe and Harrisburg, St. James in

McMinnville, St. Edward in Keizer and St. Mary in Shaw

Rev. Monsignor Taaffe began the Father Taaffe Foundation by opening the St. Brigid Home in a rented house on St. Patrick's Day in March of 1975 in Keizer, OR for pregnant teenage girls. He started the homes in part because of his great love for his own mother. By 1990, Rev. Taaffe had realized that many more teenage mothers were keeping their babies and that there was a need for more homes where young mothers could learn skills to help them succeed as single mothers. He established two more homes in the Salem area for teen moms: St. Monica in 1991 and St. Teresa in 1998. Since then, Msgr. Taaffe's homes have welcomed more than 1,000 women.

Rev. Taaffe received a Lumen Gentium award from Mount Angel Seminary, its highest honor, which is a Distinguished Service Award from the City of Salem and the Papal Medal, Benemerenti. He was made a Prelate of Honor by Pope Benedict. Blanchet High School in Salem, OR named its new chapel after him.

Rev. Taaffe was the Oregon Knights of Columbus State Chaplin 1985 –87, 1989 –91, Co-Chaplin with Most Rev. Kenneth Steiner 1991 –93, 1997 – 2001, 1999-2001, Honorary State Chaplain 2001 –03.

Rev. Monsignor Taaffe retired in 1997.

Rev. Monsignor Charles Patrick Taaffe died on July 10, 2009 at Maryville Nursing Home in Beaverton, OR.

He is buried at the St. James Cemetery in McMinnville, OR.


