

Safe-Environment Compliant

Dear Brother Knights:

It pains me to actually have to write this message. We have numerous individuals and Councils that are NOT Safe-Environment Compliant. This needs to change! We are seeing/hearing several reasons for this, including: Not turning in the 365 Form, which lists the individuals in the required positions, Councils turning in the names, but not following through to make sure the individuals actually completed the training/background checks, and sadly, others simply refusing to do the required training.

Effective Monday, February 9th, any Brother Knight, including officers, in the role of Program Director, Community Director, and/or Family Director, who is not Safe-Environment compliant, will be removed from that role.

The State Officers and District Deputies, in particular our State Advocate, Nick Guenther, stand ready to assist all Councils and individuals in meeting this requirement. Please reach out to any of us with your questions or requests for assistance.

Please note that any Council that is not Safe-Environment Compliance is NOT eligible to be a Star Council. In addition, any Council that is not compliant as of April 15, 2026, is NOT eligible for the new member recruitment incentives that have been running since July 1.


Not only is this required, but it is the right thing to do. Lets make sure we wrap this up by 2/9. Thank you.

Passing of Rev. Terry James O'Connell

54th State Chaplain of Oregon 2009-11



Terry James O'Connell was born July 19, 1954, in Minot, ND to Earl and Myrtle Annell O'Connell.

When Terry was 9 years old, the O'Connell family moved to Salem, OR where he graduated from McNary High School in 1972.

Terry went to the University of Oregon and graduated in 1978 where he earned a double major: BS in Psychology and Social Work.

After graduating college, Terry enlisted in the Navy as a vocational counselor. He moved up the ranks and became a Navy Officer Billet – Electrical Officer on the USS Nicholson, DD 982. He went all over the world, including Persian Gulf with the Middle East Force amid the Iran-Iraq War's "Tanker War" phase, Red Sea, Gulf of Aden, Arabian Sea, the Gulf, Guantanamo Bay, Barcelona, Spain, Mediterranean and Caribbean just to name a few.

Terry was honorable discharged on June 3, 1986, at PSD NETC Newport, Rhode Island. After he disembarked in Rhode Island, 30-40 fellow military personal rode bicycles across the United States. The group saw major sites, celebrated birthdays together, camped in every state, and even created their own song. Slowly people diverted from the group as they hit their home state. The last 10 Pacific Northwestern riders ended up in the Ogle's backyard in Beaverton, OR for a night.

The next phase of Terry's life involved the Catholic Church; Terry enrolled at the University of Portland while living at the St John Vianney House of studies pursuing pre-theological studies from 1986, then received a "pastoral year" placement 1989-1990 at St Anne Parish in Gresham, OR.

For one summer, Fr. Terry signed up for a mission in Mexico, he left not knowing any Spanish and was assigned living arrangements with a local family. There he became fluent in Spanish, culture, and found a love in culinary arts.

He started his seminary journey in 1989 at Mt Angel Seminary and was ordained a Catholic Priest on September 5, 1992, at St Mary's Cathedral in Portland, OR along with Bishop Liam Cary.

In order of priestly ordination, he served at: Sacred Heart – Medford, Mission Santo Niño de Atocha Guantanamo, Cuba, St. Monica - Coos Bay, St. James – McMinnville, Good Shepherd – Sheridan, St. Michael - Grand Ronde, St. Peter – Newberg and St. Juan Diego – Portland.

Fr. Terry was the second permanent pastor at St Juan Diego in Portland, OR between 2013-2021.

During that time, he started the Spanish Mass for the parish in July 2014 and started the planning and funding of a new community building. Unfortunately, he never saw the hall completed.

Fr. Terry was forced into retirement after a life altering stroke in 2021. Then, his health declined and other serious health issues became prominent.

His final residence was an adult foster home in Beaverton, OR.

Rev. O'Connell was the Oregon Knights of Columbus State Chaplain 2009–11.

Rev. Terry James O'Connell died on November 10, 2025, at an adult foster home in Beaverton, OR from Congestive Heart Failure.

Oregon State KofC Leaders,

We need your help to CLEAN UP this list of online Knights caught in digital limbo.

At the Mid-Year Mtg this past weekend, I promised to forward the most recent list of PENDING Knights. Attached is this list of men that already used the online KofC.org/Join site to become Knights. The problem is that none of them responded to the emails from Supreme asking them to Confirm their Joining request. The most likely situation is that the Supreme email went to their Spam or Junk Folder and by now has now been deleted. I used this information to send text messages to each one and have yet to see a response from any on this list.

I ask each DD, GK or FS to scan down this list to find your council(s) and make EVERY ATTEMPT to reach out to these "almost" Knights.

I had about a 10% success rate in reaching men who DID want to Join and their names have been removed from this newest listing.

If the man IS ready to join, please advise him to send an email to: emembership@kofc.org with the following verbiage:

"My name is (First & Last Name) with Tracker ID (Per Listing) and wish to Confirm my desire to join the Knights of Columbus"

Make sure they use the EXACT SAME email as found on the listing in order for Supreme to match the one in their system.

If the email is incorrect, please have them add a notation of what the incorrect email was.

I ask you inform them to cc you on their email to Supreme so that you too will receive Supreme's verification of acceptance.

If for any reason, you discover the man is now no longer interested in joining, PLEASE send a different Email as follows:

As the (Your Position, First & Last Name) of (Council #), I have verified that (Man's First & Last Name) with Tracker # (Per Listing) is no longer interested in Confirming membership in the Knights of Columbus and ask that his name be removed as a Prospective Knight.

I ask you to cc EITHER email to Guenther51@gmail.com to ensure that our Worthy Online Membership Director Nick Guenther is kept informed so he can monitor this list and remove those requests as they occur.

Happy New Year!

It was a great meeting in Portland this past weekend. Thanks to the State Leadership and St. Rita's Council for putting it on! The one-year-old St. Rita Council knocked it out of the park!

At the meeting we were given a compilation of the "brainstorming" that was done at the Summer Meeting regarding activities that Councils could do and what was working for them.

I've attached a picture of the compilation, (next page) so that your Councils can peruse that and see what might work for them.

Let me know if you have any further questions or need any clarification about these possible activities.

This month, I would like to talk about a couple of things your Councils can do to be active in our mission to foster a "Culture of Life".

There is a LIFE NOVENA coming up from January 16th through 24th, from the USCCB. The prayers for this Novena are available at this website: www.respectlife.org/prayers You can **sign up to get daily text message or email reminders** during the Novena. Then, click on the "9 days for Life" line, next click on the "Novena" tab to get info about the Novena, or the "Resources" tab to get printable copies of the daily web pages.

Please get this information to your Councils and ask them to sign up for the Novena. This is an easily accomplished activity you can do towards the Columbian Award/STAR Council.

Another item for this month is the "ACE WINGS" program. This is where your members can "earn their WINGS" by accomplishing 10 Life activities during a 12-month period with 7 of the 10 must be for the Unborn. Those Councils that are doing the "40 Days for Life" campaign can accomplish this easily, by praying at an abortion clinic for each week of the 40 days. There's 6 or 7 activities right there.

To find the **application for the ACE WINGS award**, go to the State Website, www.oregonkofc.org and scroll down to "State Forms". Then, scroll down to the bottom of that page and find the **RED TAB** that says, "Pro-Life ACE WINGS program". Clicking that tab will bring up the ACE WINGS application.

Send those completed forms to me and I will send you the ACE WINGS to award your members that have been **Pro-Life WARRIORs!**

One more item I'd like to address is REPORTING.

Many Councils don't know that they need to **complete a Form 10784 for EACH activity they do**, in any of the four "Faith in Action" categories. If you don't complete this form, you may not get credit for it when you report it on the Columbian Award application (SP-7). This form is available online. **Go to the Supreme website (www.kofc.org) and in the search box, put in "10784". That is the easiest way to get you to the form.**

The member completing the form must first put in his Membership Number and last name. Then, the online form to complete will be sent to his email address.

It's an EASY form to complete and takes just a few minutes.

Councils need to also report their activities to the State Council. This too is easy and takes just a few minutes. Go to the State Website (oregonkofc.org) and scroll down to the bottom, where you find the tab "**State Forms**". Under "**Report Forms**", click on "**Culture of Life Report form**". You can download the form to complete each month. Then email the completed form to me, the State Life Director.

This is what we base the State Awards at the State Convention on. **Please get someone in your Council to complete these forms each month to tell the State Council what you are doing.** Only 15 or so Councils in the State are doing this every month. That's only about 16% of all Councils. We can do better than that!

Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose Story

In June 1960, a live rose was blessed by Bishop John Cody in London, Ontario and the rose started on its journey. There were adorations and Rosary recitation along the way. It was a memorable success!

The Squires involved wanted to do it again in 1961. Instead of a live rose, a silver rose, made by a jeweler in Monterrey, Mexico was used. In 1990, Supreme Knights of Columbus, Virgil C. Dechant, initiated the Silver Rose Pilgrimage as a Supreme Program. In 2001, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson viewed this Pilgrimage "as a perfect symbol that not only honored Our Lady of Guadalupe as Patroness of all the Americas but also reaffirms the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death."

What began in 1960 as a single route from Canada to Mexico evolved and currently there are eight separate routes. The Silver Rose Pilgrimage in the Western U.S. begins in Alaska, journeys through, Hawaii, Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Nevada, California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas and Mexico. It arrives with the other seven roses at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, December 12th.




State Historian Report

Rev. Cosmas P White

41st State Chaplain of Oregon 1987-89



Cosmas P. White was born January 6, 1929, in New York to Francis and Marie Masterson White. After attending Catholic grade and high schools in New York he served in the Army from 1946 to 1947. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Fordham University before moving to Los Angeles to work there.

Cosmas entered Mount Angel Seminary in 1953, began his Novitiate in 1956, was professed a monk of Mount Angel Abbey in 1957, and was ordained a priest on May 11, 1961. Following his ordination, Rev. Cosmas served faithfully in a number of assignments that included teaching and administering at two high schools. He spent five years at Ascension Priory after which he began his years of very active pastoral work at Sacred Heart Church in Tillamook, St. Agatha's Church in Portland for 21 years, St. Paul's Church in Silverton, and finally at Mount Angel Towers.


Rev. White was the Oregon Knights of Columbus State Chaplain 1987–89.

Rev. Cosmas celebrated fifty years as a priest in 2011. When his health started to decline, he was cared for by his fellow monks and by the health care staff of Mount Angel Abbey. Two days before his death, Abbot Jeremy anointed Rev. Cosmas with the whole community present. He opened his eyes joyfully in recognition of the presence of the praying community, and, though unable to speak at the end, he expressed his "Amen" to the prayers by squeezing the Abbot's hand.



Rev. Cosmas P. White died on April 27, 2017, at the Mount Angel Abbey in Saint Benedict, OR. He is buried at Mount Angel Abbey Cemetery, Mount Angel, OR.

Assembly 905 Shepherd of the Valley Medford




On the evening of December 11th, Shepherd of the Valley Church was full to almost overflowing. Against a background of joyful singing, six Knights of Columbus in their blazers, berets, and flashing silver swords, escorted an image of the Madonna to its shrine. They were incidental elements to a much larger spectacle of flowers, lights – and dancers.

As the prayer service began, 40 young dancers, wearing sequined, gold- fringed crowns and maroon scapulars over white shirts, pants, and shoes, formed a double line across the front of the sanctuary.

Their dance that was performed had been adapted for Mexican Indians by Jesuit missionaries. It traces back to medieval Spanish line dances. But it also incorporated elements from earlier indigenous traditions. The dancers carried three-foot long sticks or “sonajas” housing tin rattles, and were accompanied by three musicians, each beating a small hand drum and simultaneously playing a primitive two-holed flute. All of these elements were combined in a remarkable tribute to the Virgin.

Mount Angel Abbey has received a grant of \$10 million from Lilly Endowment Inc. to help establish a new, large-scale national mentorship training initiative for the *Program of Priestly Formation, 6th ed.* Mount Angel Seminary (MAS), an apostolate of Mount Angel Abbey, will lead the effort in partnership with collaborating institutions.

The project is being funded through Lilly Endowment's Pathways for Tomorrow Initiative. This initiative is designed to help theological schools across the United States and Canada prioritize and respond to the most pressing challenges they face as they prepare pastoral leaders for Christian congregations now and into the future. The grant to Mount Angel Abbey is one of 45 that was approved in this competitive round of funding to support theological schools as they lead large-scale collaborations with other seminaries, colleges and universities, and other church-related organizations.

Abbot Jeremy Driscoll, Abbot and Chancellor of Mount Angel Abbey and Seminary, expressed the significance of the award, stating, "For nearly 140 years, our monastic community has operated the Seminary as our primary apostolate, forming priests for many dioceses in this country who are prepared for the ever-changing demands of pastoral ministry. We joyfully accept this award which allows us to continue this important work of priestly formation and to bring it to a new level, and I am confident in Fr. Eirvin's leadership as he guides us through the development and implementation of this initiative."

This collaborative endeavor prepares pastoral leaders at the foundational level: by forming the mentors who form them. This integrated mentorship model ensures that priestly formation does not end at ordination but culminates in the Vocational Synthesis Stage, newly mandated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in the *Program of Priestly Formation, 6th ed.*

"As we prepare the next generation of priests for a changing world, equipping them for leadership, administration, and relational demands is vital for the success of parish life," said Very Rev. Jeff Eirvin, President-Rector of Mount Angel Seminary. "Through the generosity of the Lilly Endowment and collaboration with multiple other seminaries and ministries nationwide, Mount Angel Seminary is excited to lead a new initiative that equips mentor priests to confidently accompany new clergy through a healthy integration into parish ministry, setting a solid foundation for the rest of their lives."

Lilly Endowment launched the Pathways for Tomorrow Initiative in 2021. Since then, it has provided grants totaling more than \$700 million to support 163 theological schools in efforts to strengthen their own educational and financial capacities and to assist 61 schools in developing large-scale collaborative endeavors.
